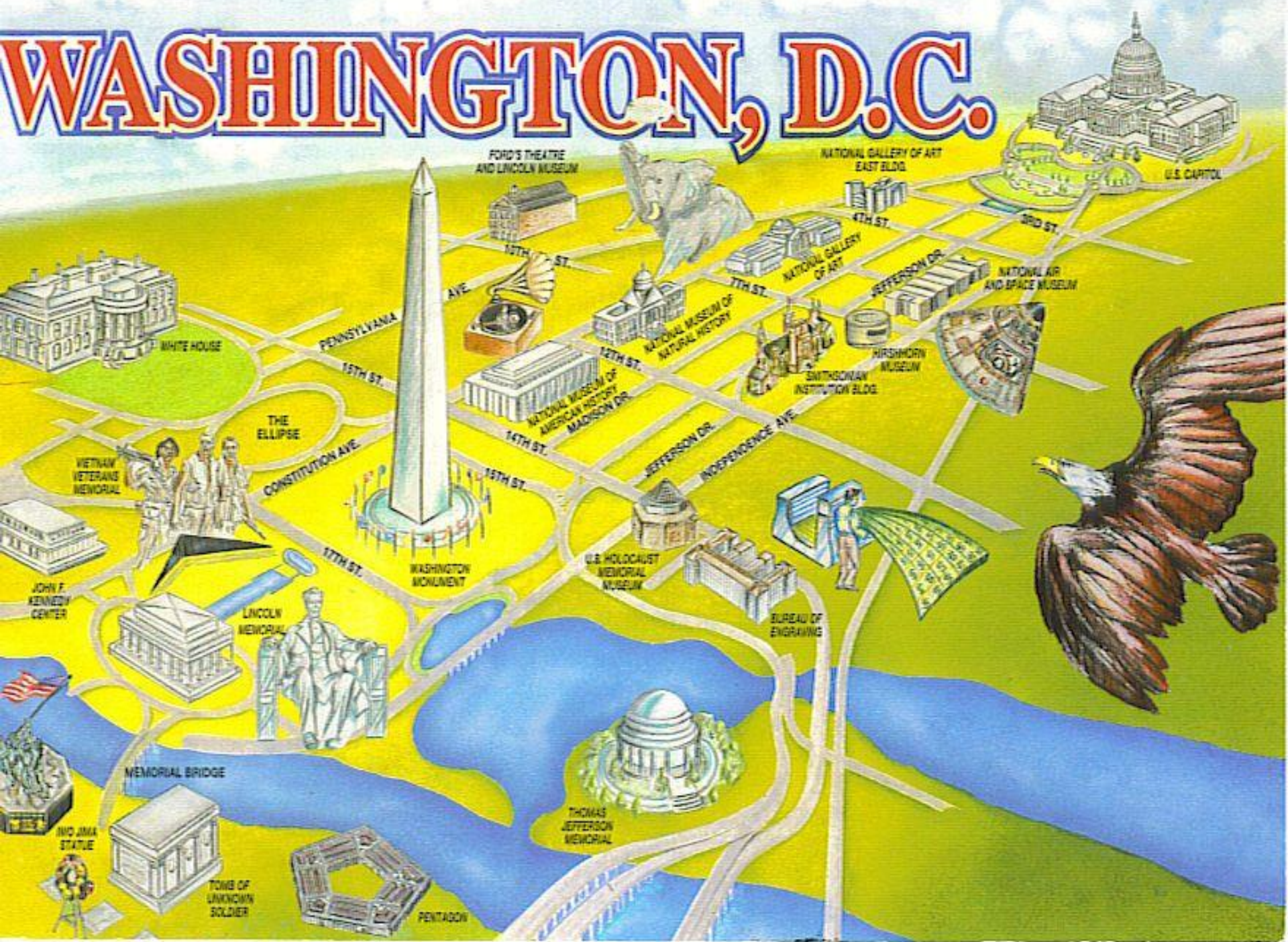

THE CAPITOL

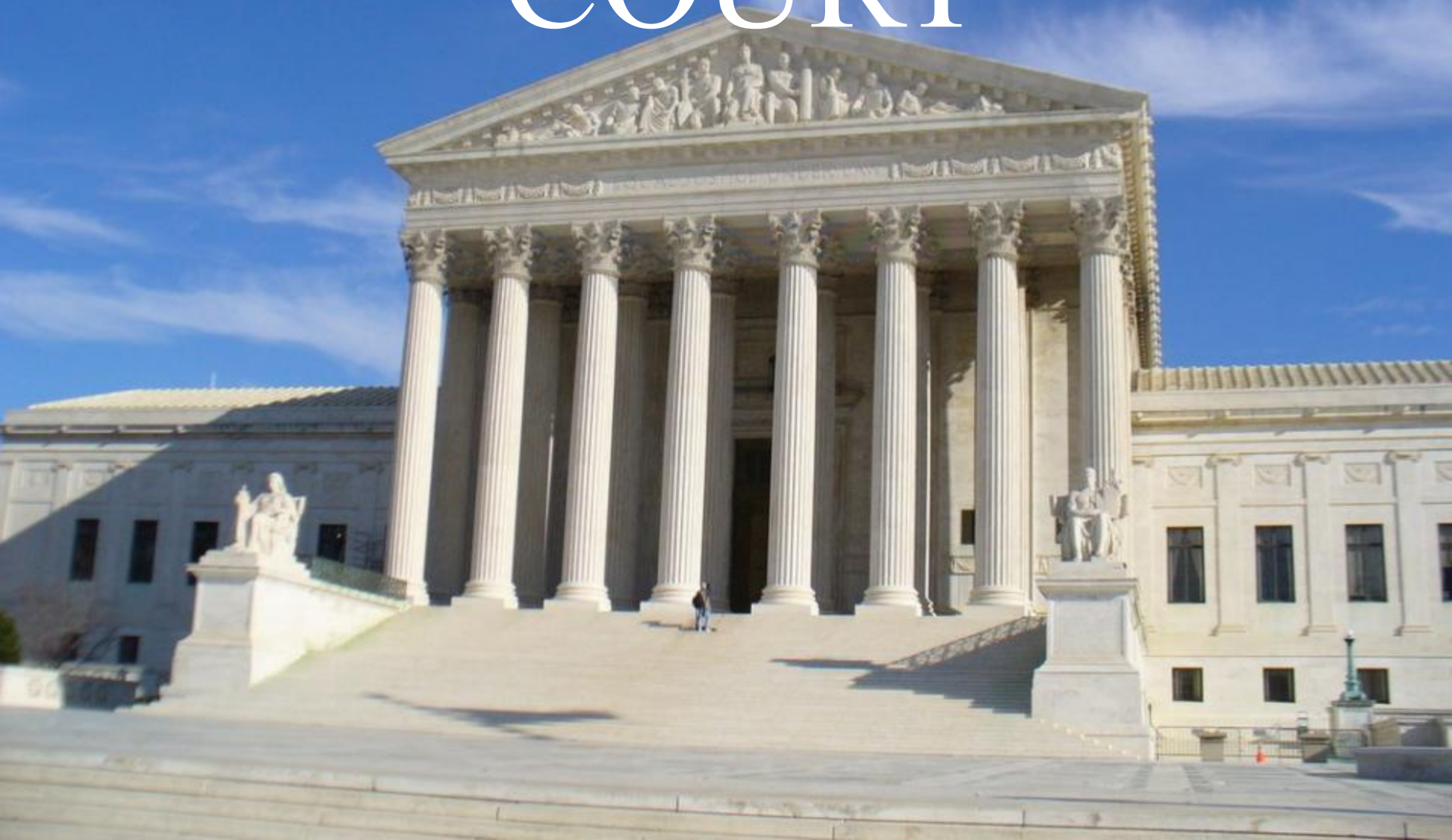




Capitol is the meeting place of the United States Congress, the legislature of the Federal government of the United States composed of the Senate and the house of representatives. It is a bicameral legislature.

