Односложные прилагательные ,
состоящие из одного краткого слога,
образуют степени сравнения при помощи
суффиксов **-er** ,
(the) -est .При этом конечная согласная
удваивается.

Положительная степень	Сравнительная степень	Превосходная степень
hot	hotter	the hottest
big	bigger	the biggest



Односложные прилагательные с долгим слогом образуют степени сравнения при помощи суффиксов **-er** , **(the) -est** .

При прибавлении суффиксов конечная **-e** опускается.

Положительная степень	Сравнительная степень	Превосходная степень
cold	colder	the coldest
nice	nicer	the nicest





Двусложные прилагательные ,оканчивающиеся на **-ow,**
-er,-y,-ble,

образуют степени сравнения при помощи суффиксов **-er ,**
(the) -est .При этом буква **-y** меняется на **i** после **согласной**
и не меняется после **гласной**

narrow	narrower	the narrowest
able	abler	the ablest
busy	busier	the busiest
gay	gay ^r	the gay ^{est}
