

## Особенности английской фонетики


- Положение произносительных органов: плоский уклад губ, губы растянуты, кончик языка оттянут от зубов, задняя часть языка опущена, мягкое нёбо приподнято
- Отсутствие оглушения звонких согласных в финальной позиции
- Частичное оглушение звонких согласных в начальной позиции
- Энергичное произнесение глухих согласных

This is very important for listening, because it makes it difficult to recognise words. When you speak English, you don't need to pronounce weak sounds as weakly as this, but it's important to make a clear difference between stressed (strong) and unstressed (weak) syllables.

#### Word Stress
















Individual words have a stress pattern, that is a pattern of strong and weak syllables. Sentences also have a stress pattern, and this is sentence stress. Sometimes a word and a sentence have the same stress pattern. Listen to these examples.




