# New Year

**HALLOWEEN**

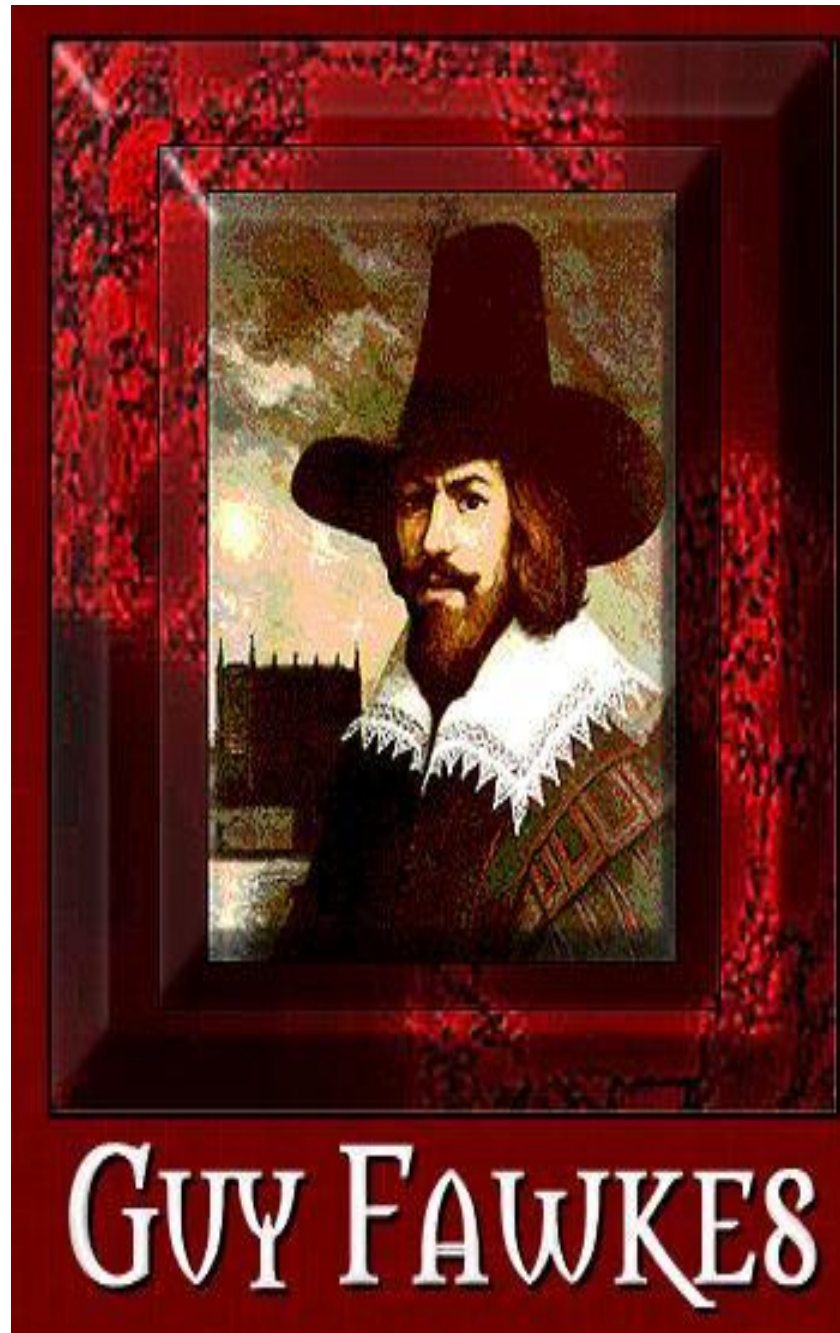
