AND 'VALI' MEANS 'STRING OF' (HUTKA ЧЕГО-ЛИБО .)






The Hindu calendar is based on the lunar cycle and the movement of the moon calendar. Usually this is in October or November.

During Diwali, gifts and sweets are exchanged and festive meals are prepared.


FIVE DAYS OF FESTIVITIES

The FIRST DAY is called Dhan Theras. People buy jewelery and worship it to God.












It is a celebration of the death of the evil king"Narakusara" who imprisoned many sons and daughters of the Gods.

The FOURTH DAY is called Padwa. It is looked as the most auspicious-благоприятный time to start any business.






