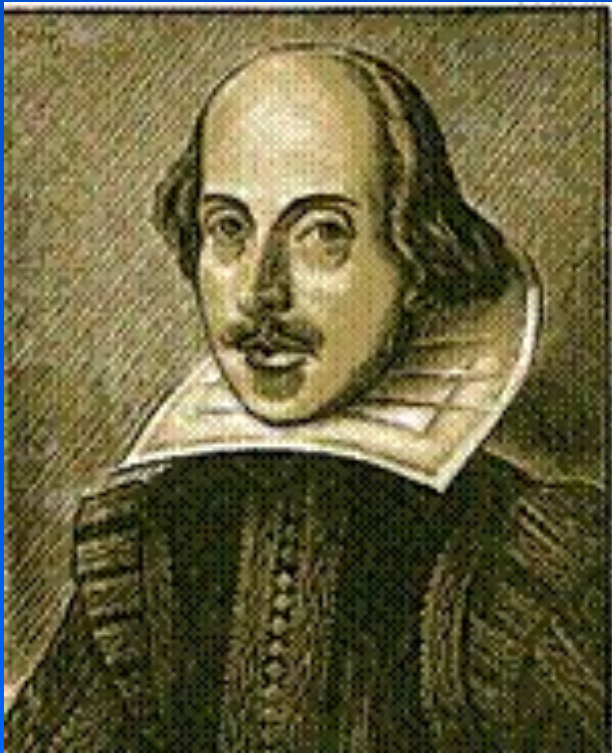


William Shakespeare – some biographical notes

- ◆ Born in April 1564
in Stratford on Avon

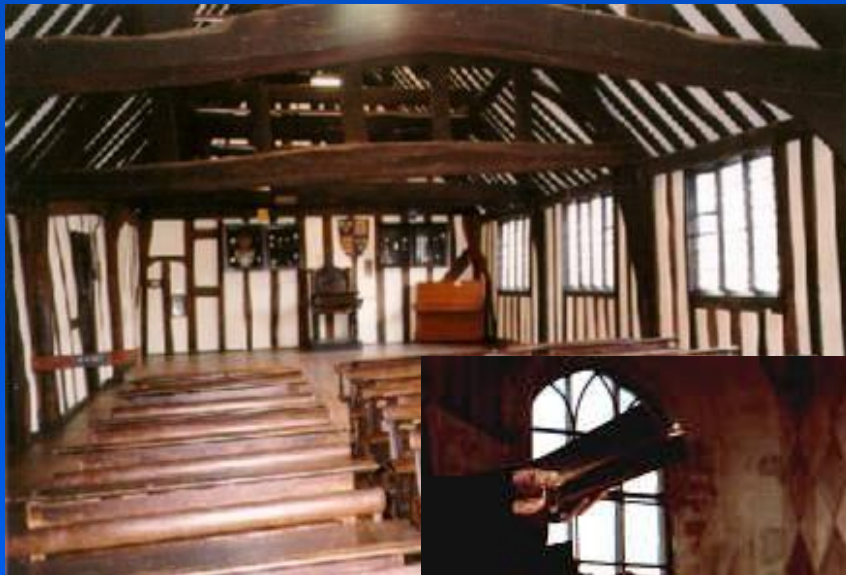
- ◆ His father - a fairly

- ◆ Anne was 26, he was 18
- ◆ 3 children
- ◆ The youngest, Hamnet died at the age of 11



