RECORDS

Khalid Hannushi ran for the United States, in 2002, ran the distance in 2 hours 5 minutes 38 seconds. Women set the world record three times, and the last, in 2003, when Paula Radcliffe ran the distance in 2 hours 15 minutes 25 seconds, not beaten far.



RECORDS

A world record set on the London Marathon by Khalid Hannushi from Morocco. He ran for the United States, in 2002, ran the distance in 2 hours 5 minutes 38 seconds. Women set the world record three times, and the last, in 2003, when Paula Radcliffe ran the distance in 2 hours 15 minutes 25 seconds, not beaten far.



## WINNERS

Mexican Dionicio Ceron, the Portuguese António Pinto and Kenyan Martin Lel won the marathon three times. Among women, the number of victories leading Norwegian Ingrid Kristiansen, who finished first four times. Russian athletes have one victory: the 1991 race won by Jacob Tolstikov, and in 2010 won Lily Shobuhova.
