But **don't be personal** when you talk to them. Besides the Aussies like their **personal space** - don't get too close.

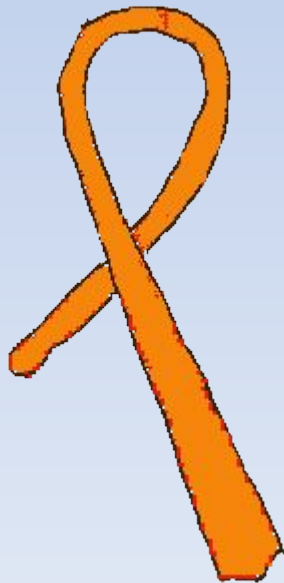




# Australian Etiquette
