- Give information about events happening in London
- Express political opinions

- **Local**

- Give information about films, concerts and other things happening in the local area
- Free local papers contain a lot of advertisements and some news



- Daily
- Published on every day of the week except Sunday

- Sunday
- All Sunday newspapers are national
- They are larger than daily ones and have 2 or 3 sections



- Quality papers

- Large size
- Have many detailed articles about national and international events

- Tabloids

- Smaller in size
- Have more pictures and shorter articles about less important events or about lives of well-known people
