Pets **are always looked** after. They **are worried** about.



Presents **are waited** for on Christmas.



Sometimes dentists **are visited** and teeth **are taken** out.



Balloons **are sometimes played** with.



Computers **are often worked** on. They **are usually played** on too.



The blackboard **is written** on at every lesson.



Teachers **are usually looked** at and **listened** to at the lesson.

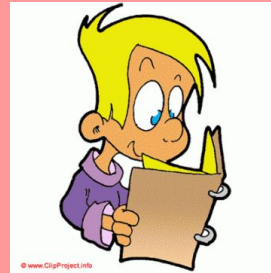

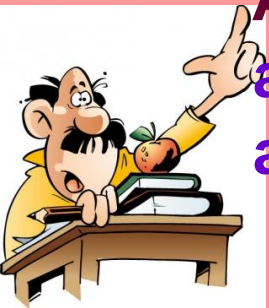
Simple Present Passive

A lot of things are learned at school.

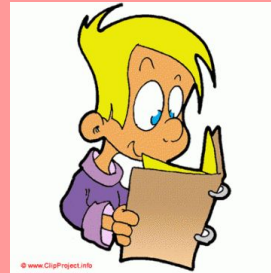


A lot of homework is done at home.

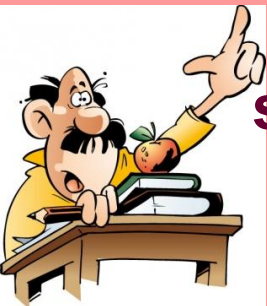

Simple Present Passive



Dishes are washed in the kitchen. They are washed every day.



The yard is cleaned every day. The path is swept every week.



The carpet is cleaned every week. The floor is swept.



Food is bought in the shop. It is bought every Saturday.



Clothes are washed on Friday. They are dried in the yard.



Leaves are raked very often in autumn. They are burnt.



Pies are made every day. They are eaten at lunch. They are liked.



Paths are cleaned in winter very often. Snow is taken away.

Simple Present Passive

Songs are sung **by** rabbits.



Books are read **by** birds.



Juice is drunk **by** goats.



Music is played **by** animals.



Soup is cooked **by** tigers.

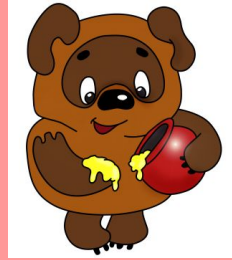


Walls are painted **by** elephants.

Simple Present Passive



Bears are given honey.



Milk is given by cows.



Teeth are cleaned by frogs.



Cats are caught by mice.



Chickens are fed by the girl.



Meat is liked by frogs.



Sausages are eaten by cats.



Easter eggs are brought by bunnies.

Simple Present Passive



Are presents given to children? Are they waited for?



Are presents given on birthday? Are presents liked by kids?



Are snowmen made in winter?



Are songs sung on Christmas? Are they listened to?



Is ice cream sold in your town? Is it often bought? Is ice cream often eaten by children?



Are sandwiches made in the morning? Are they eaten for breakfast?



Is tea made every morning? Is tea often drunk in your family?



Is football played in your school? Is it watched on TV?

Simple Present Passive



Are new houses built in your town? Where are they built?



Is meat often cooked? When is meat cooked? How is it cooked?



Are dishes washed every day? Where are the dishes washed?



Are shoes made here? What shoes are made here?



Are taxis often taken? When are they taken?



Is the floor swept every day? How often is the floor swept?



Are the walls often painted here? How often are they painted?



Are films made in your town? What films are made? Where are they made?
