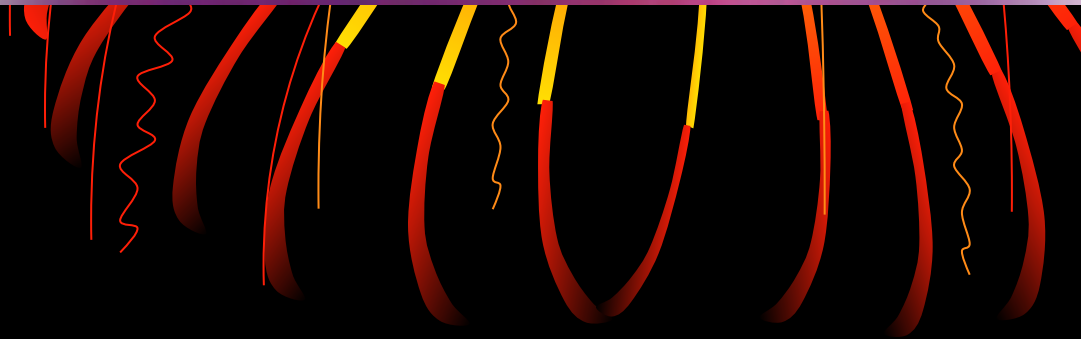
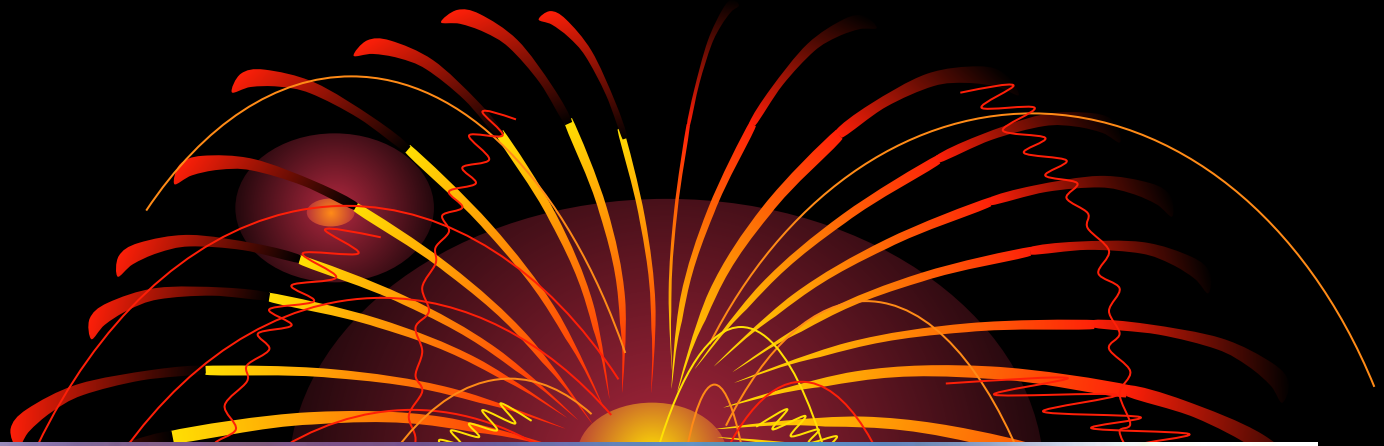

# “DEEPAVALI”

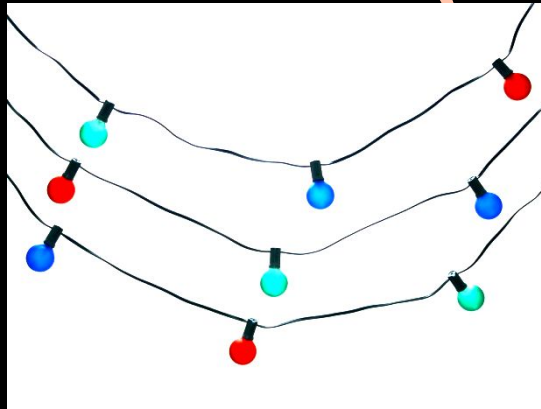


OR DIWALI IS THE INDIAN FESTIVAL OF LIGHTS.

AND ‘VALI’ MEANS ‘STRING OF’ (НИТКА ЧЕГО-ЛИБО .)



