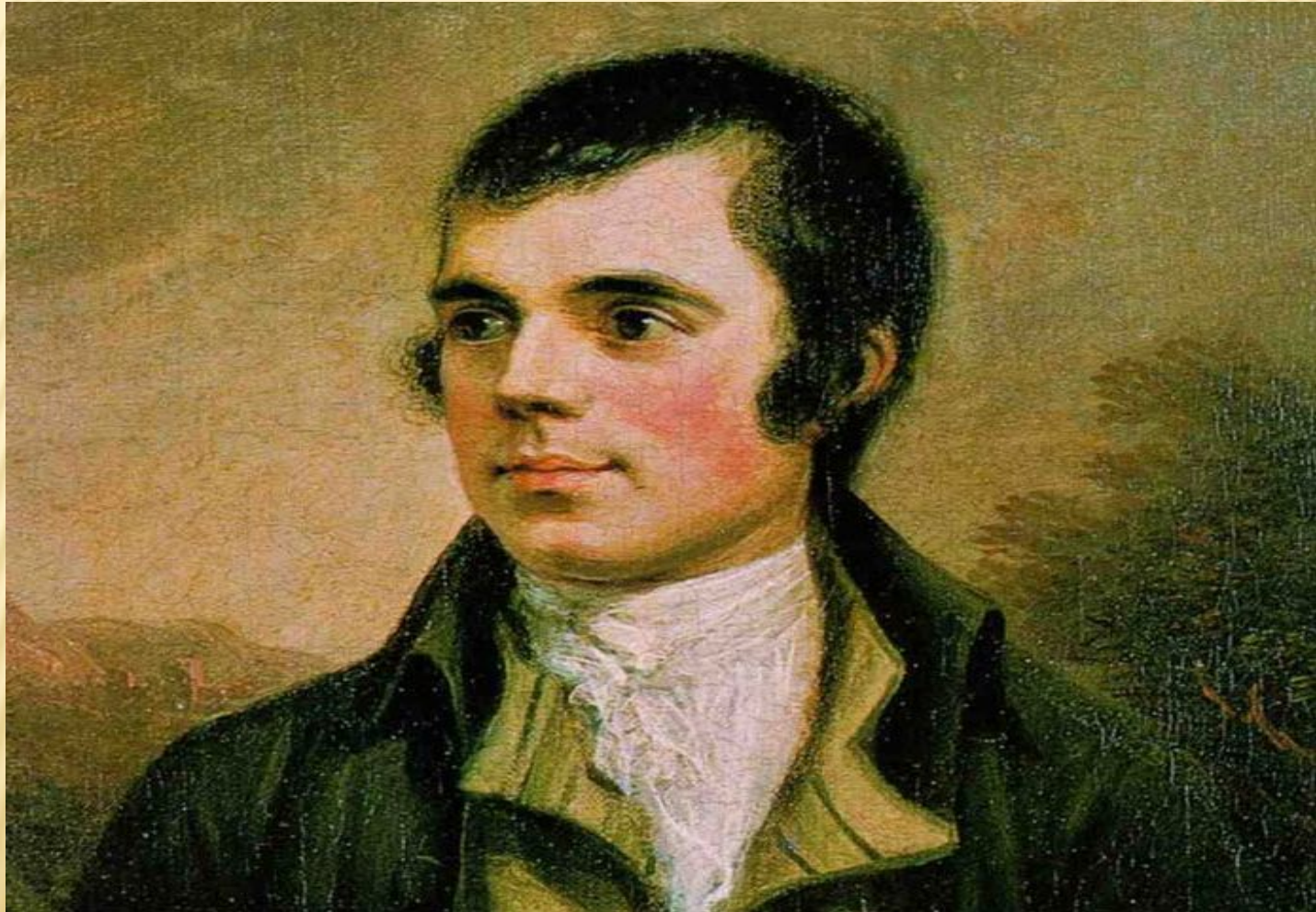

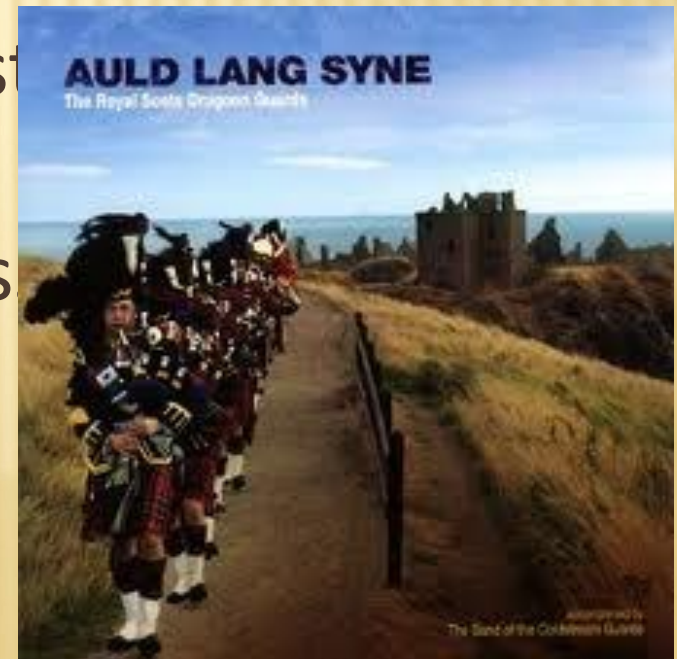




“AULD LANG SYNE”

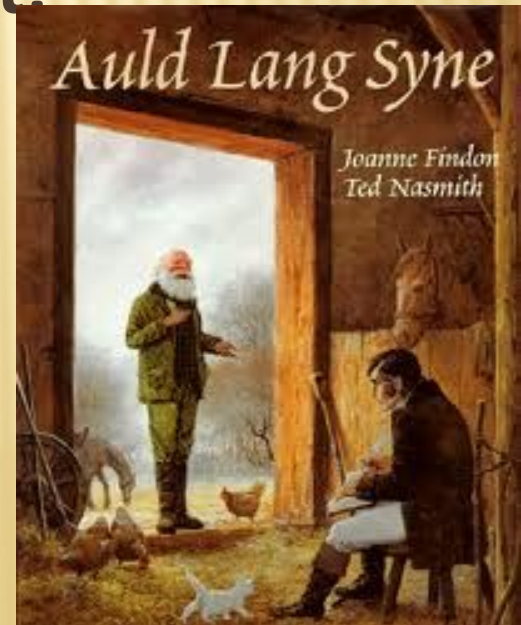
