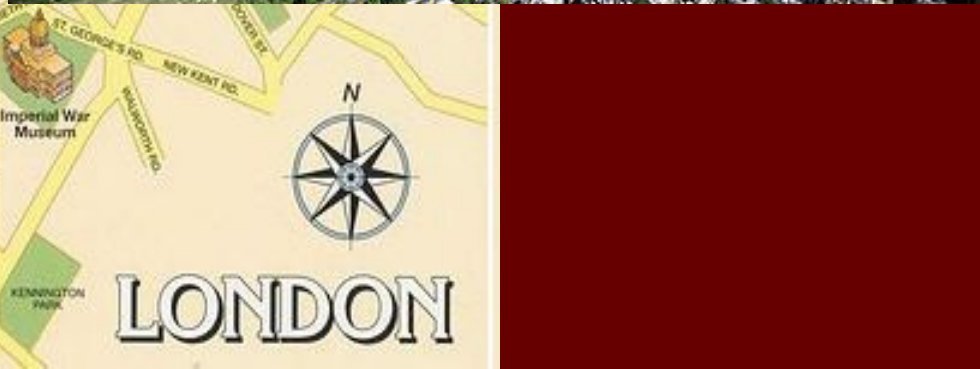

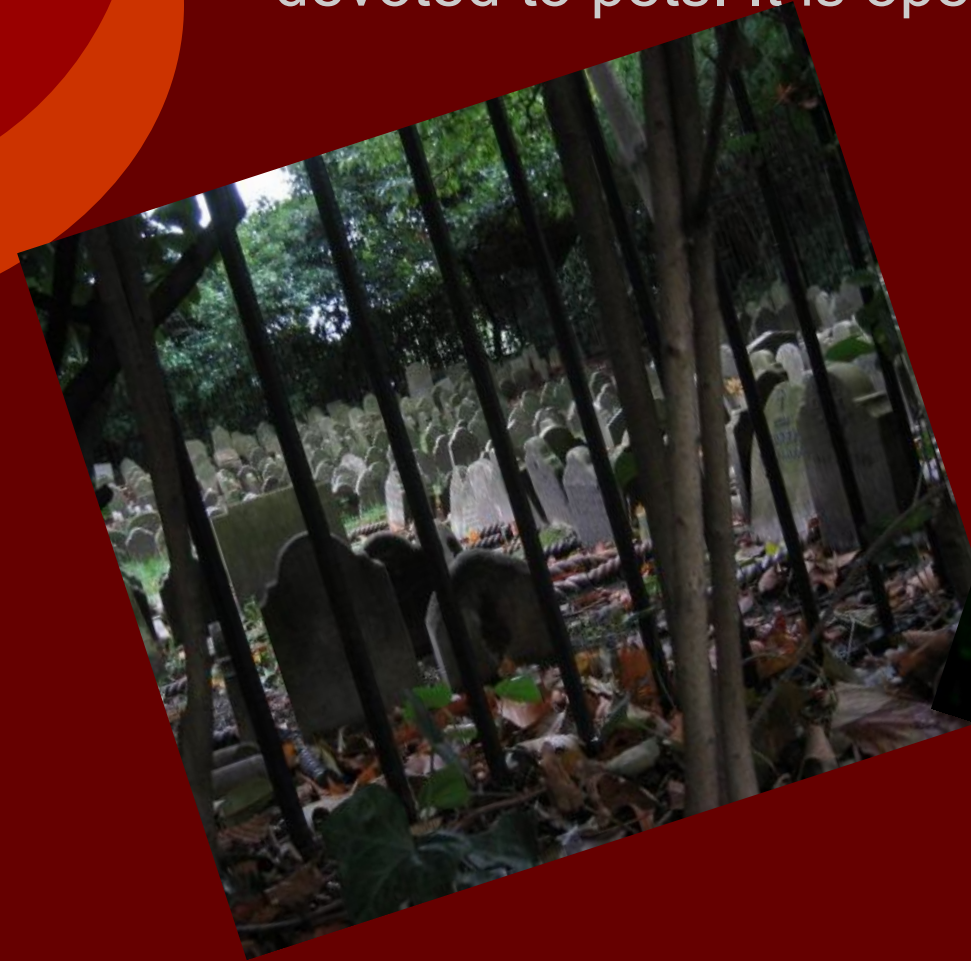
But the most famous place is the Speakers Corner.

There is a Rotten Row in the park. It was the first road in the country lit by 300 lamps. “Rotten Row” is the French for “the king way”.



One place is very unusual. It is the pets Cemetery.
There are 300 graves of pets with touching words devoted to pets. It is opened once a year.



Hyde park is the favourite place for people who want to keep fit because they can run, go horseracing, play tennis and bowling and rollerskate here.