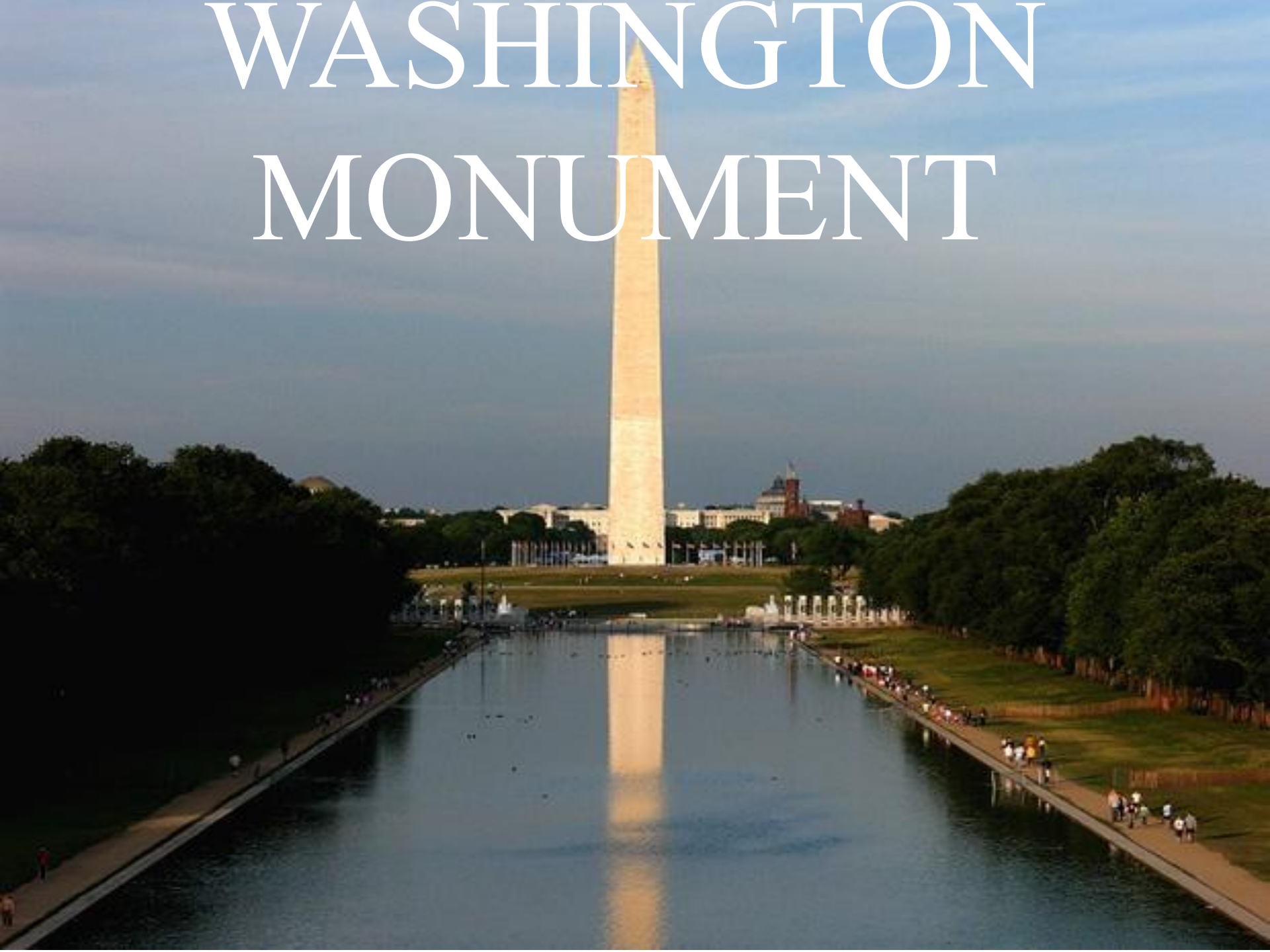
THE PENTAGON

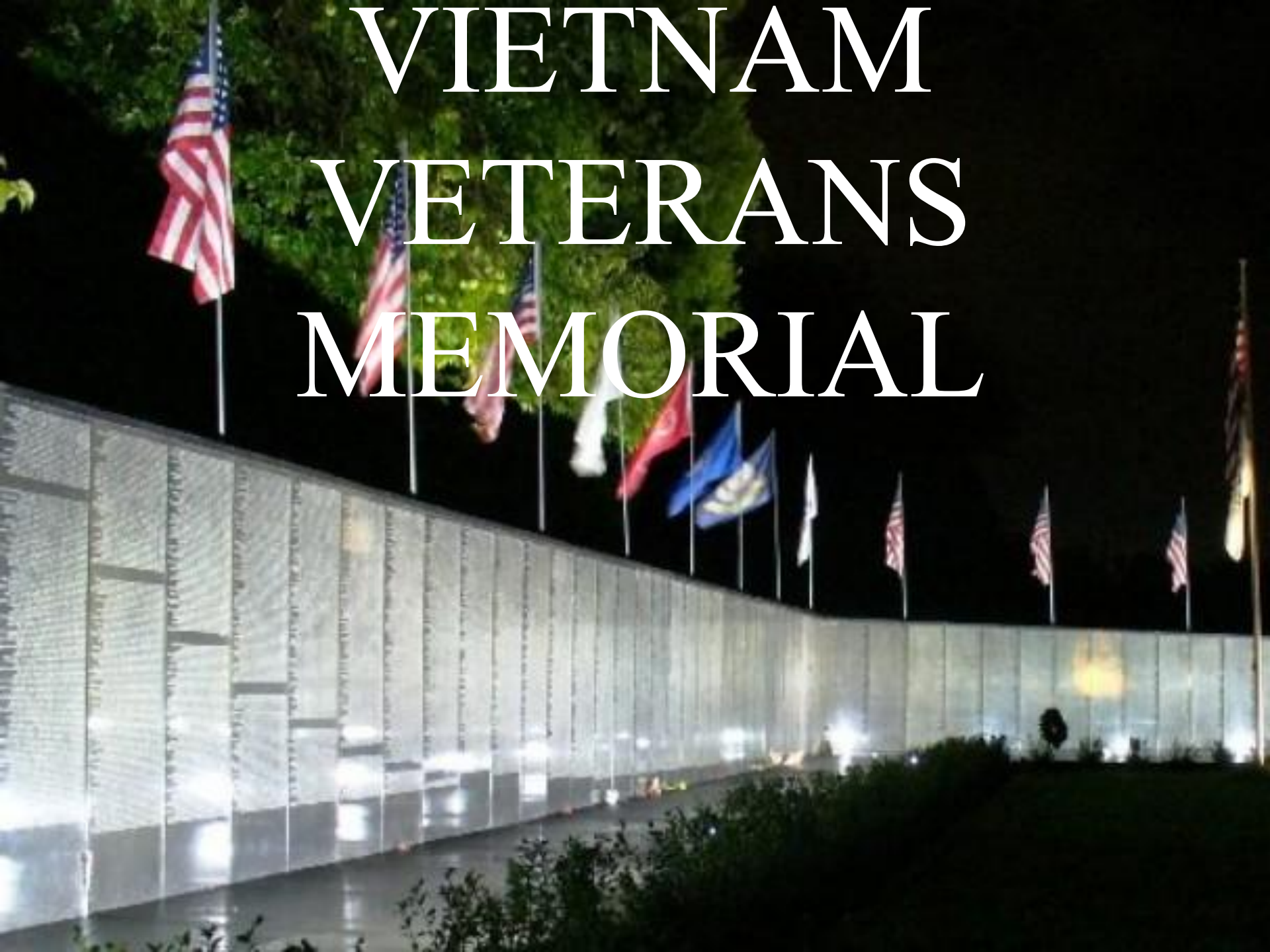
THE ASSASSINATION OF THOMAS SEAGER AT GRAND THEATRE ON THE NIGHT OF APRIL 15, 1865.

