

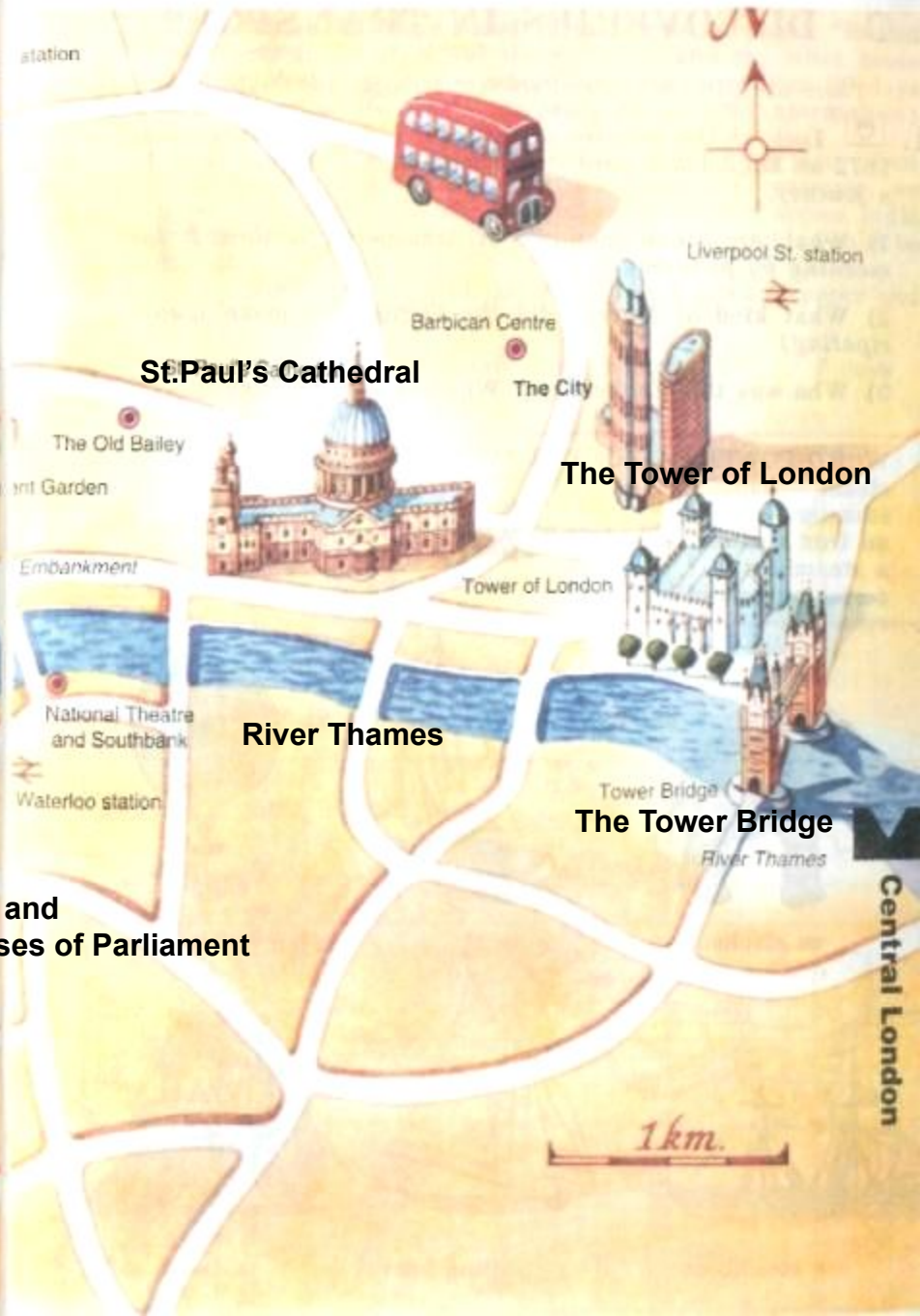
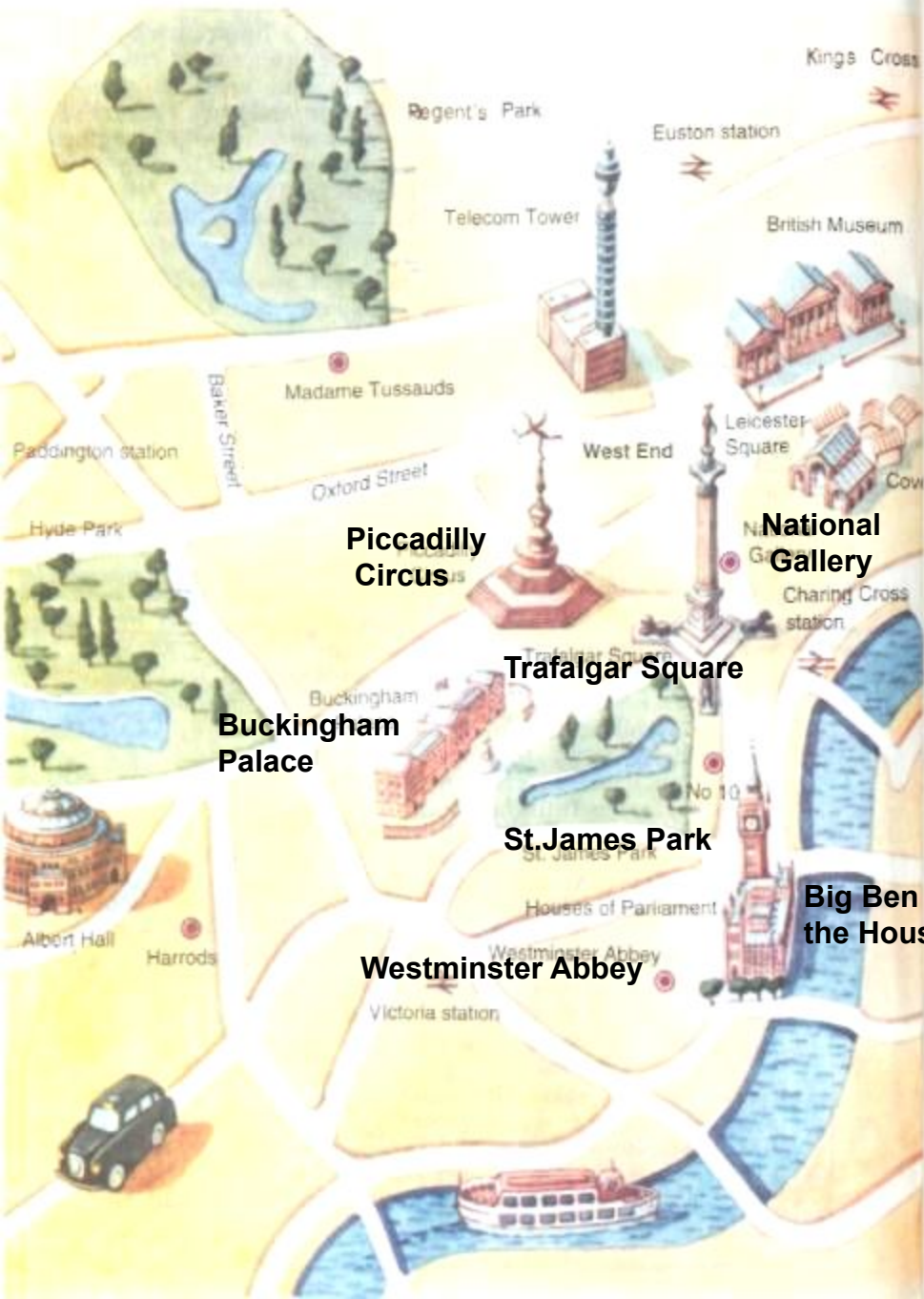