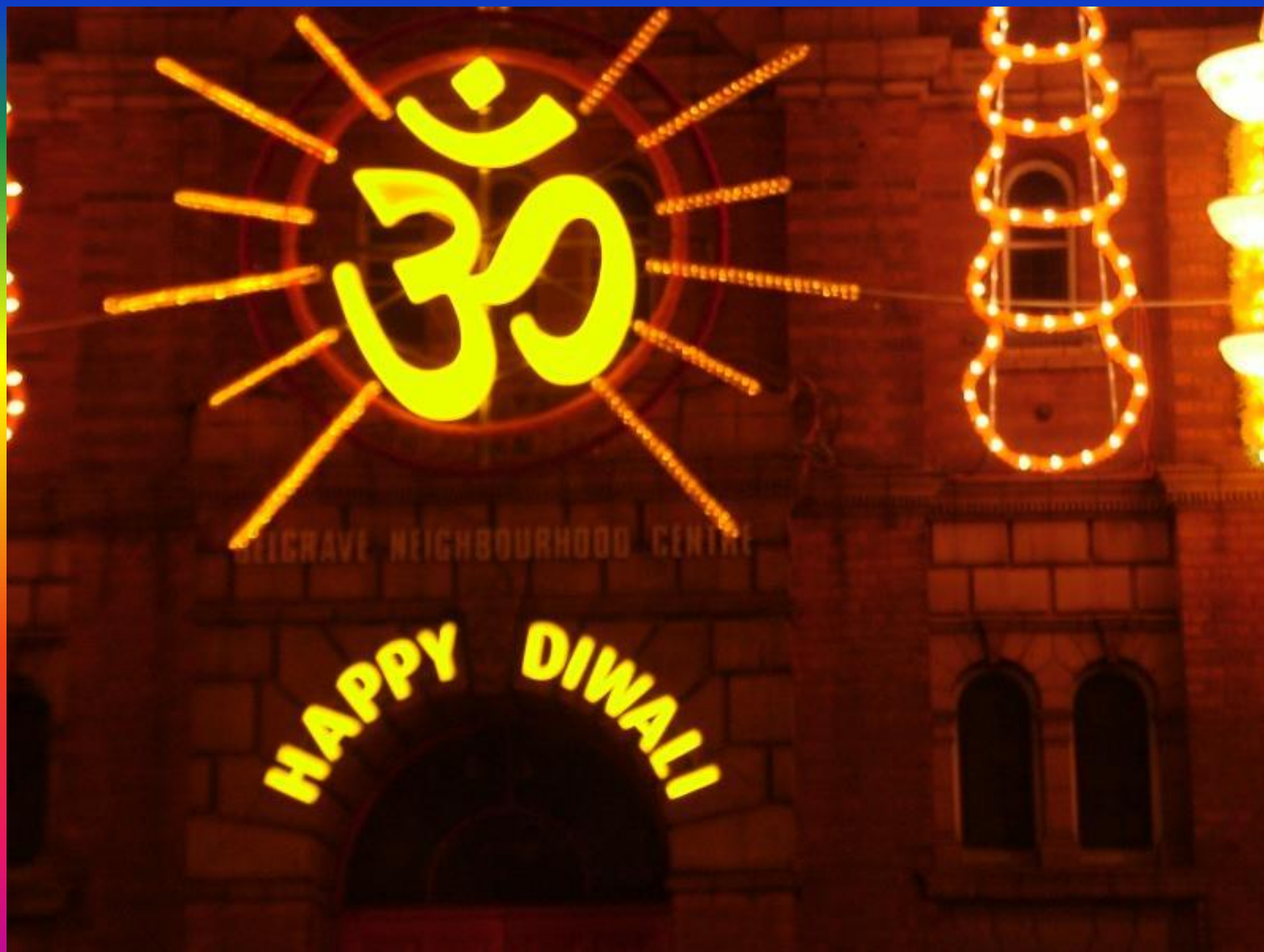


The Hindu calendar is based on the lunar cycle and the movement of the moon calendar. Usually this is in October or November.

# What is the story of King Rama?

After fourteen years of exile- **изгнание** in the forest, the King of Ayodhya, Rama, and his brother Laksman, returned to their hometown.

Before that, they defeated Demon King Ravana in a fierce war.

Upon Rama's return to Ayodhya the people of the town **lit lamps** to welcome the King back and to celebrate the victory over Ravana.

After King Rama returned, the people **danced** and **celebrated** and **fired fireworks** to show how happy they were. These festivities continue every year at Diwali and are still celebrated today.

