Trafalgar Square

- Trafalgar Square is the central square of London.
- It is a historical reminder of the great naval admiral Lord Nelson.
- Today the square is famous for its flocks of pigeons and is used as a meeting place for rallies.



Westminster Palace and Big Ben

- Westminster is the political center of London. It is one of the world's famous buildings.
- It houses the British Parliament and is often called the Houses of Parliament.

The entire structure is 135 m tall and the wheel has a diameter of 120 m. It is the most popular paid tourist attraction in the United Kingdom, visited by over 3.5 million people annually.
