# London is a capital of Great Britain

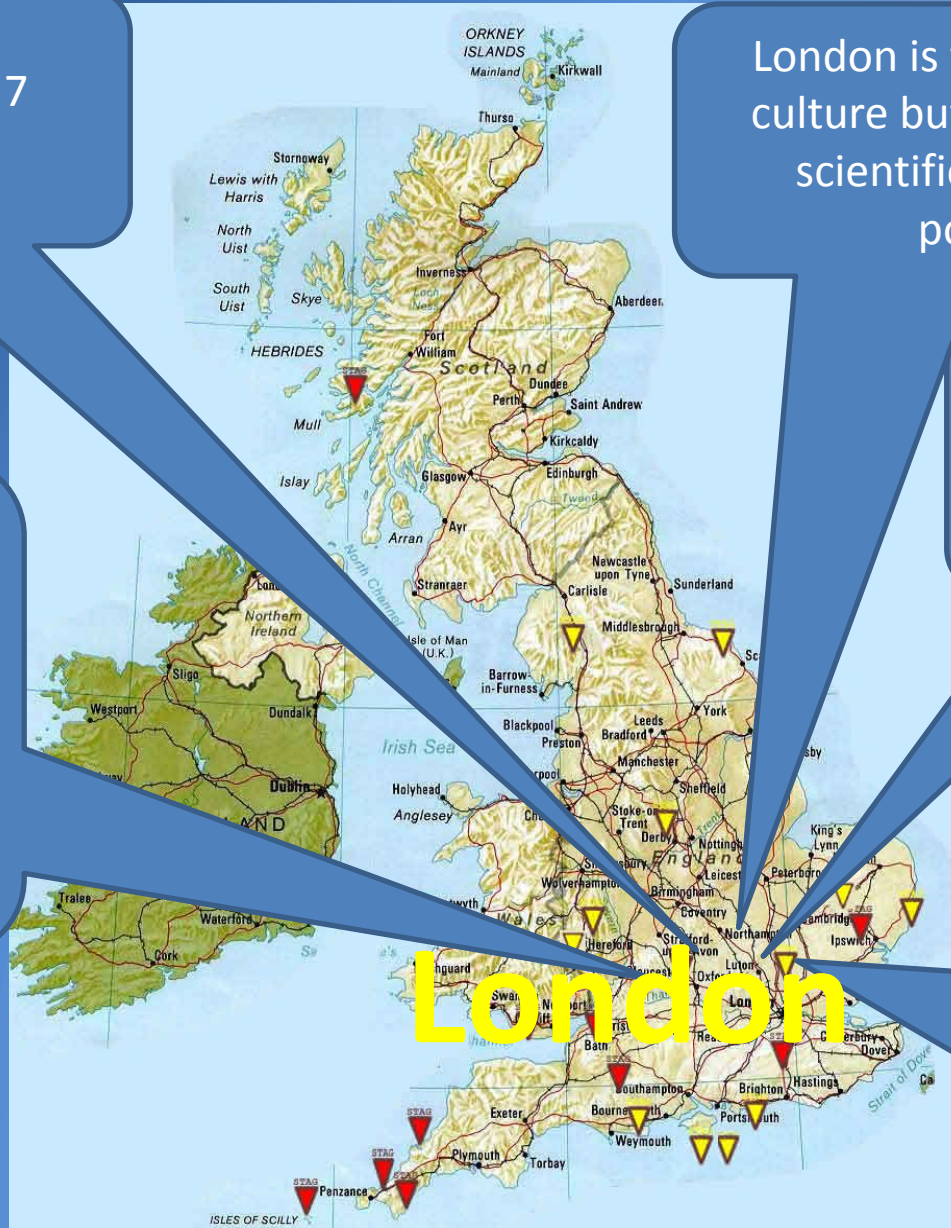
The population is 7 million people.

