The Tower of London

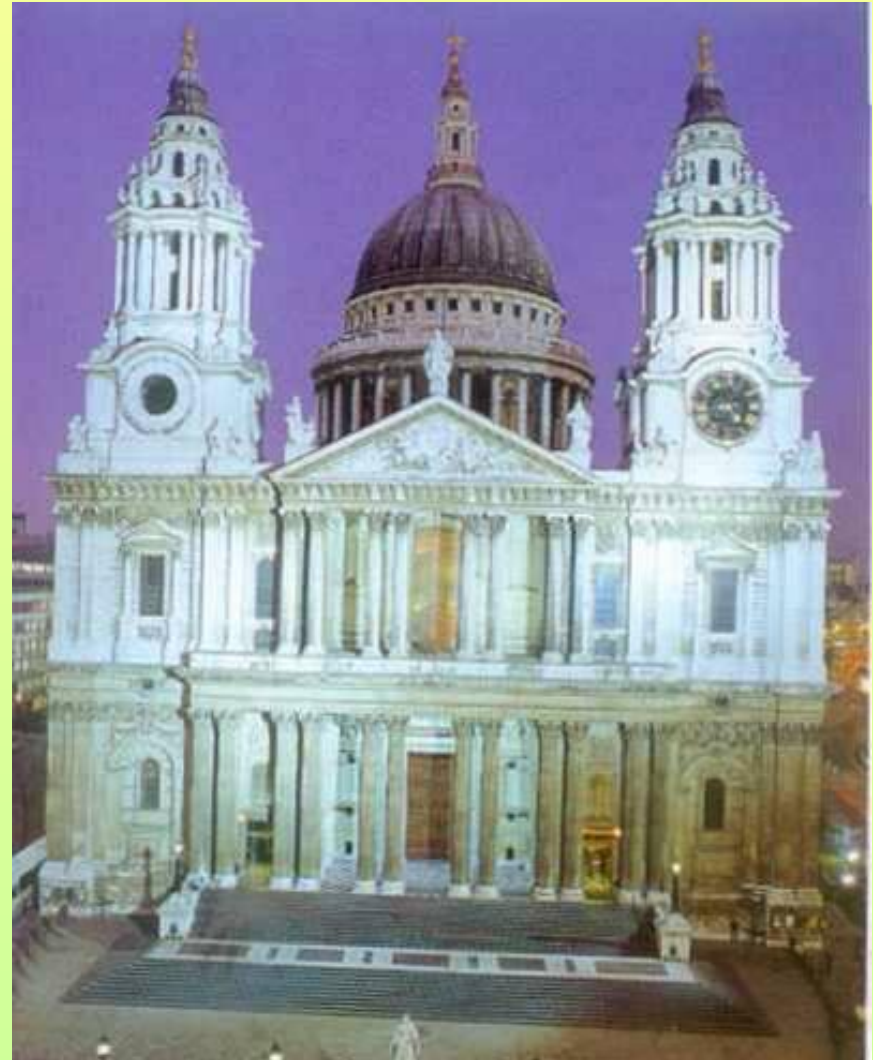

St. Paul's Cathedral

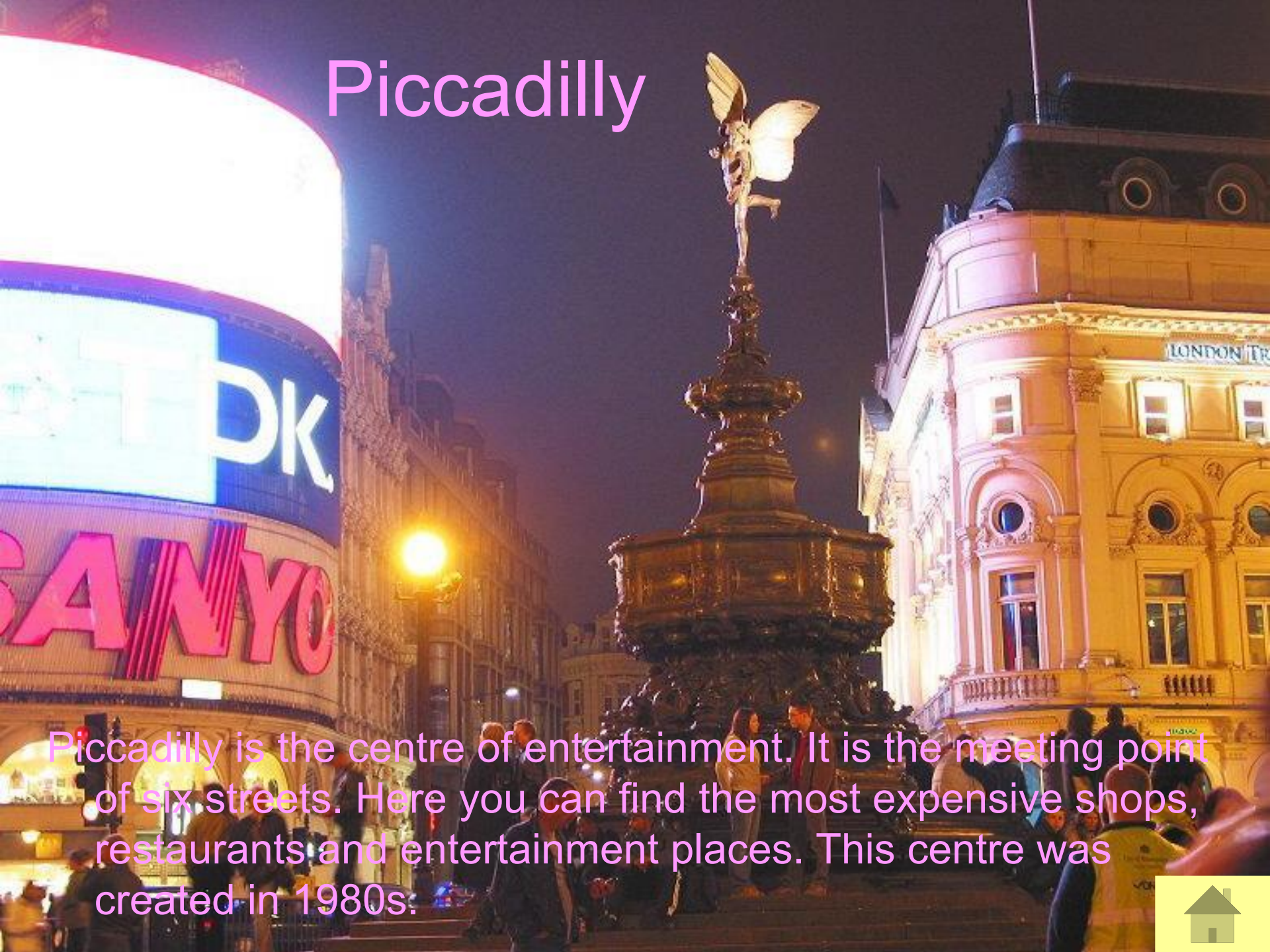
- St. Paul's Cathedral is a famous building too.

