Underground

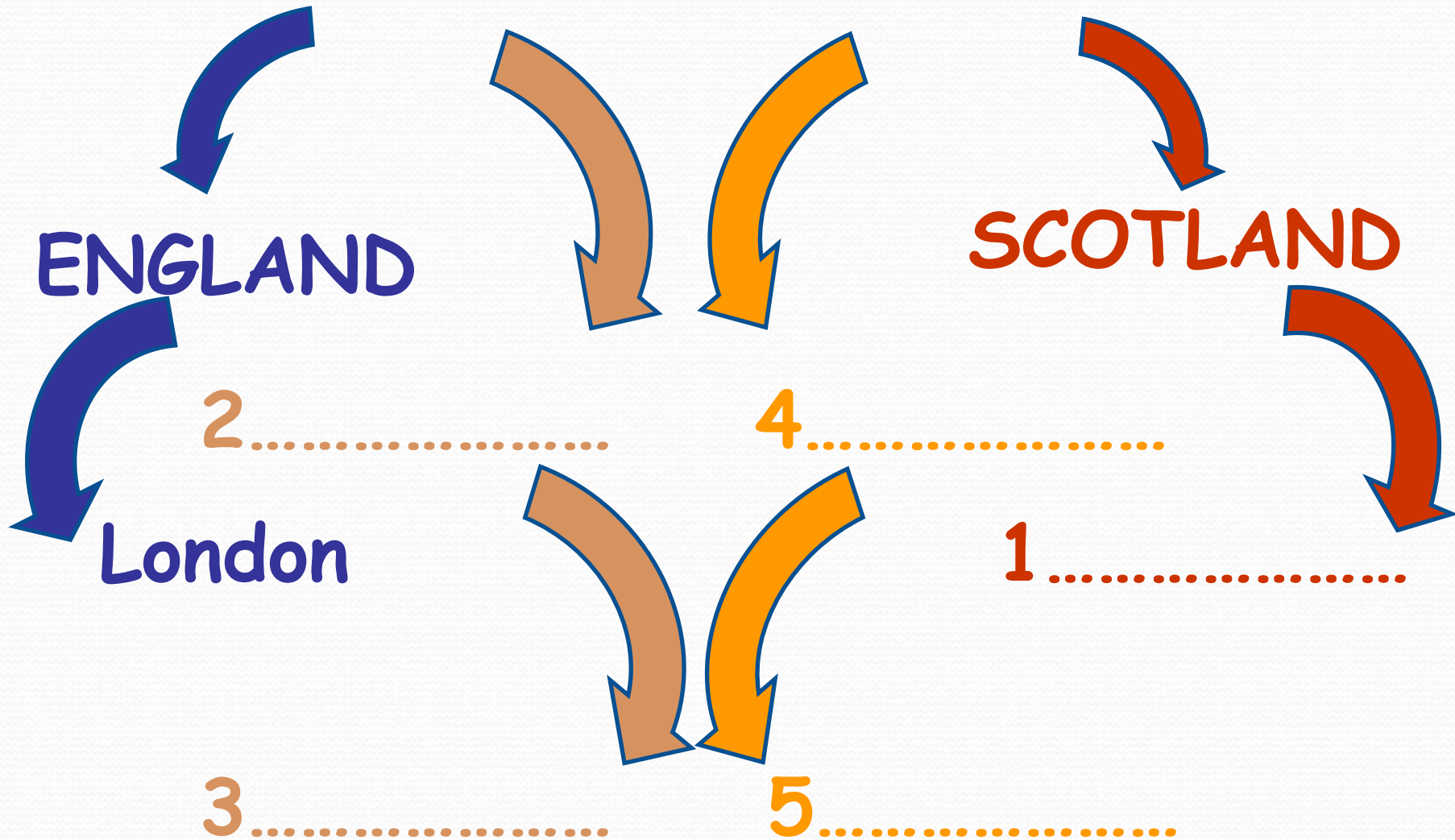
