



BALLET AT THE BOLSHOI



The very beginning of its history

 The Bolshoi Theatre began its life as the private theatre of the Moscow proseCutor Prince Pyotr Urusov. On 28 March 1776, **Empress Catherine II signed and granted the** Prince the 'privilege' of organizing theatre performances, masquerades, balls and other forms of entertainment for a period of ten years. It is from this date that Moscow's Bolshoi Theatre traces its history.

THE HISTORY OF THE BOLSHOI

 The organization of theatre performances and 'entertainments' involved a heavy financial burden and Prince Pyotr Urusov shared his 'privilege' with a business partner, the **Russophile Englishman and theatrical** entrepreneur Michael Maddox. The latter was also an equilibrist, theatre mechanic and 'lecturer', who demonstrated various types of optical equipment and other 'mechanical' marvels.

THE BOLSHOI

 is a historic theatre in Moscow, Russia, designed by architect Joseph **Bové,** which holds performances of ballet and opera. The theatre's original name was the Imperial **Bolshoi Theatre of Moscow.**

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
