MUCH, MANY,

A LOT OF

Much (много)- с неисчисляемыми
существительными,
не употребляется в утвердительных
предложениях

Many (много) - с исчисляемыми
существительными во всех видах предложений

A lot of (много) – как с неисчисляемыми
существительными, так и с исчисляемыми
существительными во всех видах предложений

Например:

We don't need many apples. - Нам не нужно много яблок.

Do you have many friends? – У вас много друзей?

We don't have a lot of time. – У нас не много времени.

We don't need a lot of apples. – Нам не нужно много яблок.

Do you have a lot of friends? – У вас много друзей?

I don't eat much butter.-Я не ем много масла.

Do you have much time? – У вас много времени?

**Вопросы: *How much? How many?*
*(Сколько?)***

К неисчисляемым существительным:

How much?* - *Сколько?

К исчисляемым:

How many?* - *Сколько?

Например:

How many books do you have?

How much butter is there in the cake?

Местоимения *few, little*

Little — мало — с

неисчисляемыми

существительными

Few — мало — с исчисляемыми

существительными

Very little/very few — очень

мало

Например:

- There is a little snow this winter.
- There are few houses in that street.
- There is a very little salt in this soup.
