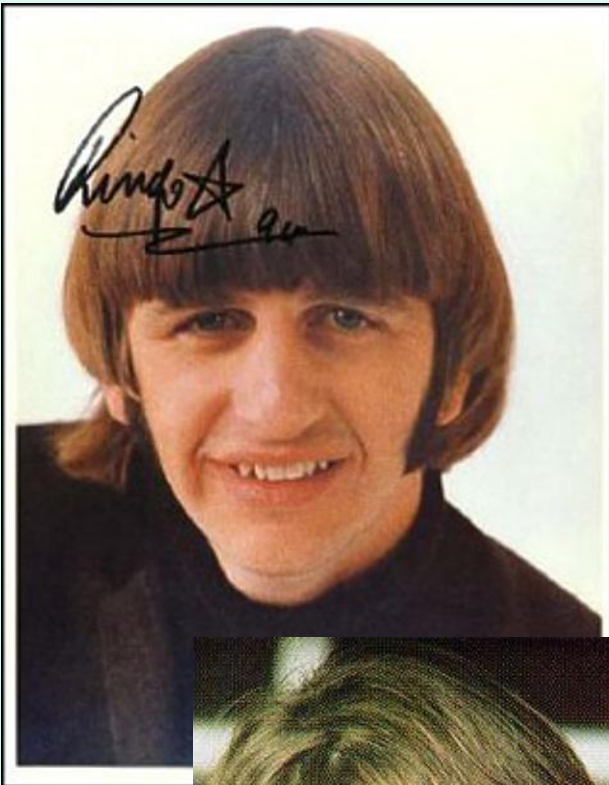

of the members of the legendary «Beatles» band.

