

The majesticwas built by Christopher Wren between 1675 and 1711. Five different churches were built at this site.





The national flower of Great Britain.








It is one of the most popular of London's historical sites. It has 20 towers. It was a prison. Today it's a museum and houses the Crown Jewels.

Westminster Abby






A castle, standing on a rock over looking the river Thames, was founded by William the Conqueror. Nowadays it is a place, where the Royal family can relax.