ABRAHAM LINCOLN'S MEMORIAL



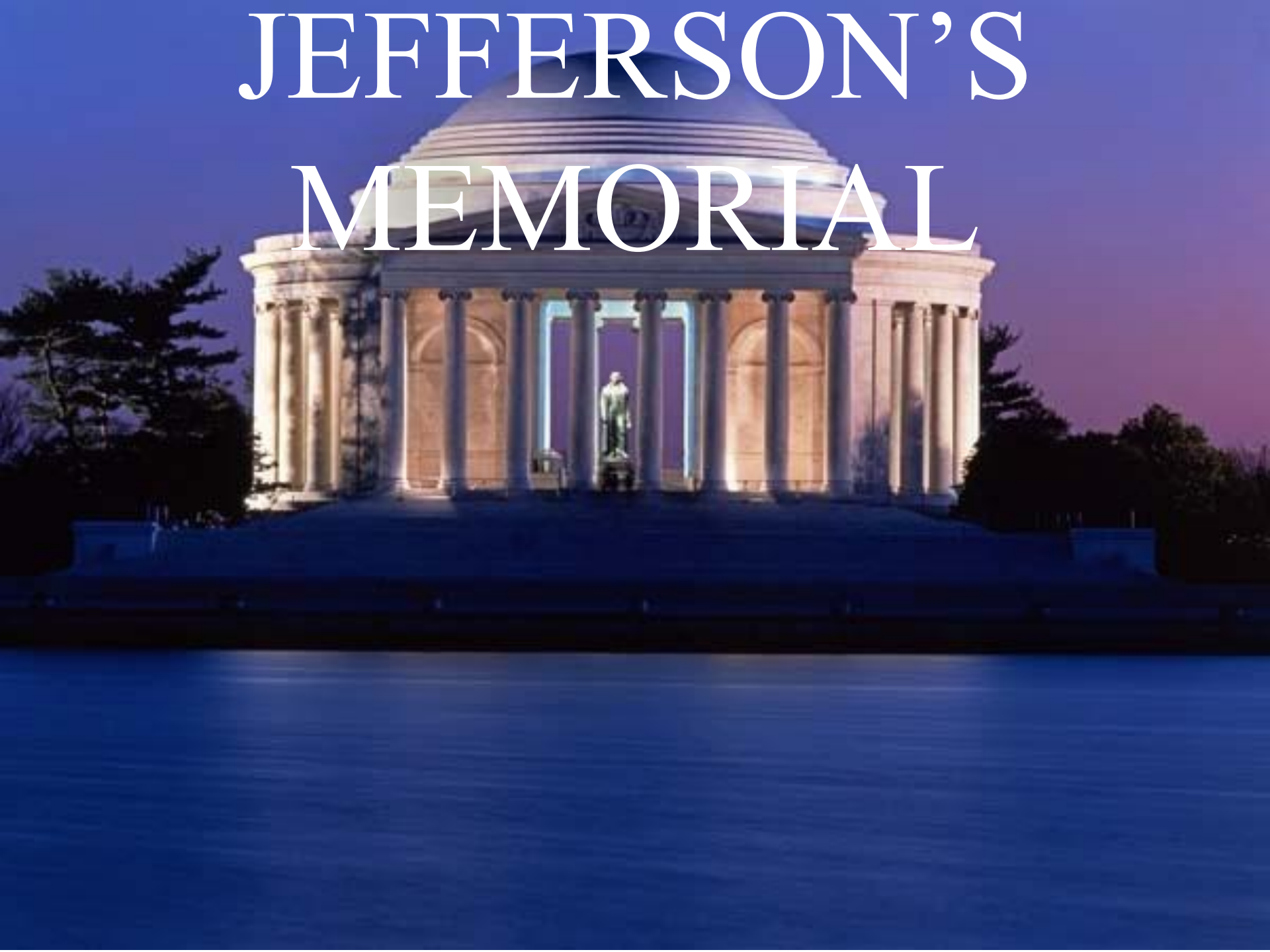

JEFFERSON'S MEMORIAL

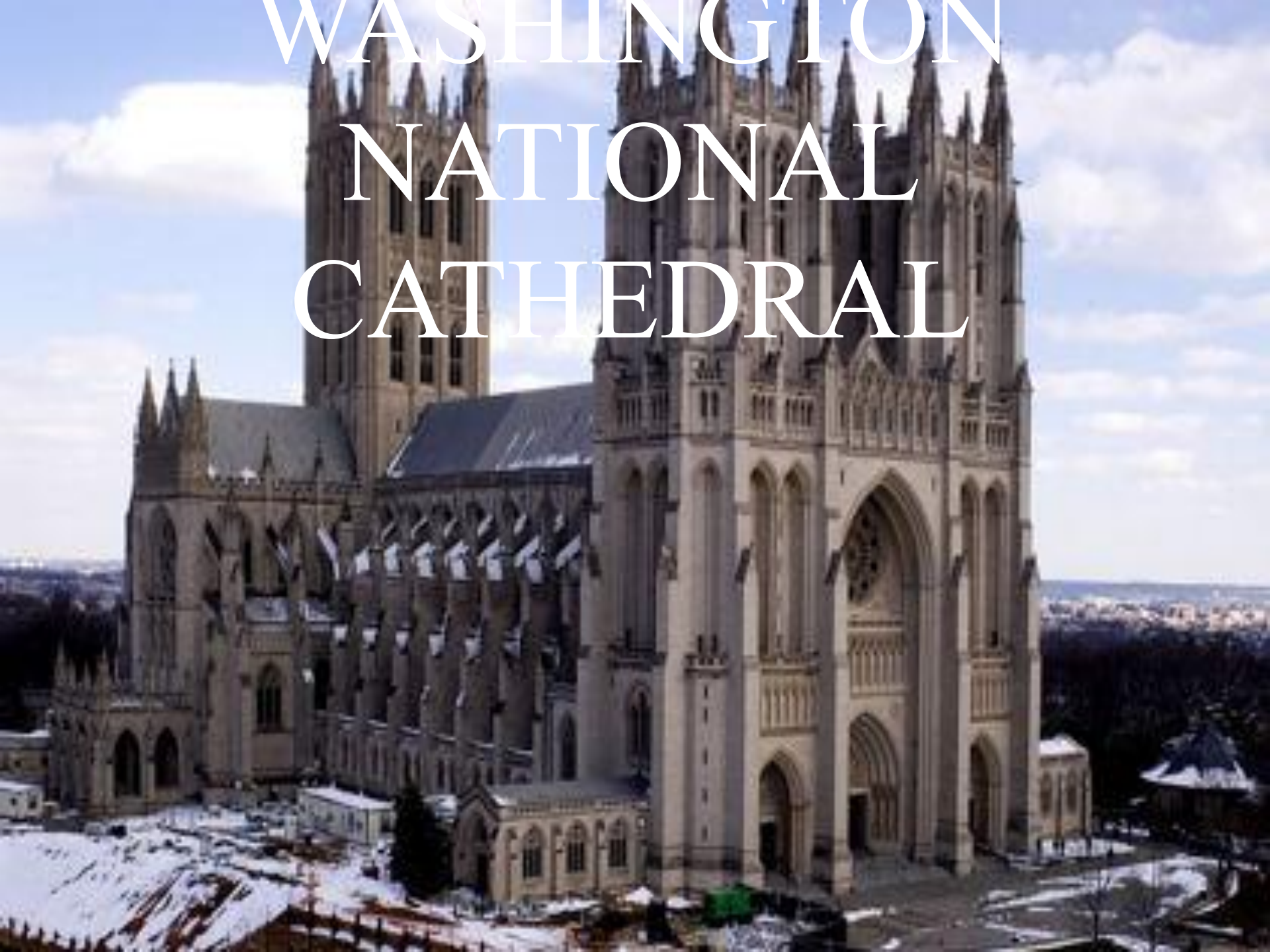




Memorial is a presidential memorial in Washington, D.C. that is dedicated to Thomas Jefferson, an American Founding Father and the third president of the United States.
