CHARLES DARWIN




• (12 February 1809 – 19 April 1882) was an English naturalist , geologist and biologist, best known for his contributions to the science of evolution.

AGATHA CHRISTIE





JOHN LENNON



(9 October 1940 – 8 December 1980) was an English singer, songwriter, and peace activist who co-founded the Beatles, the most commercially successful band in the history of popular music. He and fellow member Paul McCartney formed a much-celebrated songwriting partnership. Along with George Harrison and Ringo Starr, the group would ascend to worldwide fame during the 1960s.