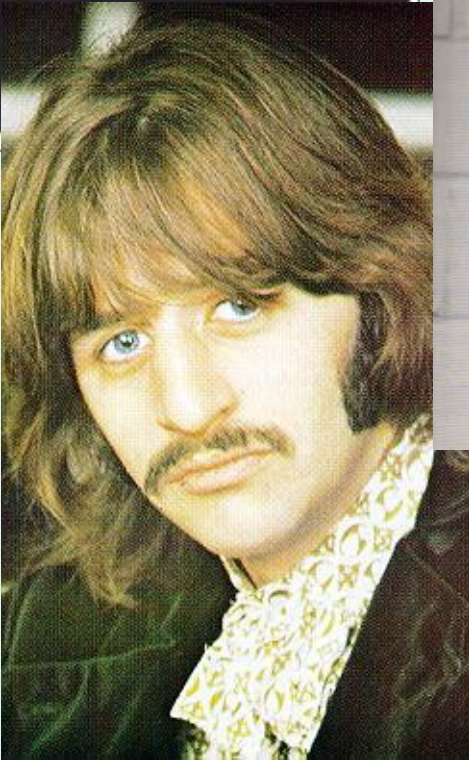

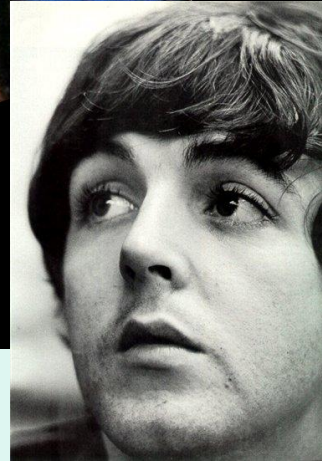

The Quarrymen



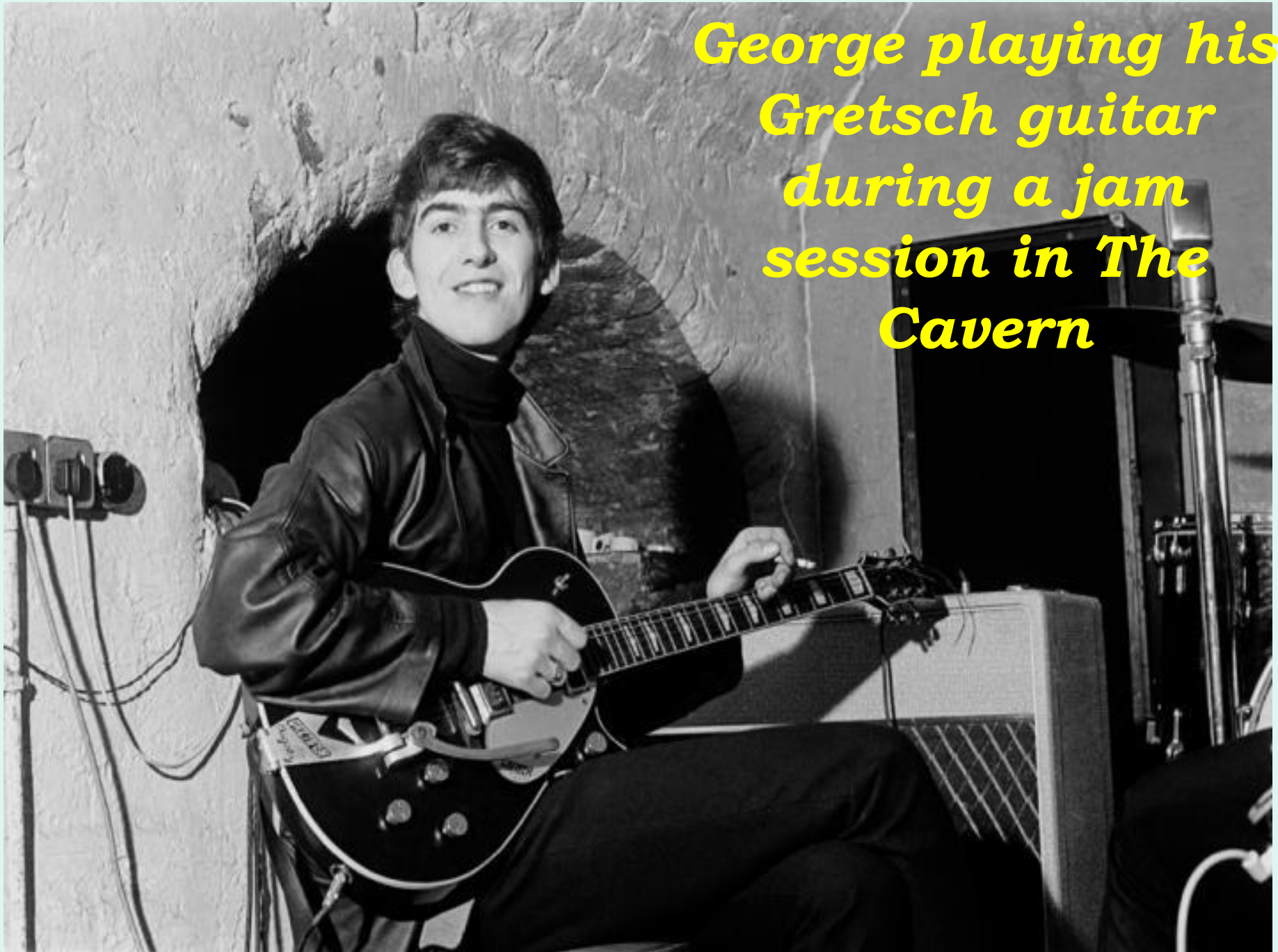
The result of their conjoined musical talents was a band called "The Quarrymen", named after Quarry Banks, the school that they attended.