It has 600 hundred rooms, a swimming pool, a cinema, a ballroom, a nuclear cellar and a garden.

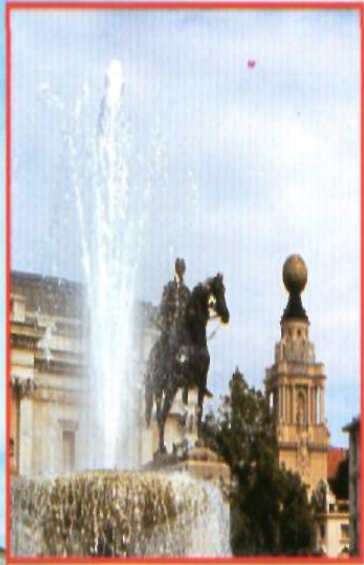
St. Paul's Cathedral

Trafalgar Square



On New Year's Eve people gather to celebrate. There is a very famous statue "**Nelson's Column**" (170 feet high). The statue on the top is in memory of Lord **Horatio Nelson** who won the most famous sea battle at Trafalgar. This column is cleaned once every seven years. It is a very difficult job as they have to climb to the top and clean it.

National Gallery.



It's one of the finest art collections in the world. It includes paintings from British, Italian, Spanish, French, Dutch, Flemish and other famous schools. It has collection of paintings by the famous artists **Van Gogh, Reubens, Constable** and any other painter.

The Tower of London

It is a very old building, - **nine hundred years old!** In the early days of England the English kings lived in the Tower. Then it was a **prison** where many people died.

The Tower in the Past



Now the Tower of London is a **museum**.

Many tourists can see the dark stone halls with small windows and thick doors.



Tower Bridge

It was opened in 1894. It takes its name from the Tower of London. The mechanism can raise and lower the bridge in one and a half minutes.



The Houses of Parliament and Big Ben

Very large building which stands near the Thames. Once a royal palace, the Houses of Parliament are now **the seat of the Government**.

