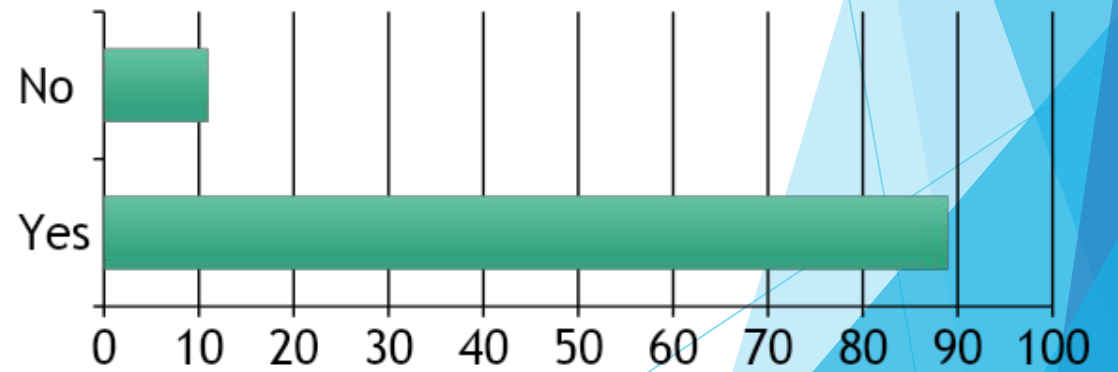
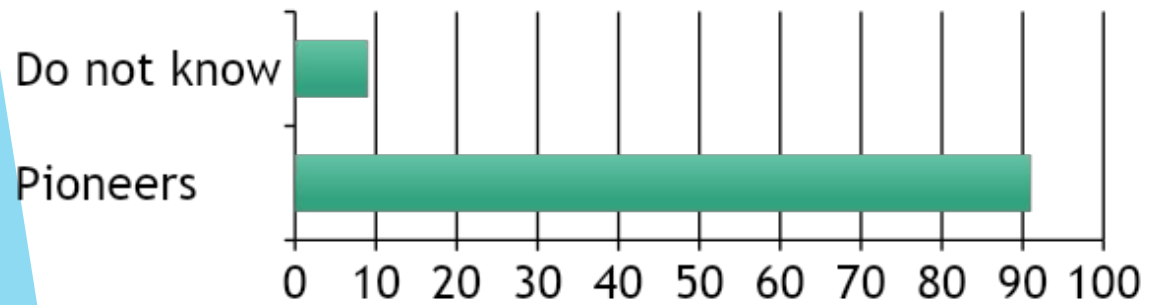
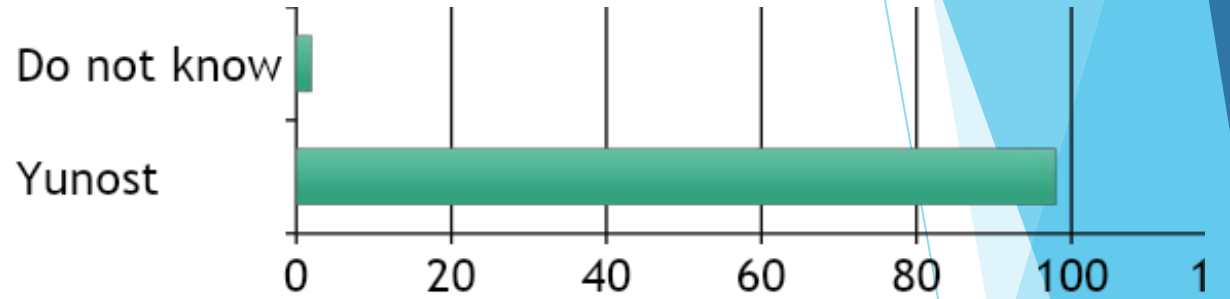
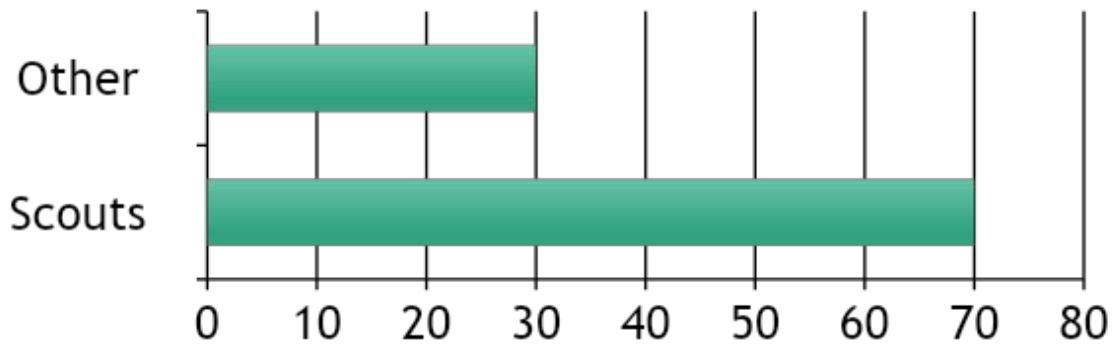
Children are our future