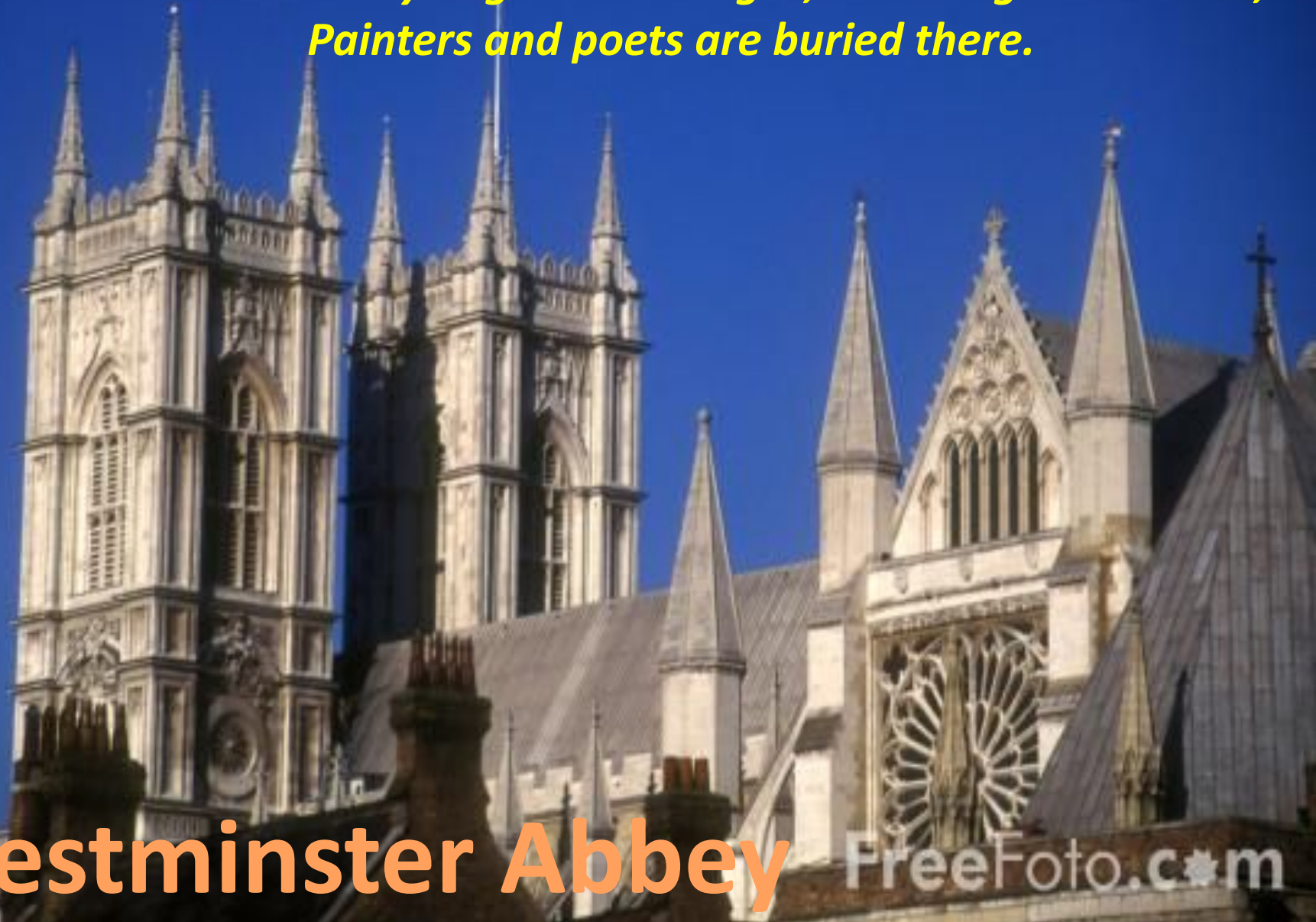


# The West End

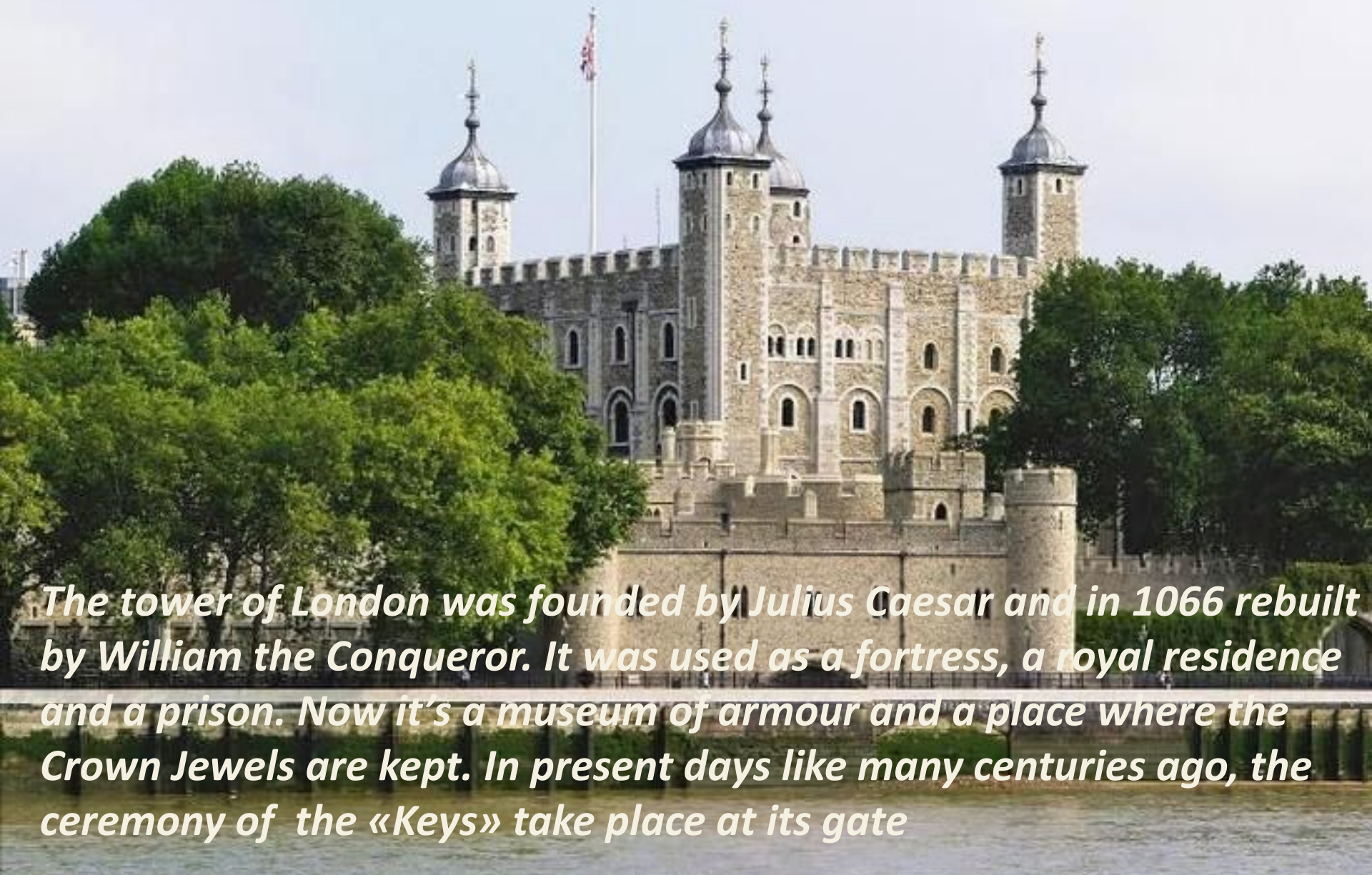

# The East End

*Tower Bridge is a combined bascule and suspension bridge in London, over the River Thames. It is close to the Tower of London, from which it takes its name. <sup>[1]</sup> It has become an iconic symbol of London.*

# The City of London
