Captain James Cook

7 November 1728-14 February 1779

- He was a British explorer, navigator and cartographer who ultimately rose to the rank of captain Royal Navy. Cook made detailed maps of Newfoundland and prior to making three voyages to the Pacific Ocean, during which he achieved the first European contact with the eastern coastline of Australia and New Zealand

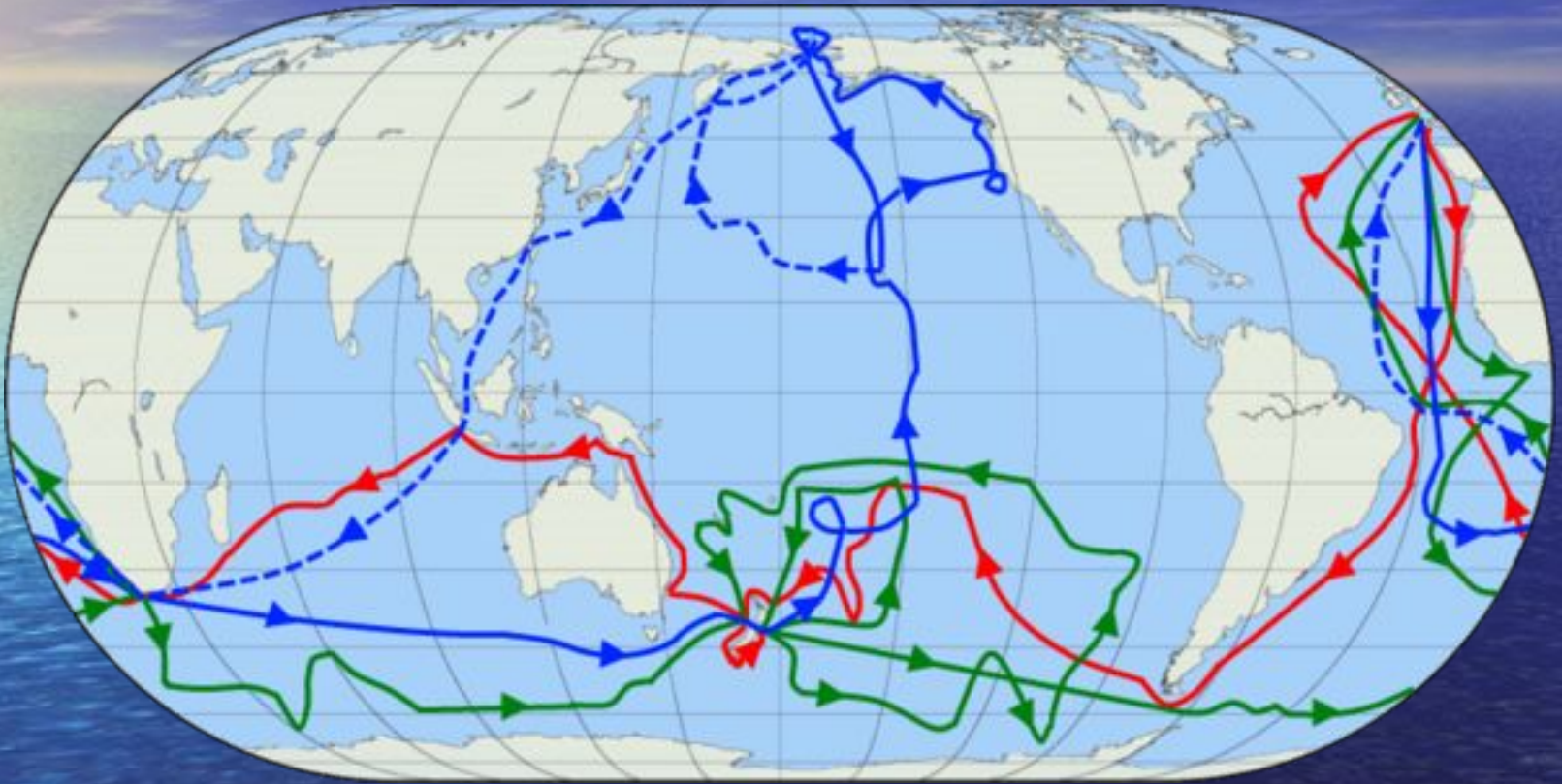
