- Scent- a pleasant and faint smell

The rose has a delightful scent.



- Aroma- a pleasant and usually strong smell

I felt a pleasant aroma of fresh coffee.



- Perfume/ odour- can be a pleasant or unpleasant smell and strong
- It has a pleasant perfume of a violet.



- Reek- an unpleasant and strong smell
- There was a reek of tobacco smoke in the café.



- Stink and stench- a very unpleasant and strong smell
- I felt a stink of spoilt fish.
- A stench of these dirty clothes made her dizzy.



Adjectives.

- Strange- 1. not known, not seen before, foreign
- It turned to be very difficult to find your way in a strange country.
- 2. unusual
- She had a strange look on her face.



Adjectives.

- Queer- strange, slightly unwell/ mad, when smth is wrong
- He is a bit queer in his head.



Adjectives.

- Odd- 1. different from what is ordinary, peculiar, hard to understand
- It's very odd that she didn't reply to our letter.
- 2. that can't be divided exactly in two
- 1, 3, 5, 7- are odd numbers