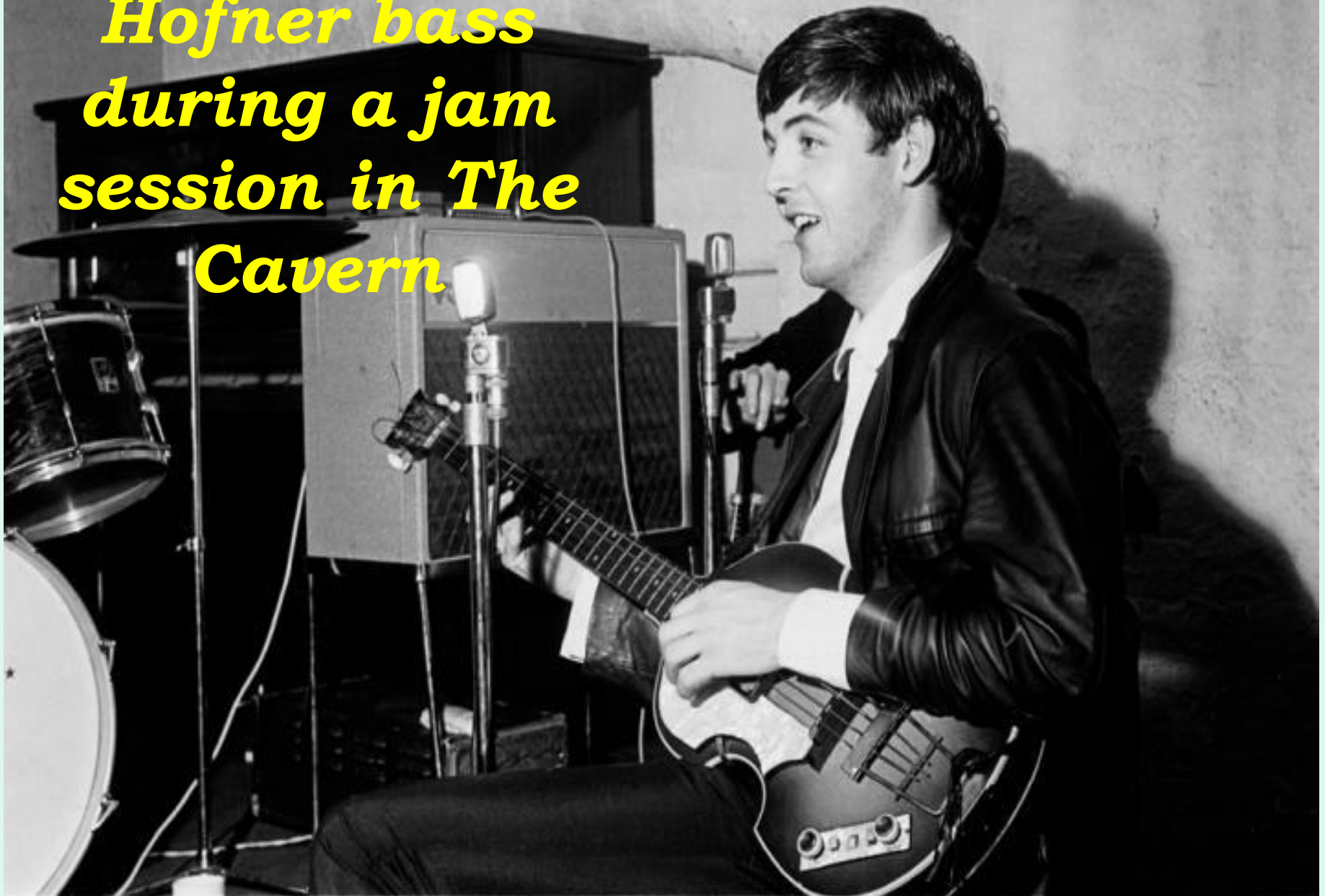


At their early beginnings Beatles often performed in Liverpool's Cavern Club.

The First US Visit



The Beatles' first U.S. tour aroused a universal mob adulation. Their concerts were scenes of mass worship, and their records sold in the millions.

A Hard Day's Night. The Beatles' first feature film.



Their first film, the innovative *A Hard Day's Night* (1964), was received by a wide audience that included many who had never before listened to rock music.

The Concerts at Shea Stadium



On [August 15](#) On August 15, [1965](#) On August 15, 1965, The Beatles started their second [North American](#) On August 15, 1965, The Beatles started their second North American tour at [Shea Stadium](#), which was the first rock concert to be held in a venue of that size. The concert also set two new world records, one for attendance (56,000) and one for revenue.

