Direct Speech - Reported Speech

- I enjoy travelling a lot.
- She said that she enjoyed travelling a lot.

Present Simple - Past Simple



1. Mary “I love chocolate.”
2. Mary: “I don’t like milk.”
3. Mary: “I have a cat.”
4. Mary: “I can’t swim.”
5. Mary: “I have to do my homework.”

2. Jill: “Mary said (that) she ... like milk.”