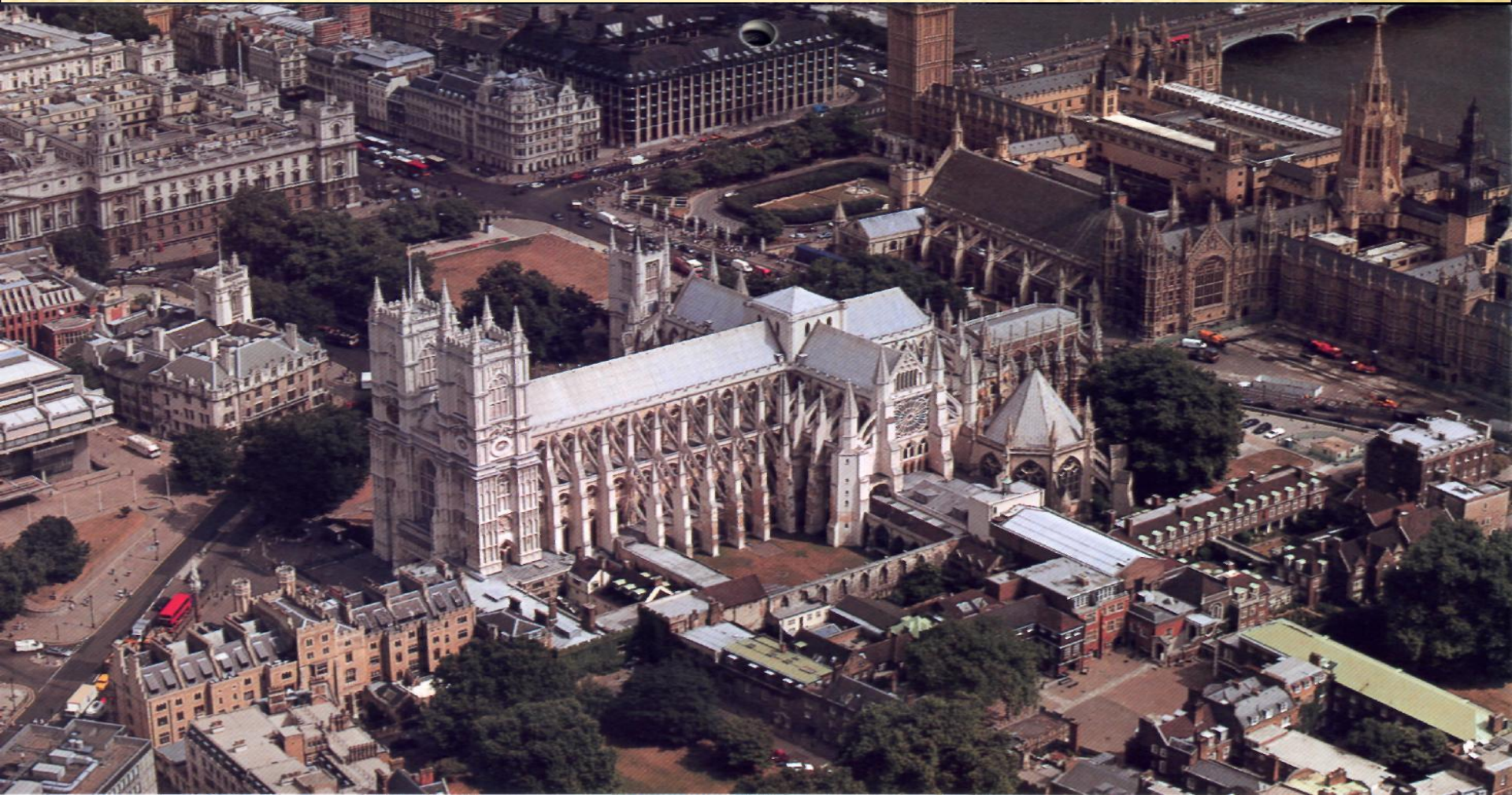

The coronations of kings and queens have taken place here.

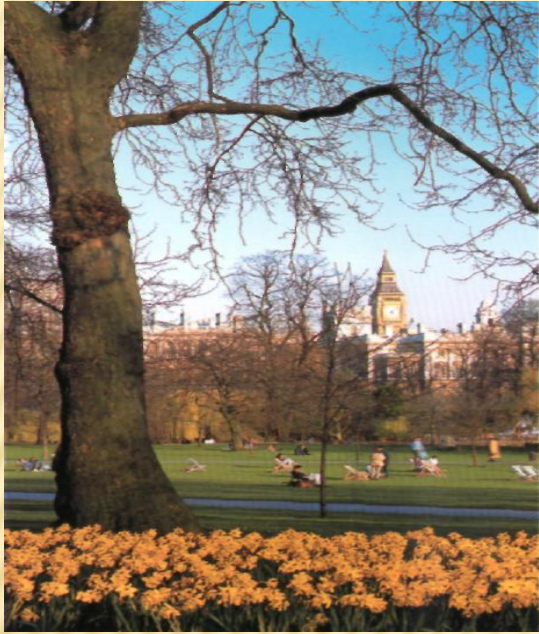
