

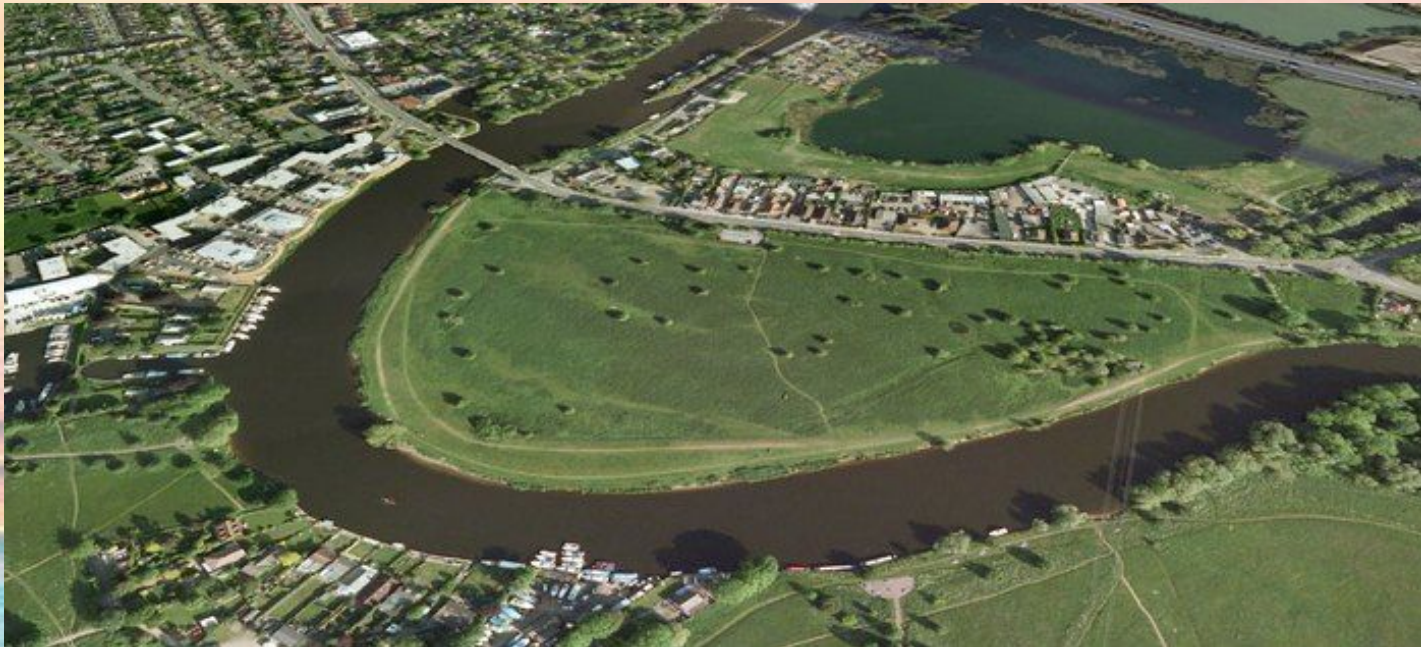
# ***The Thames***

***In the past , there were very few roads in England, so Thames served as a link between London and many parts of the country.***




***In wartime , London was protected from naval attacks because castles and fortresses were built at the mouth of the river .***

***It is along this river that most of London's attractions are concentrated. On one of the banks you can see the famous “London Eye”, while on the other there is Big Ben and the Houses of Parliament.***





***It is interesting that the Thames is a tidal river. Its a fun feature is that the direction and level of water can be changed twice a day. When casting the water runs the usual way-towards the sea, and during the tide Thames becomes more full-flowing and water it comes in the opposite direction, from the sea. Some of the quays for this reason, sometimes completely go under water, so it is better to specify just in case, when the next tide is expected before the walk.***
