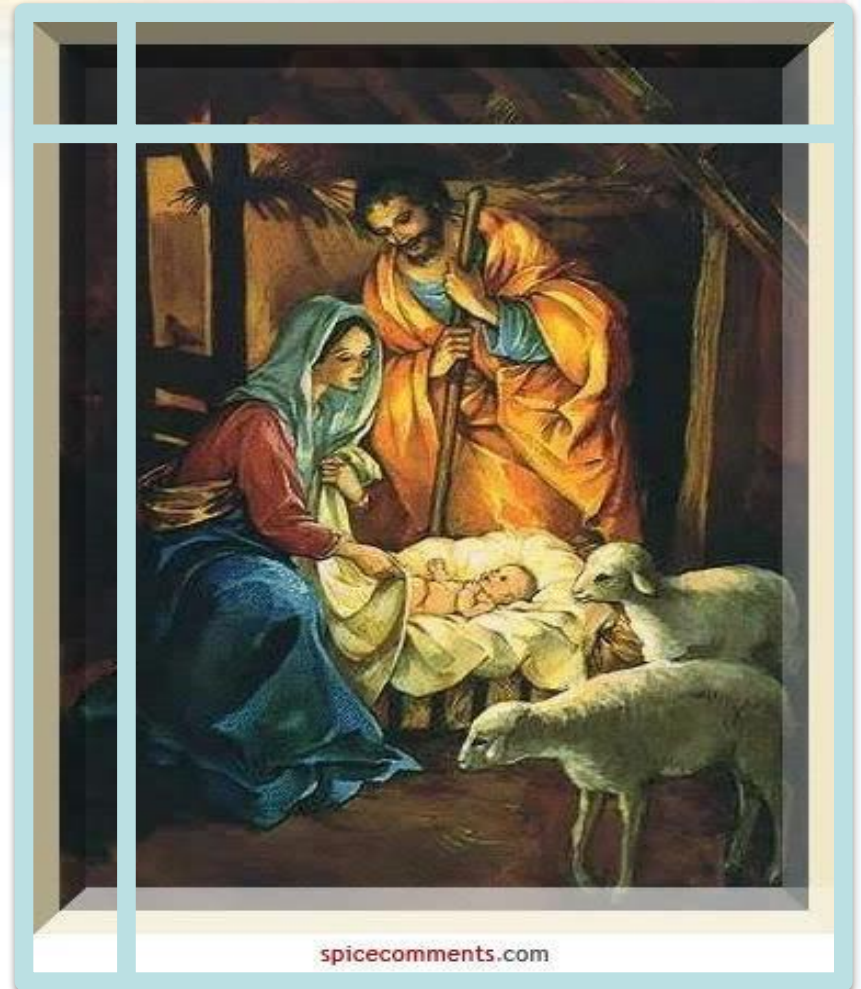
Christmas, the greatest holiday in England, is on the 25th of December.



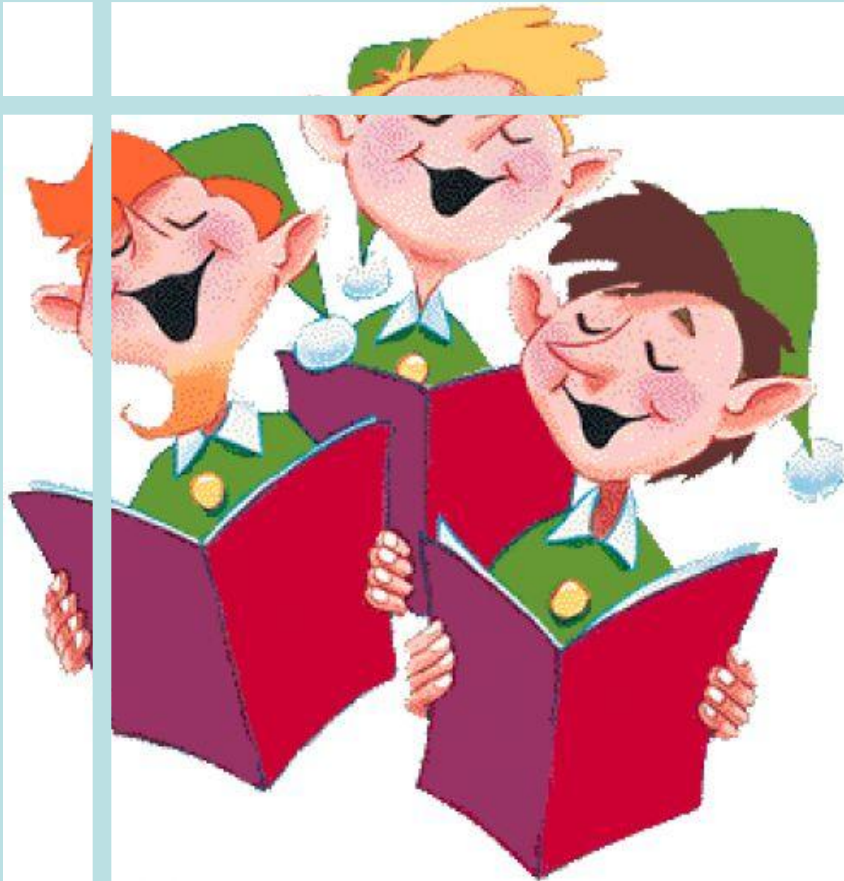
Christmas is a religious holiday.
