Charlotte Brontë

Charlotte was born in Yorkshire, England. After her mother's death in 1821, she was sent away to the school by her aunt. The poor conditions there affected her health badly. After finishing school, Charlotte first worked as a teacher and as a governess for various families in Yorkshire.
