

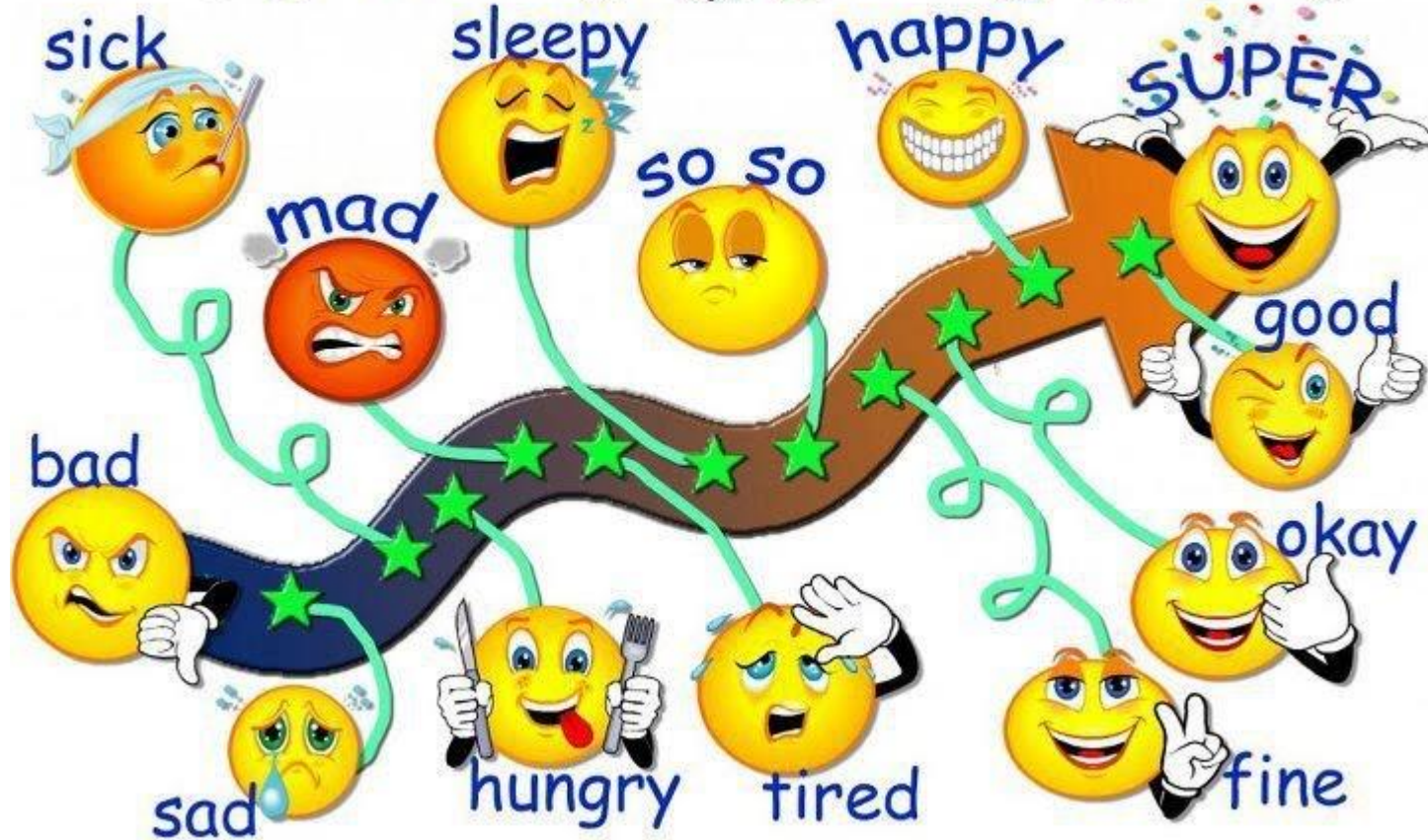

SHOULD

(«СЛЕДУЕТ»)

Употребляется, когда мы хотим дать совет или порекомендовать кому-то делать или не делать что-либо.