Objectives:

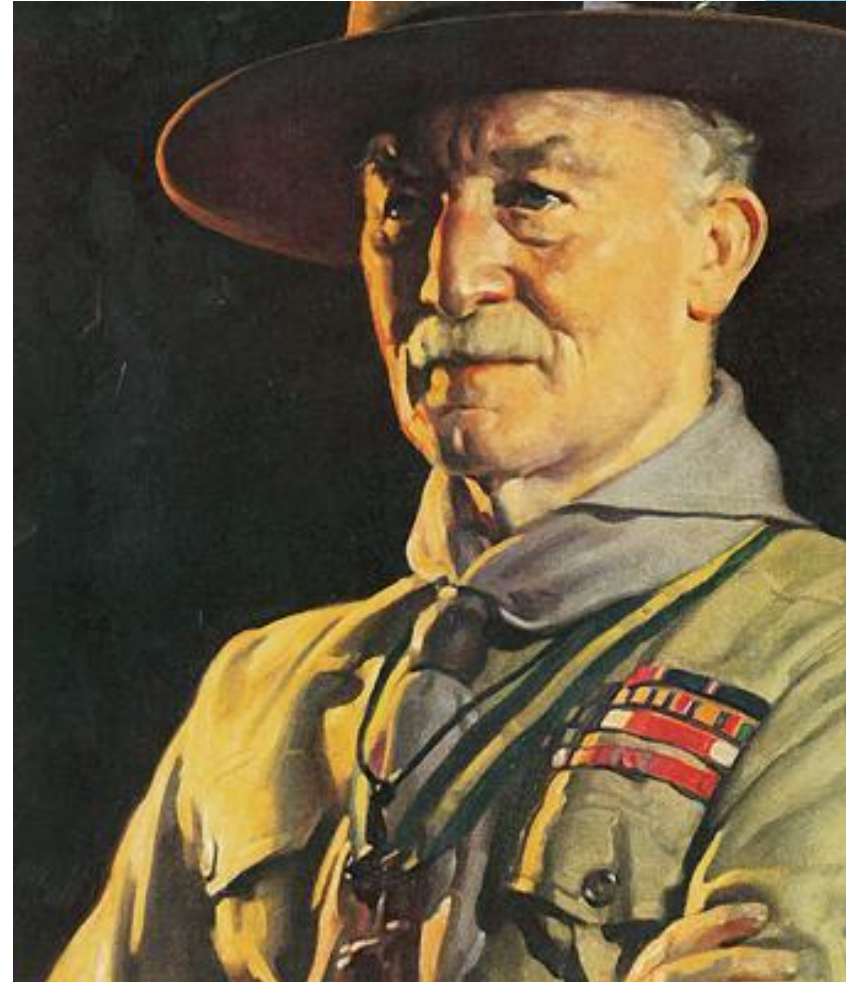
- ▶ **To study the history of children's organizations in Russia and the UK**

Robert Baden Powell (22 February 1857 - 8 January 1941) is the founder of the scouting movement.