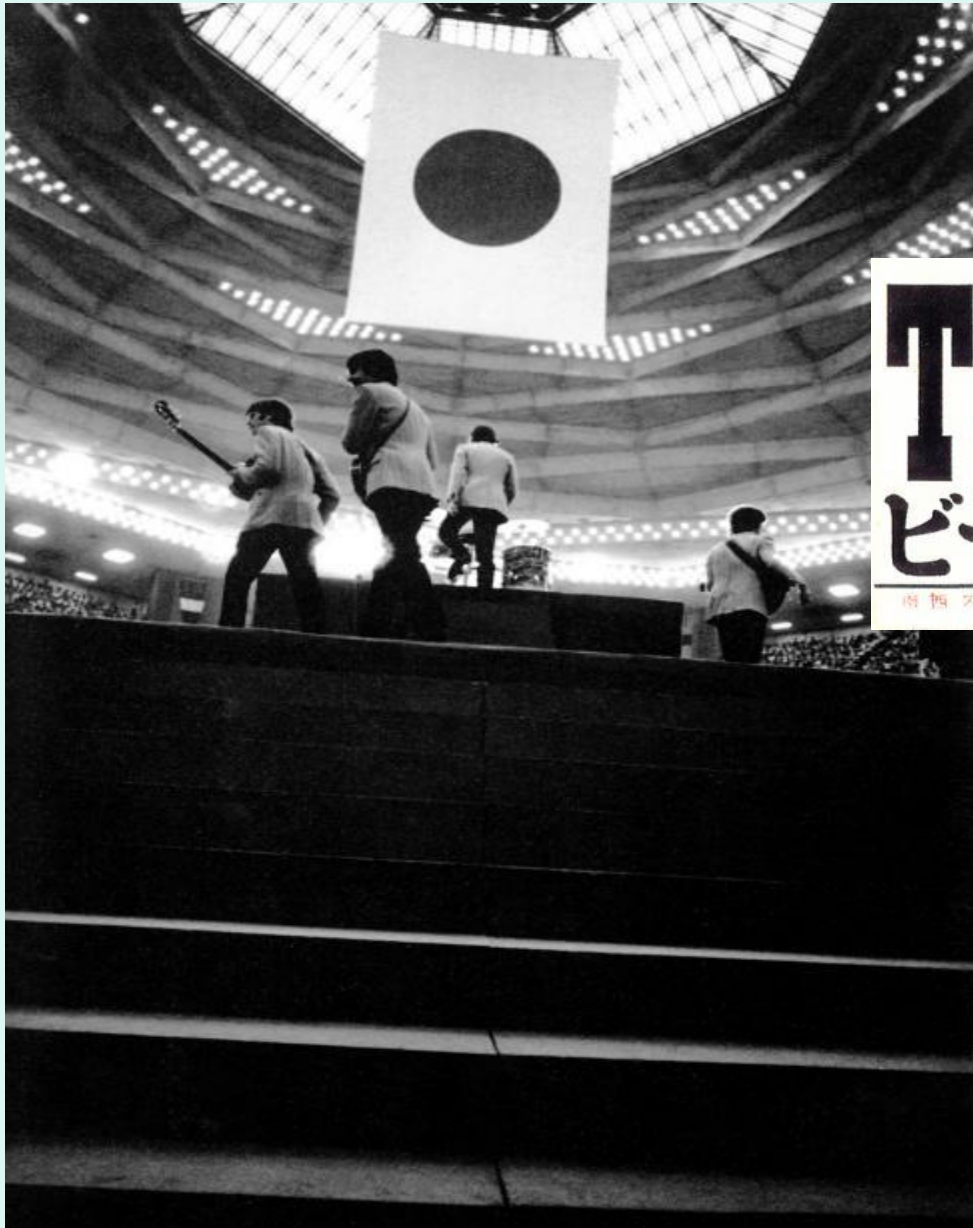

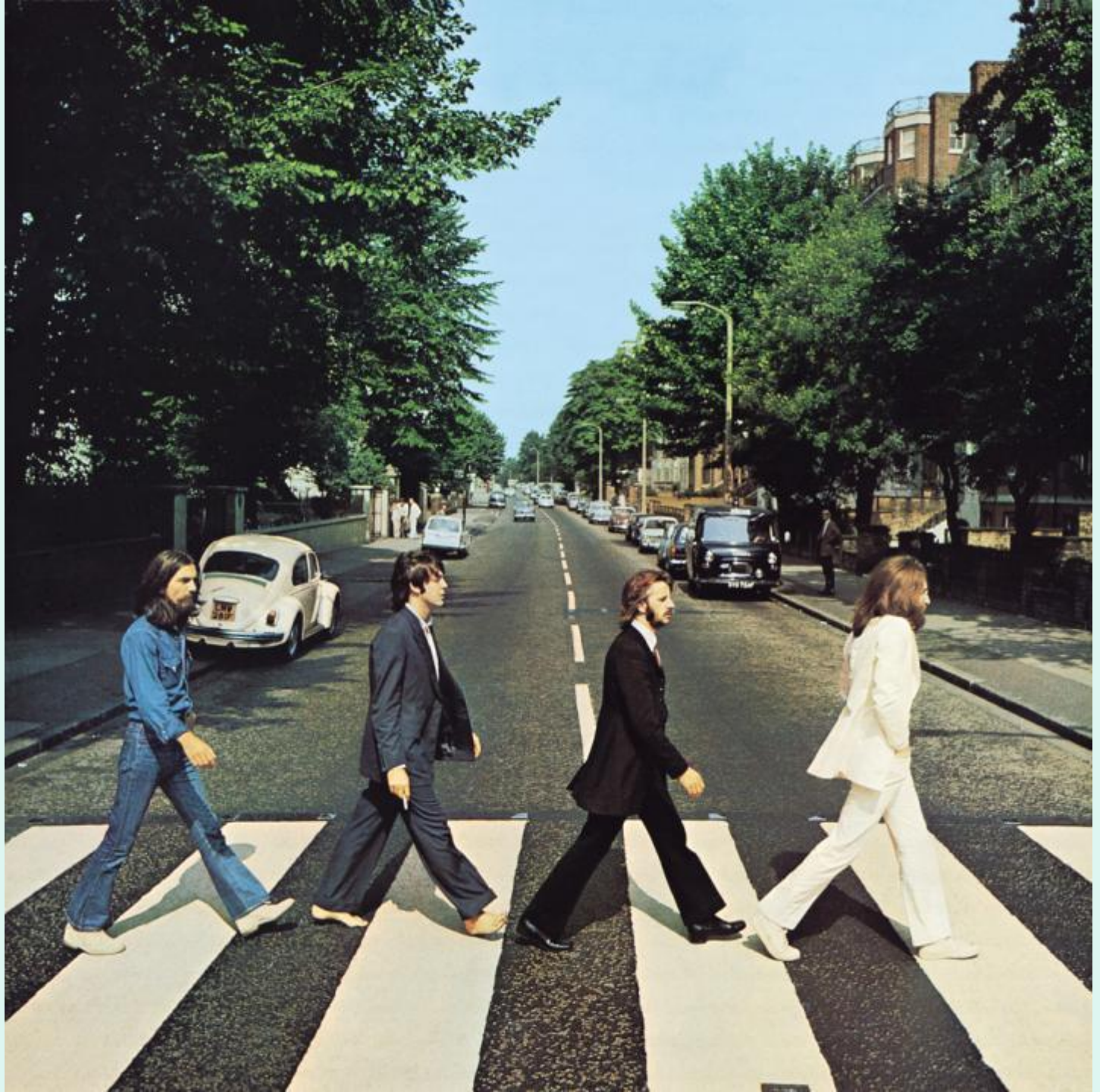

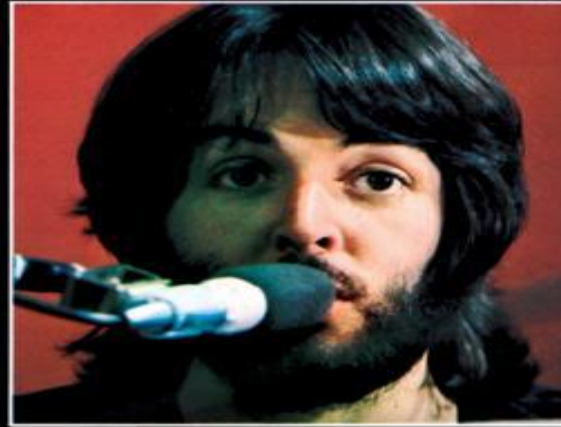
Though The Beatles were still progressing, but it turned out to be the end of the road, as their business disputes continued to magnify. The members of the band began to pursue their own musical interests and were writing together less and less. This became more and more obvious.

