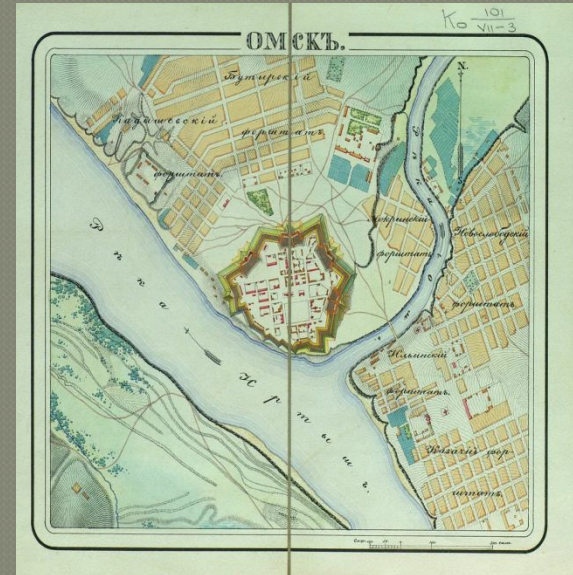

When the white Guards began to retreat, the Red Army took control of the city. Omsk was in terrible situation

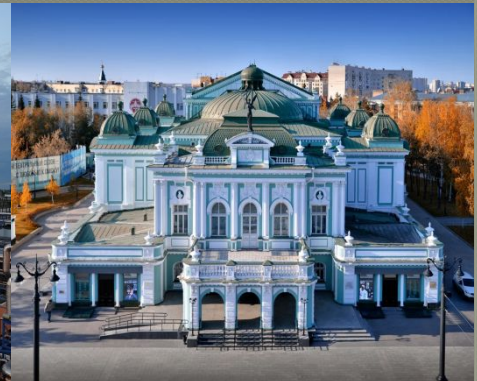
Soviet period

Industry

- There are many fabrics and plants in Omsk which produce products for different industries. For example the production association “Polyot” produces rockets for the space industry



But the most biggest one is Oil Refinery. Its area is about 1290 hectares.

Culture

- Omsk has many museums and theatres, such as musical theatre, puppet theatre, drama theatre and others. Recently the Siberian branch of the Hermitage was opened in our city.



Transport

- The Trans Siberian railway passes through Omsk. That's why most people use trains to get to Omsk.
- Also Omsk has airport which can accept many types of planes and all types of helicopters.

- Some people call Omsk one of the hockey capitals of Russia. Because the “Avangard” team comes from here. Unfortunately, the old hockey arena is demolished. But the construction of a new arena has begun



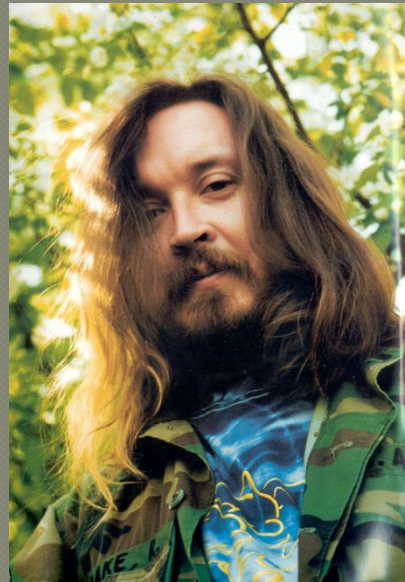
- Since 1990, an annual marathon has been held in Omsk