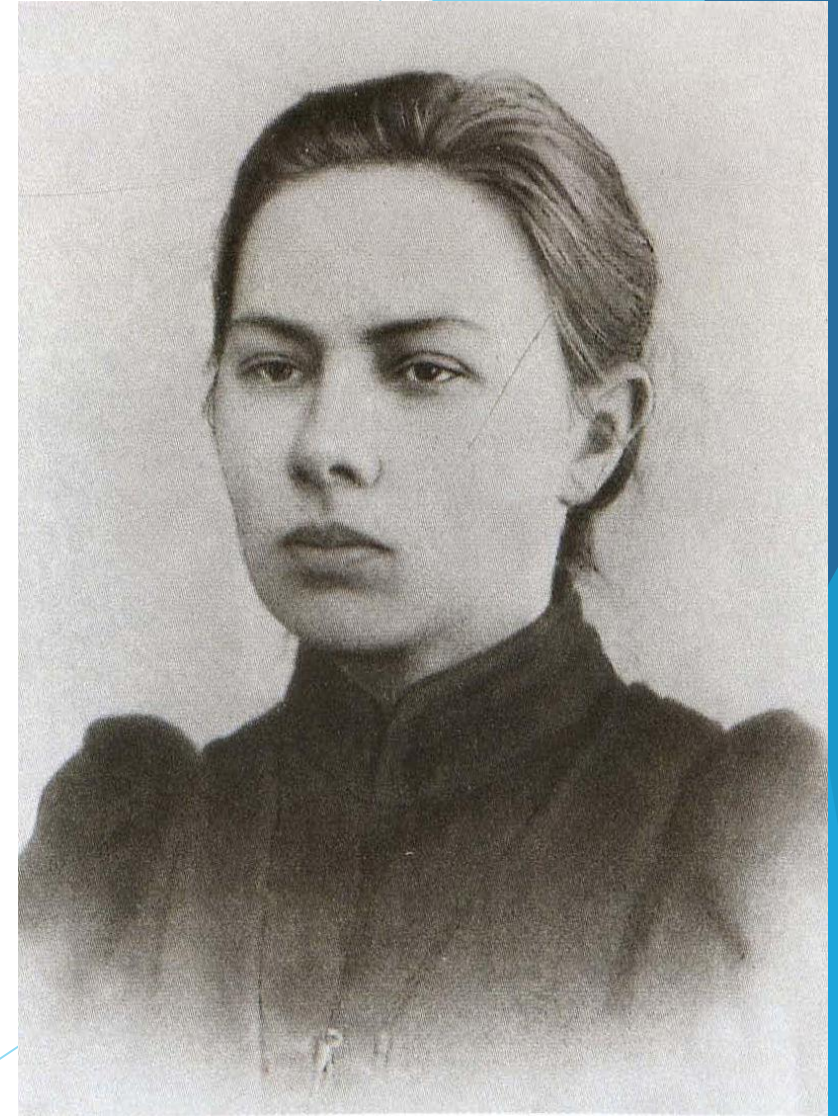
Scout method

The Scout method is a progressive system comprising seven elements: law and promise, learning by doing, team system, symbolic framework, personal progression, nature and adult support.



The Pioneer organization in Russia

The mass youth organization for children of age 10-15 that existed between 1922 and 1991. It was similar to Scouting organization of the Western world.



Common features:

- ▶ Trained patriotism.
- ▶ Formed the devotion to country and willingness to serve its interests.
- ▶ Raised children to be disciplined and to perform socially useful labor.
- ▶ Used game forms of educational work.
- ▶ Had symbols: oath, motto, badge, salute, scarf, uniform.

Differences:

Scouting

- ▶ Non-political movement
- ▶ Public service to the Motherland
- ▶ The financial support from charities

Pioneering

- ▶ Dependence on the political regime
- ▶ Service to the ideas of the Communist party
- ▶ The financial support from the state

The scout in form, but Communist in content.