Abbey Road

It was something of a miracle, then, that the final album recorded by the group, Abbey Road, was one of their most unified efforts (even if, by this time, the musicians were recording many of their parts separately).



LET IT BE



The group disbanded after the release of their final album, Let It Be, to pursue individual careers.

On April 10, 1970, McCartney announced that the band had officially broken up. After that all the members established solo projects.

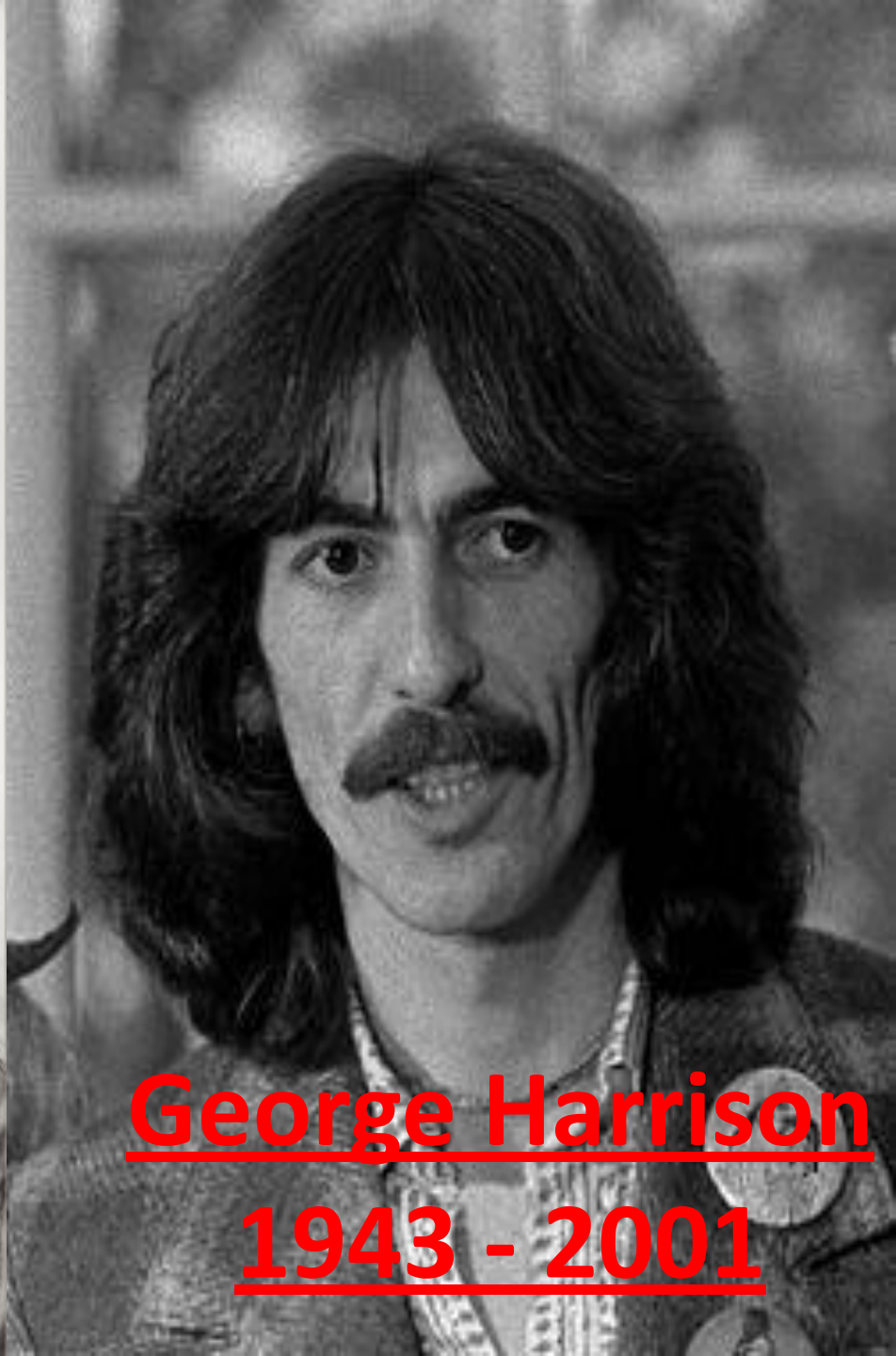
John Lennon was shot in New York outside his house on the 8th of December in 1980.



