





In the old days music was one of compulsory subjects. Any educated person had to learn it.







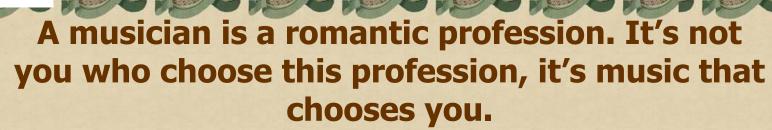

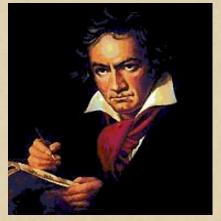


The people creating music are composers. They must know the theory and the history of music, be able to play some musical instruments.

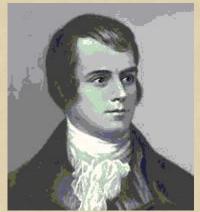


Musicians are different but they all are united by love to music and they can't imagine their life without it. (a street band)







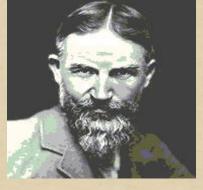


Роберт Бернс 1759-1796
