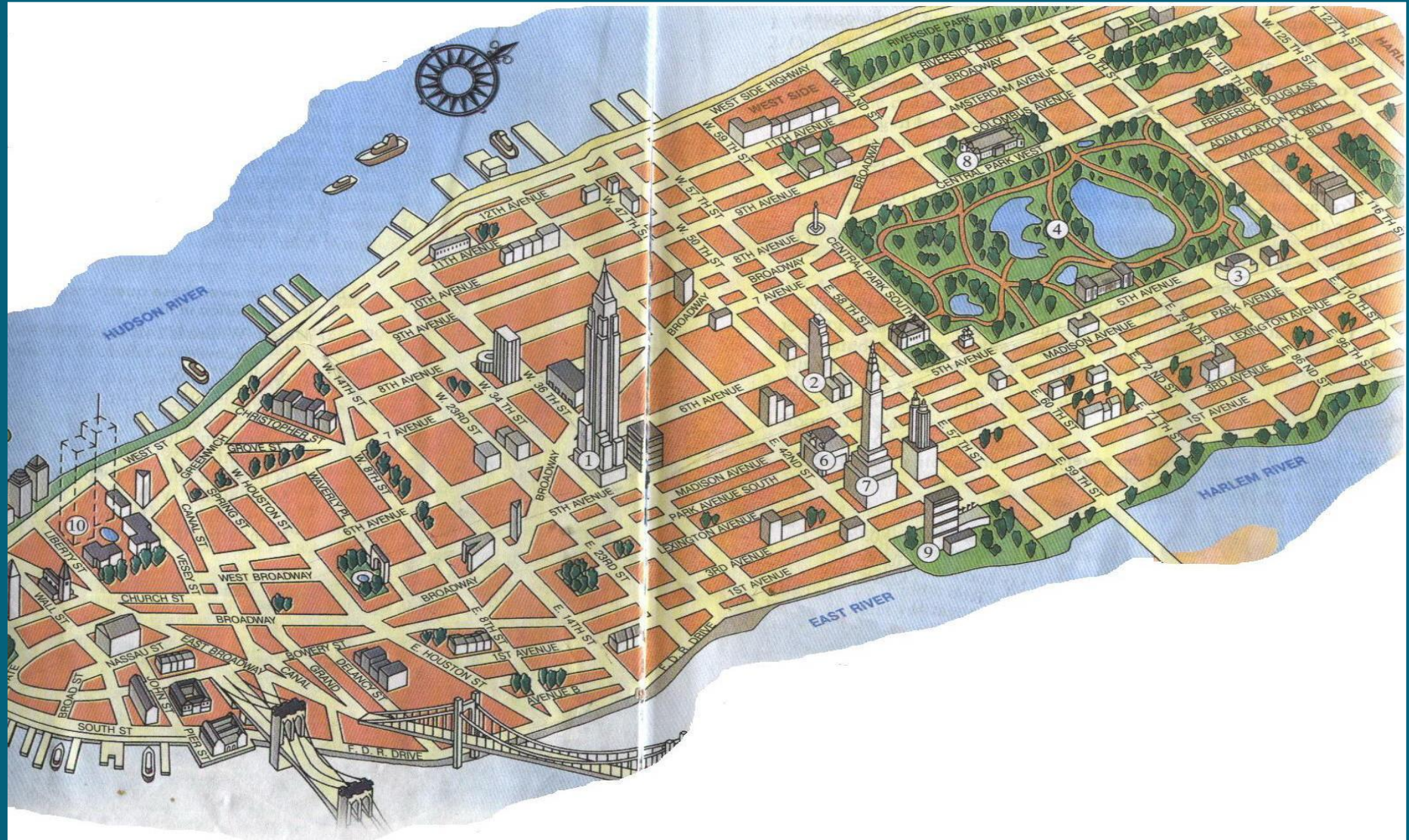

STREETS AND AVENUES



Writing and reading dates

- **In BrE** they write "2 July / 2nd July / July 2". They say the "second of July" or "July the second".
In AmE they write "July 2nd / July 2". They say "July second".
Dates are sometimes written as numbers, for example, 3/10.
- **In BrE** this means the third of October.
- **In AmE** it means the tenth of March.

It's difficult to get lost in New York. It has a very clever system of streets and avenues. Streets run east to west across the island and are often called cross-streets, while avenues run north to south down the island.

The story of Manhattan Avenue really starts a block away, at the corner of 105th Street and Central Park West. This great building was the New York Cancer Hospital, built in 1884. It's the predecessor of Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center.