- All English kings have been crowned and buried in the church since 1308.

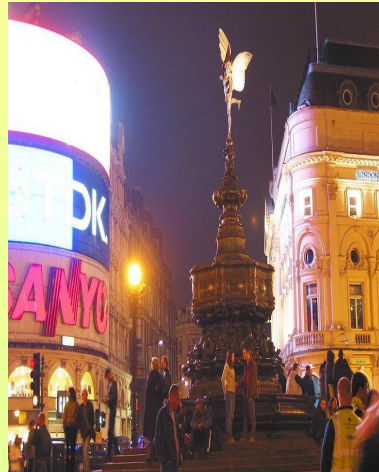

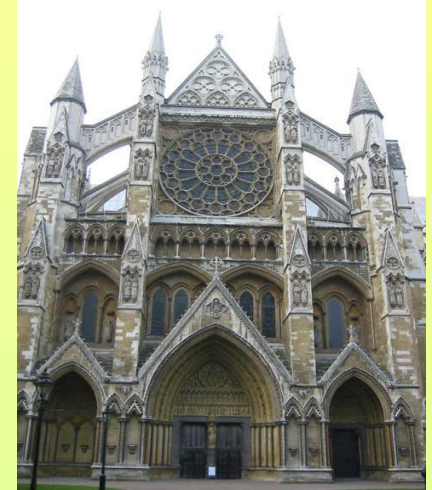