**During Diwali, gifts and sweets are exchanged and festive meals are prepared.**

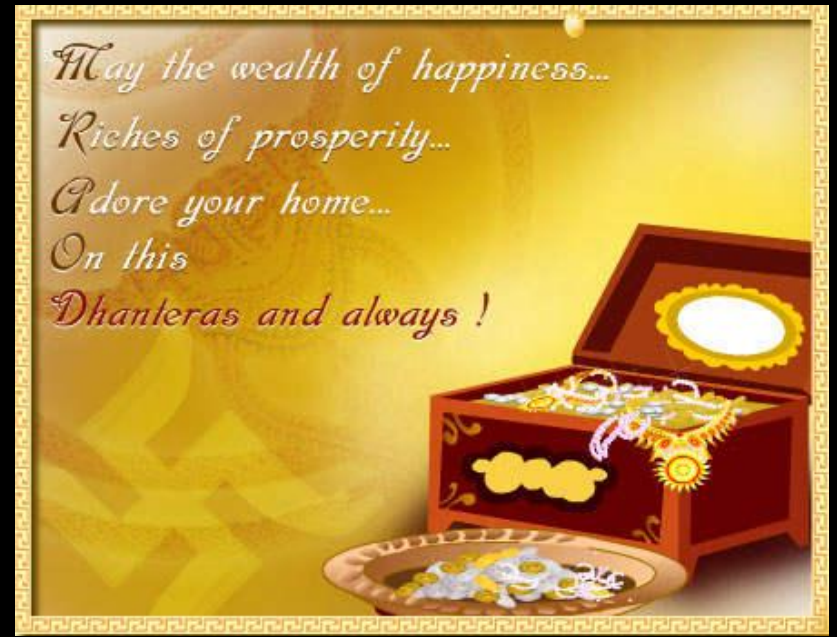


# FIVE DAYS OF FESTIVITIES

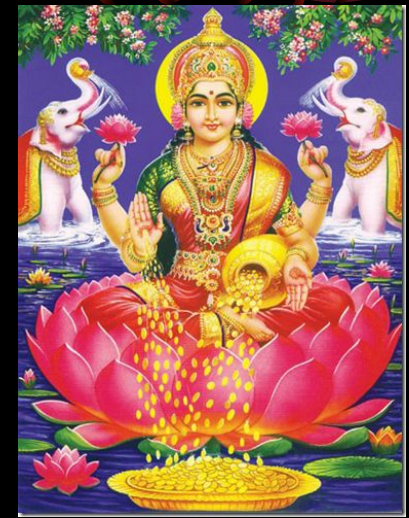
**The SECOND DAY is called

# The **THIRD DAY** is the most important day called **Lakshmi-Puja**

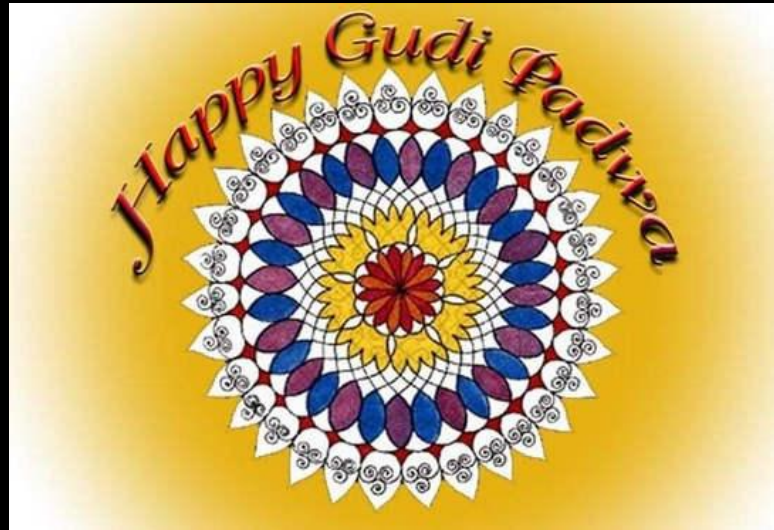
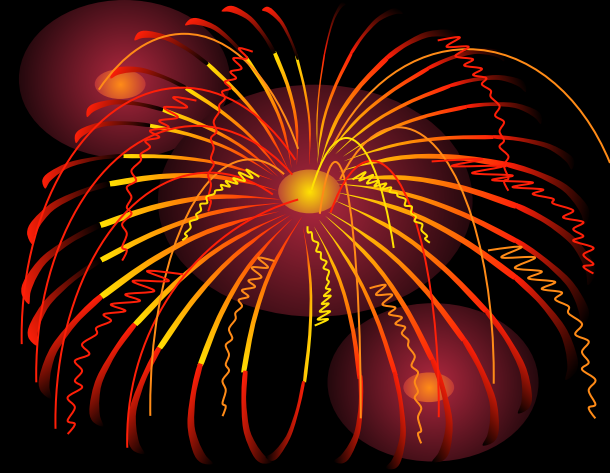
Hindu worship Goddess Lakshmi,
