

Los Angeles



Los Angeles is a city in the USA in the South of California, located on the shore of the Pacific ocean. The largest population in the state and the second — in the country. The city is the administrative center of the district of the same name, as well as the center of Greater Los Angeles-agglomeration with a population of over 17 million people. Residents of Los Angeles are the Seat.



Los Angeles covers a very diverse geographical area. It is mostly a deserted area surrounded by the San Gabriel mountain range and divided by the Santa Monica mountains. Los Angeles County has 81 miles of coastline. There are rivers such as the Los Angeles river, Rio de Janeiro Ondo river, San Gabriel river and Ventura.



The climate of Los Angeles, as well as the climate of southern California, is often described as "perfect" and there are serious reasons for this. Mainly Sunny and warm here, in summer gentle ocean breezes blow. Humidity is low, sometimes there are small rains. In fact, in Los Angeles there are no unpleasant seasons.

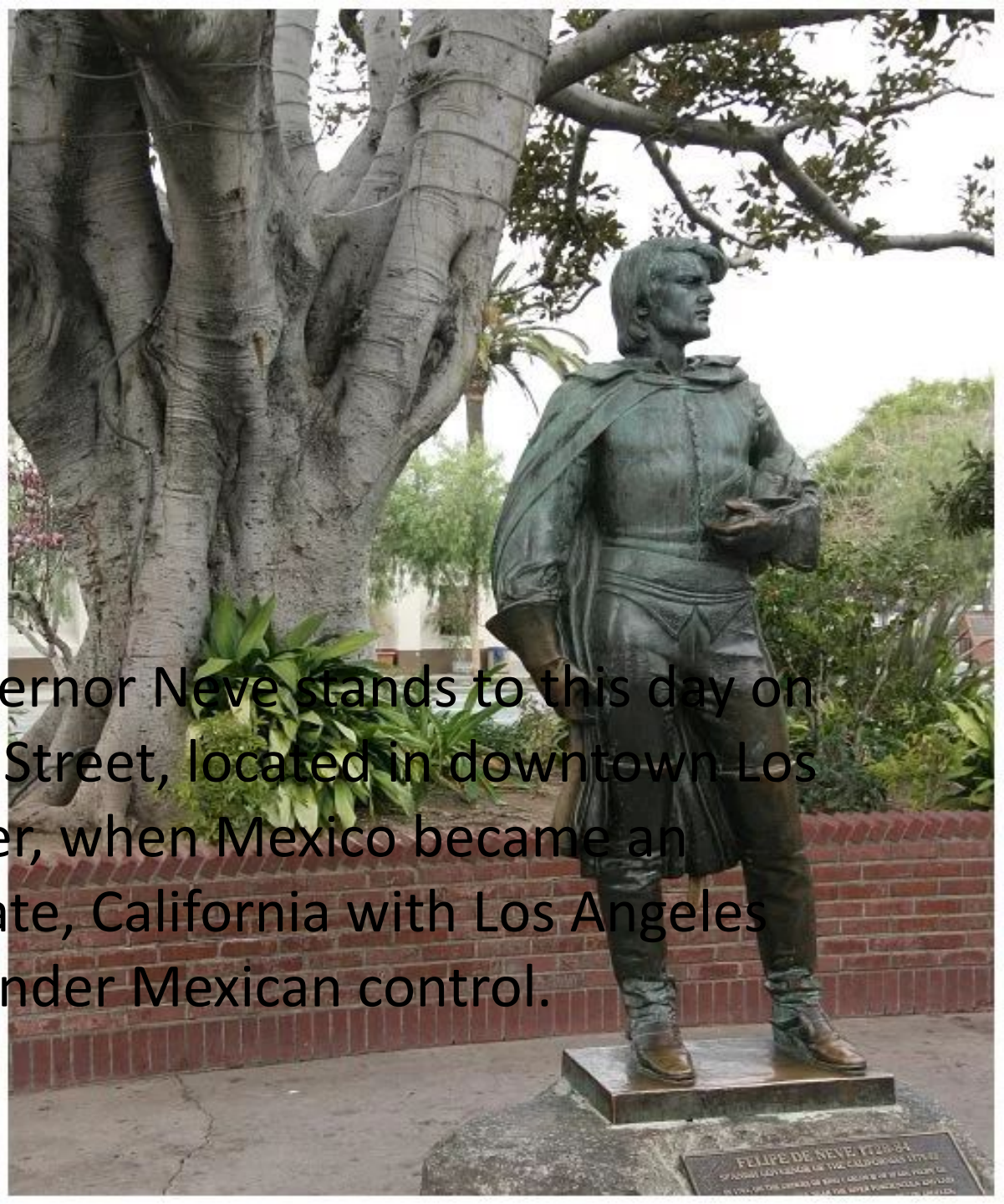



The name Los Angeles in Spanish means "the angels". At the end of the 18th century, Felipe Neve, Spanish Governor of California, saw the need to establish a settlement on the Los Angeles river. The settlement served to reaffirm the claims of Spain in the territory in the face of Russian incursions in the North and England from the sea. The settlement would also help to support Spanish California with military garrisons, supplies and provisions. Los Angeles was officially founded by Governor Felipe Neve on September 4, 1781.





The statue of Governor Neve stands to this day on the area of Oliver Street, located in downtown Los Angeles. Later, when Mexico became an independent state, California with Los Angeles came under Mexican control.

In August 1846, American soldiers entered Los Angeles and the star-spangled banner flying over the city since January 1847. In February 1848, the Guadalupe Hidalgo Agreement was signed and the Mexican-American war was completed. California was inferior to the United States. The first police unit was established in 1851.



Los Angeles is the capital of the entertainment world, a cultural center that has more than 300 museums and heavenly weather.

It is the only city in the world to host the Summer Olympics twice. Downtown Los Angeles is the largest government center, excluding the city of Washington, DC.



Los Angeles has the world's only wooden lighthouse, it is located in Fermin Park, San Pedro. Los Angeles has the largest historical theatre district, located in the Central part of town on Broadway.



The population of Los Angeles is about four million people. Los Angeles is the second largest city after New York City. In Los Angeles, people live in approximately 140 countries, speaking approximately 86 different languages and currently call Los Angeles home.