You **should** go and see this film. It's interesting.

You **should** help your parents.

SHOULDN'T (= SHOULD NOT)

(«НЕ СЛЕДУЕТ»)

You **shouldn't** be selfish and greedy.

You **shouldn't** wear jeans to school.

If you want to be healthy, you **shouldn't** eat fast food













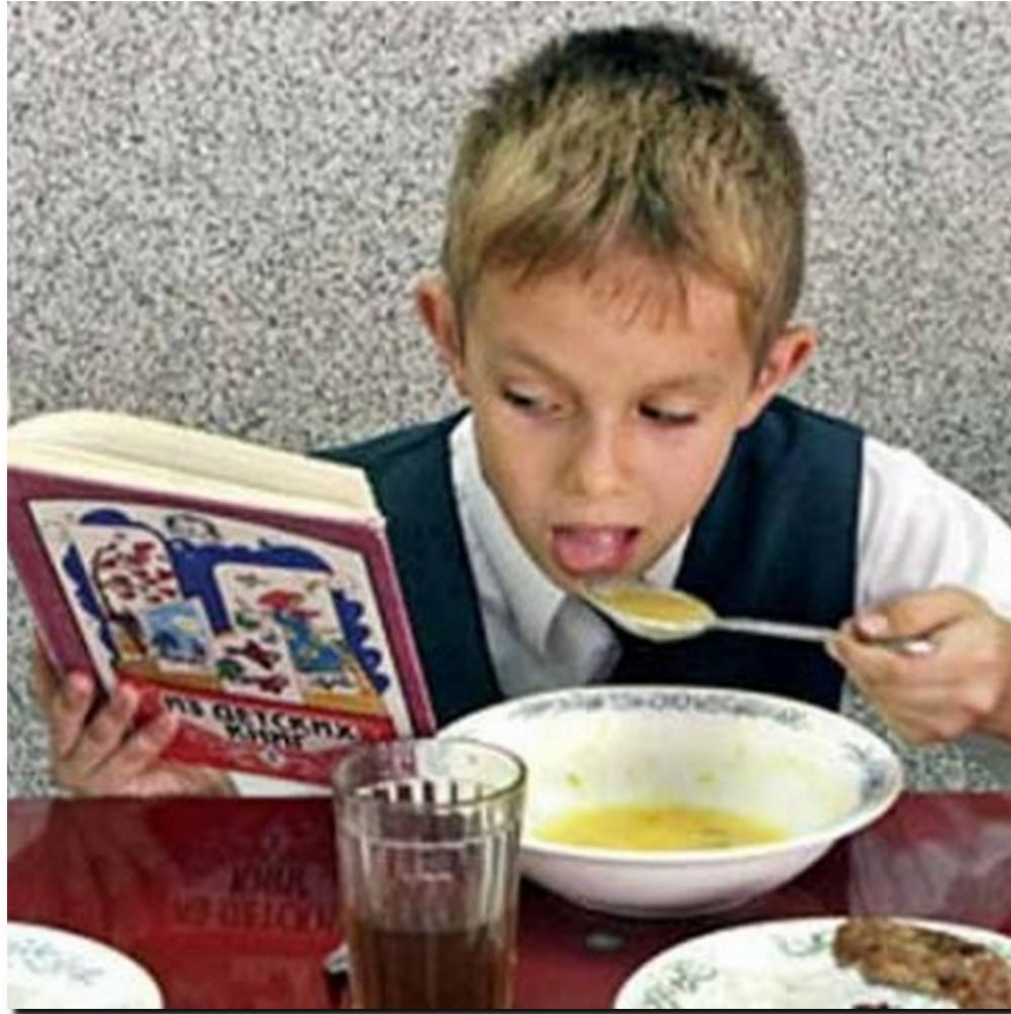