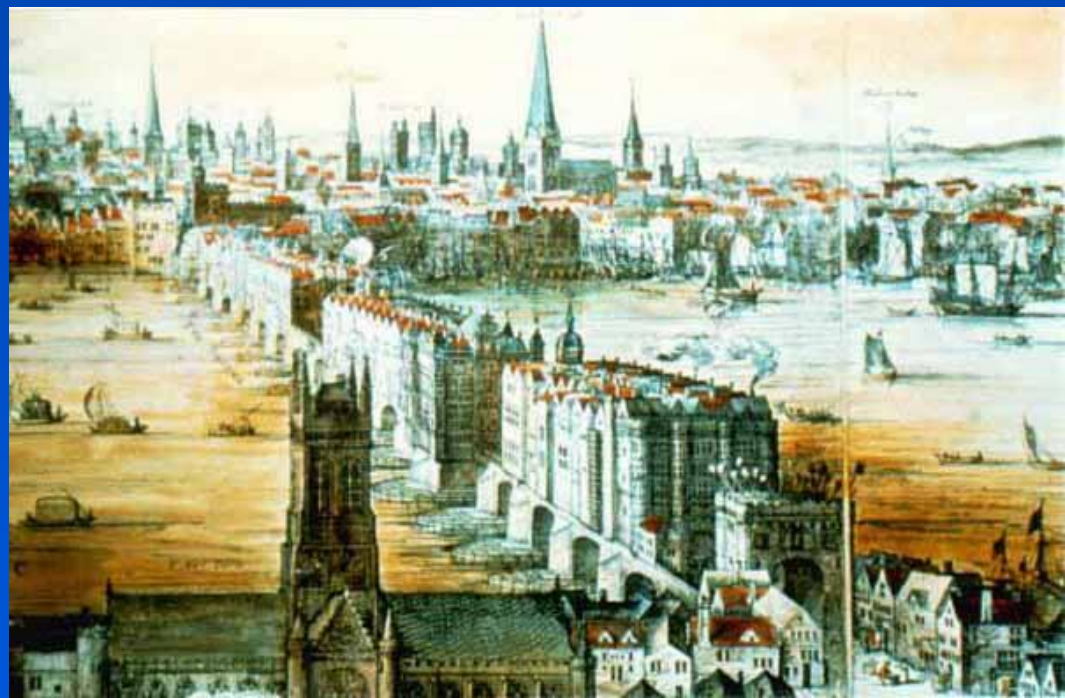
London

- ◆ worked both as an actor and a writer



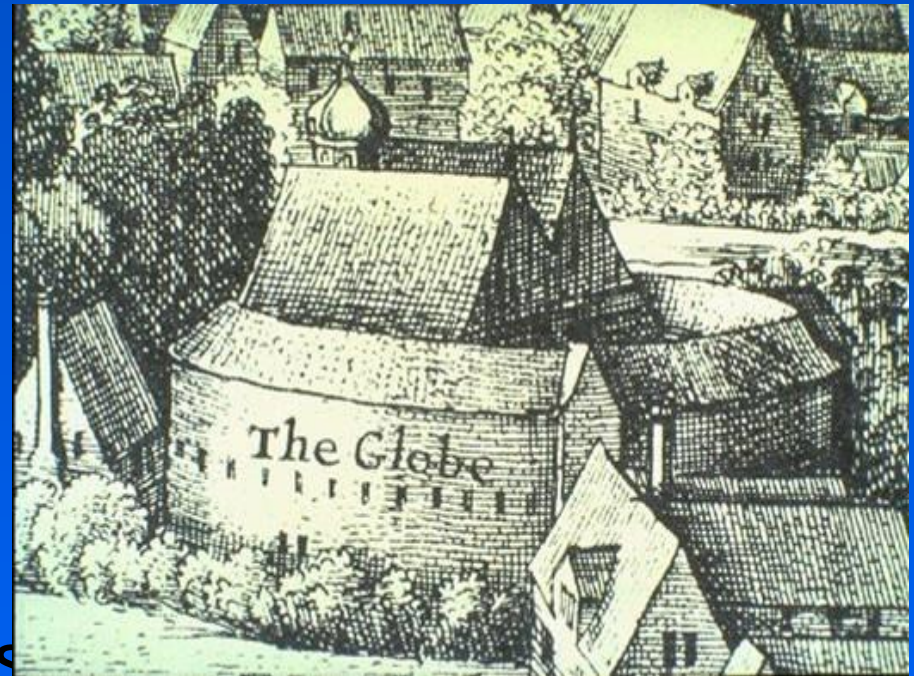
London Life in the 16th century

The Globe Theatre

- ◆ opened in 1599
- ◆ His successes had made Shakespeare a rich man
- ◆ He became one of the principal investors



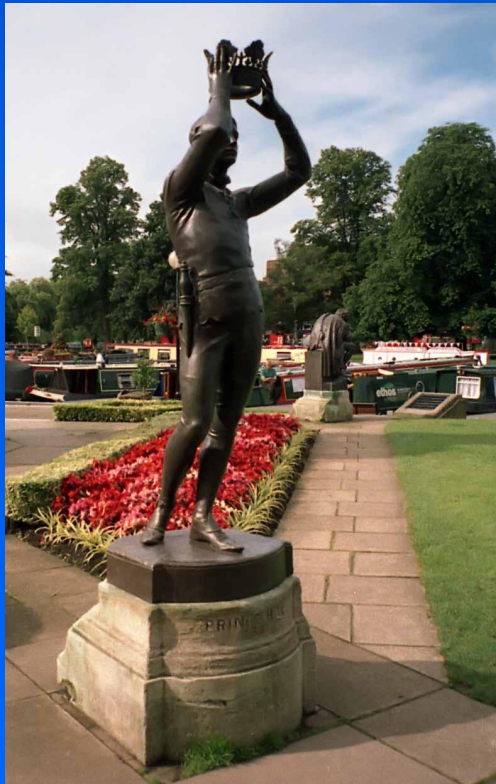
Ups and downs

The end of his life

- ❖ Return to Stratford in 1610
- ❖ Destruction of the Globe Theatre in 1613 (the Great Fire of London)
- ❖ In 1616 Shakespeare died on April, 23 (his birthday!)
