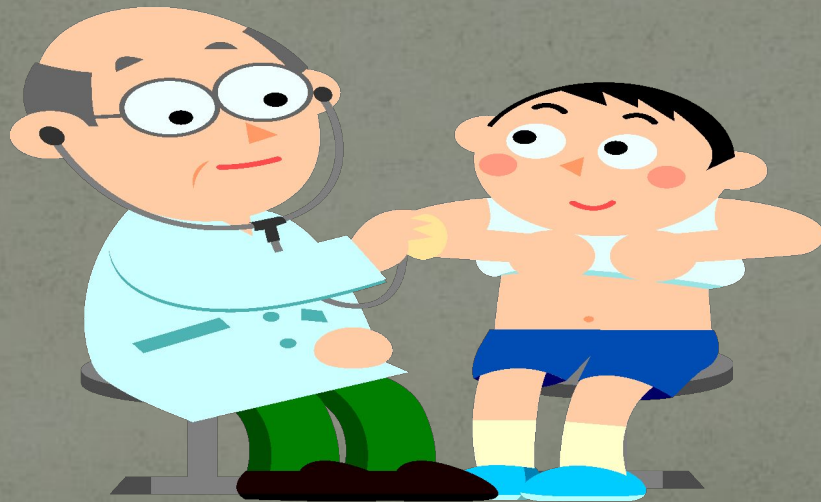

a sailor [ˈseɪləɹ] – моряк



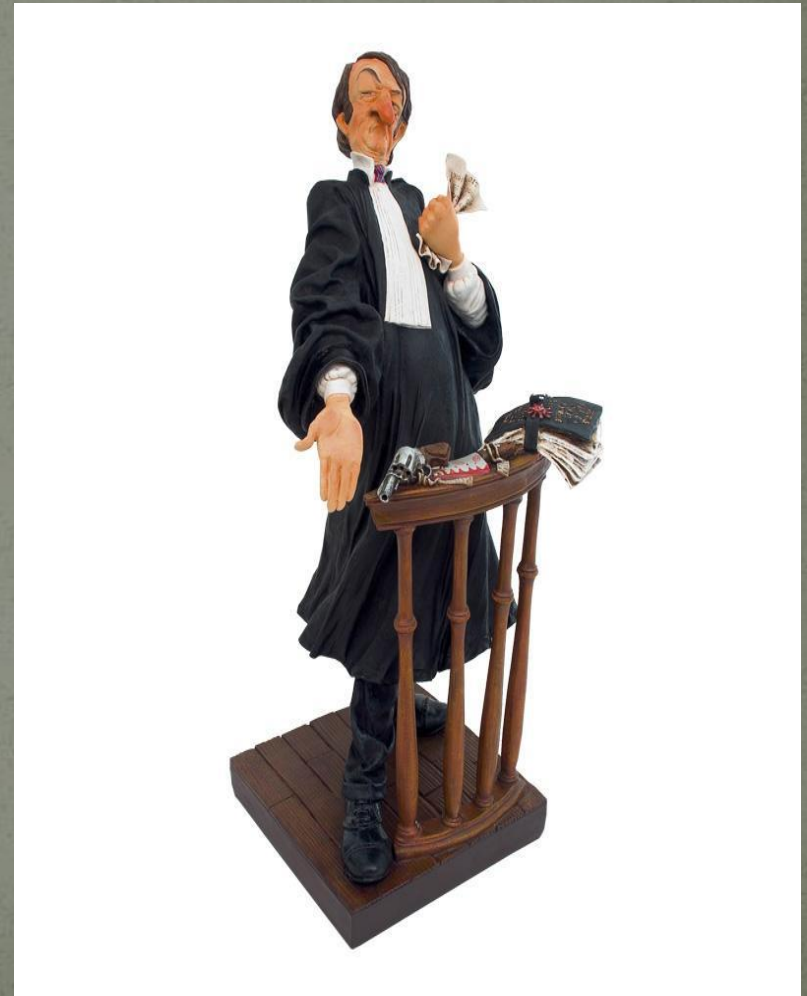
a scientist ['saɪəntɪst] - учёный
a nurse [nɜːrs] - медсестра



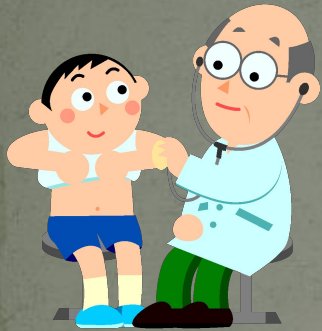
a guide [gaɪd] – гид, экскурсовод
