# Russia

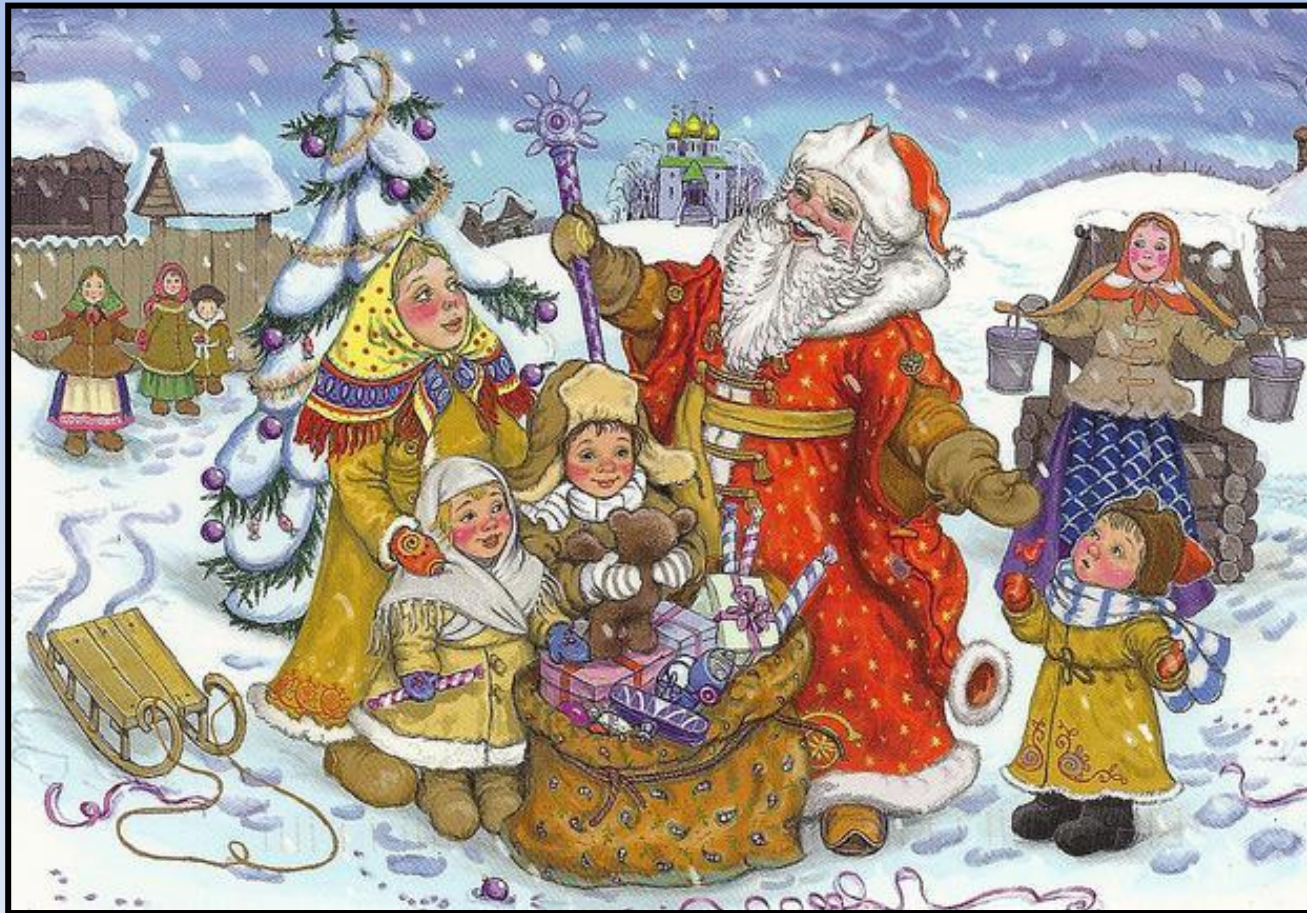
- Russian Christmas is on the 7<sup>th</sup> of January.
