- The word “Christmas” comes from the words “Christ’s Mass”-the celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ.

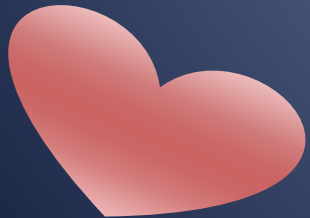


The most big cities, especially London, are decorated with coloured lights and Christmas trees.