George Harrison died on 29th of November in 2001, at the age of 58.



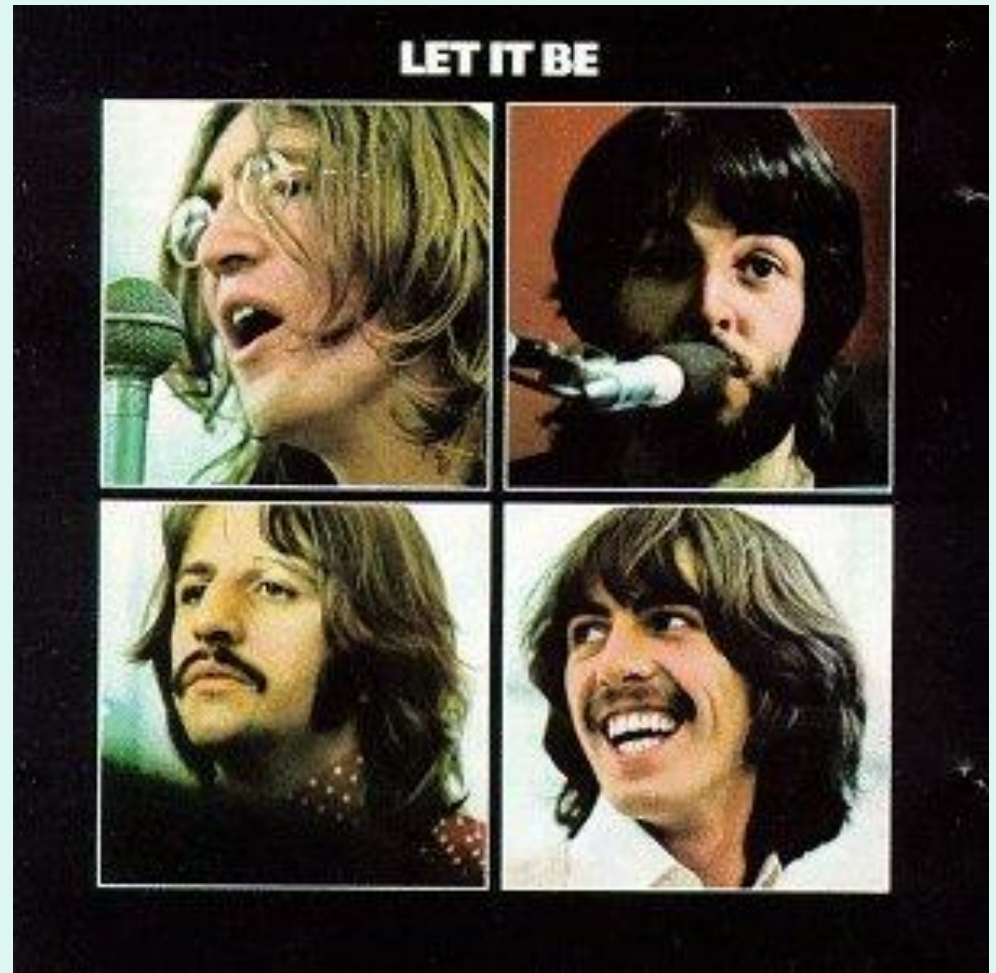
