is 318 feet high.





We start our bus tour from Trafalgar Square. It is the main Square in

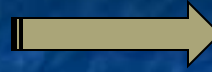

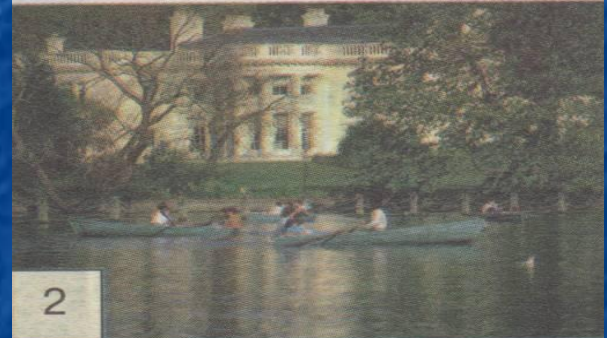

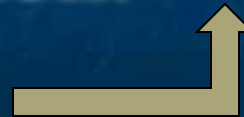
1. St Jame`s Park

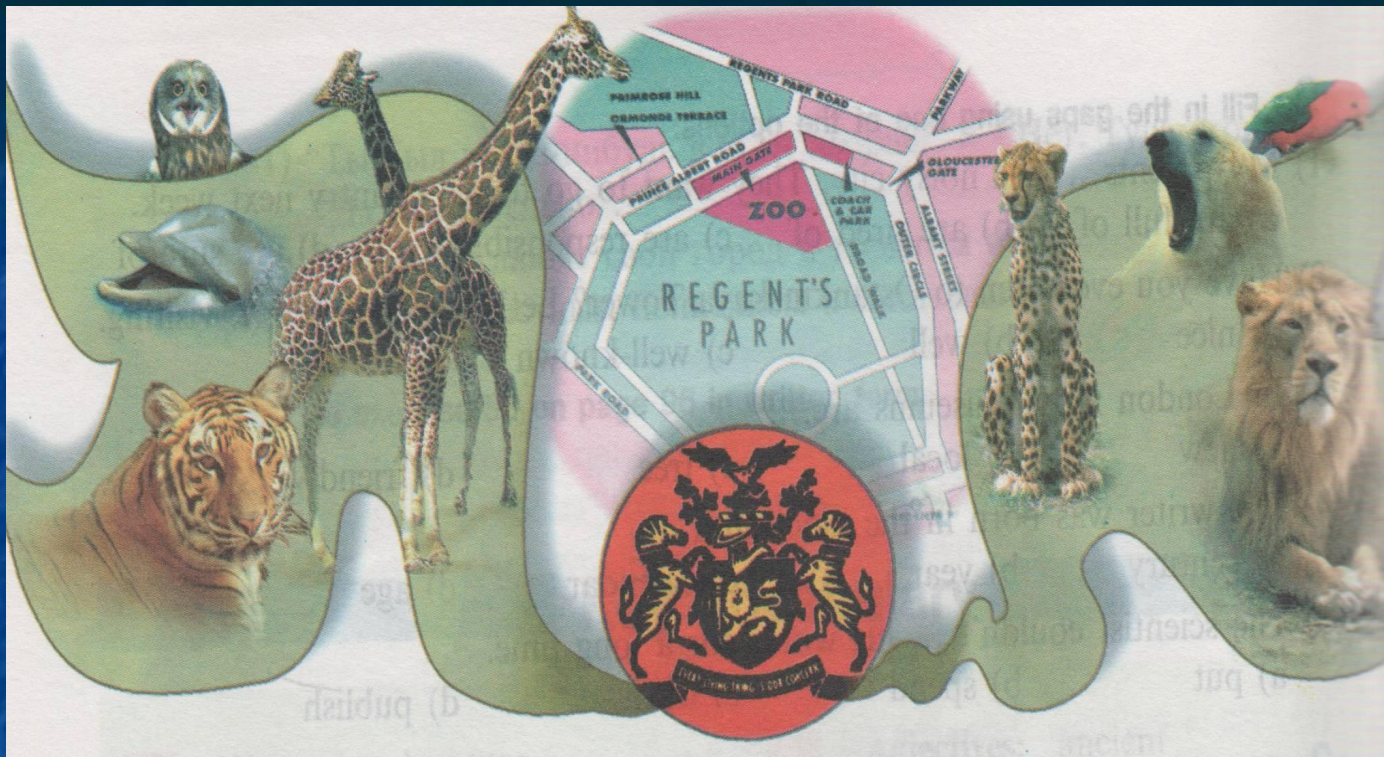


2. Regent`s Park

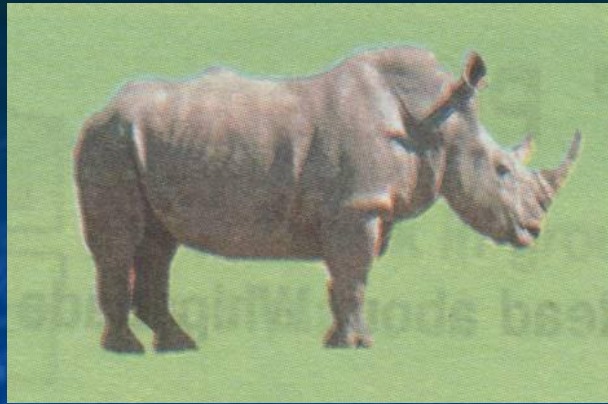




There are more than 8,000 animals at the Zoo.

In Regent's Park there is London Zoo.

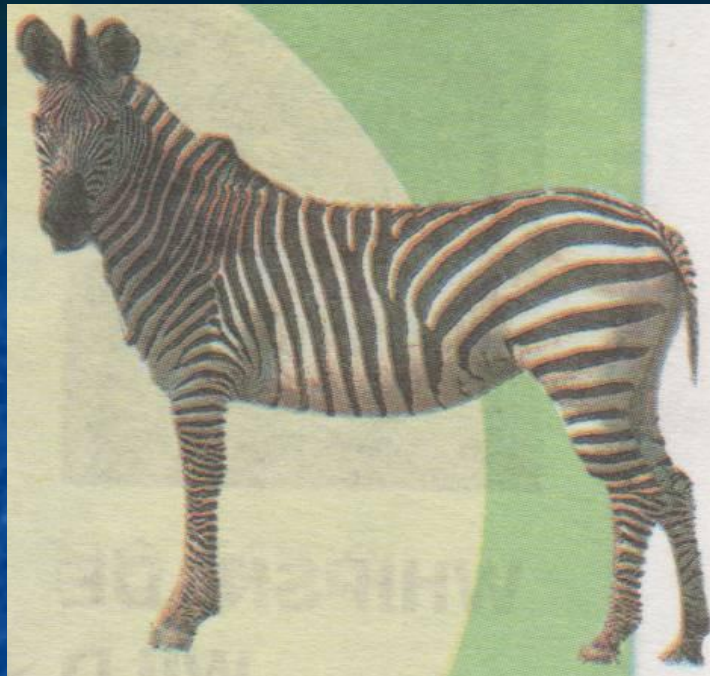

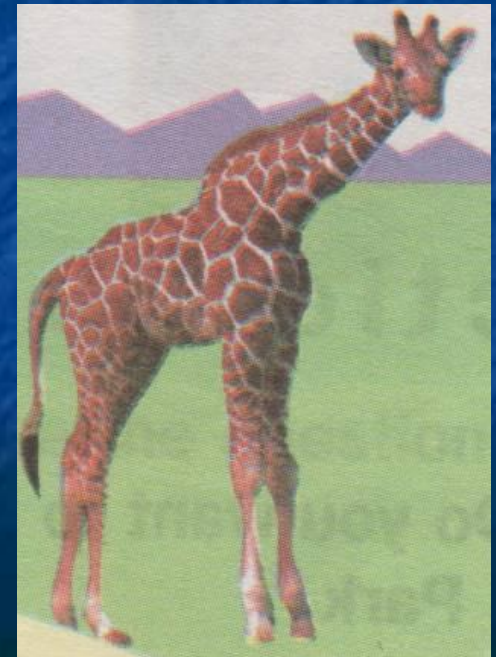

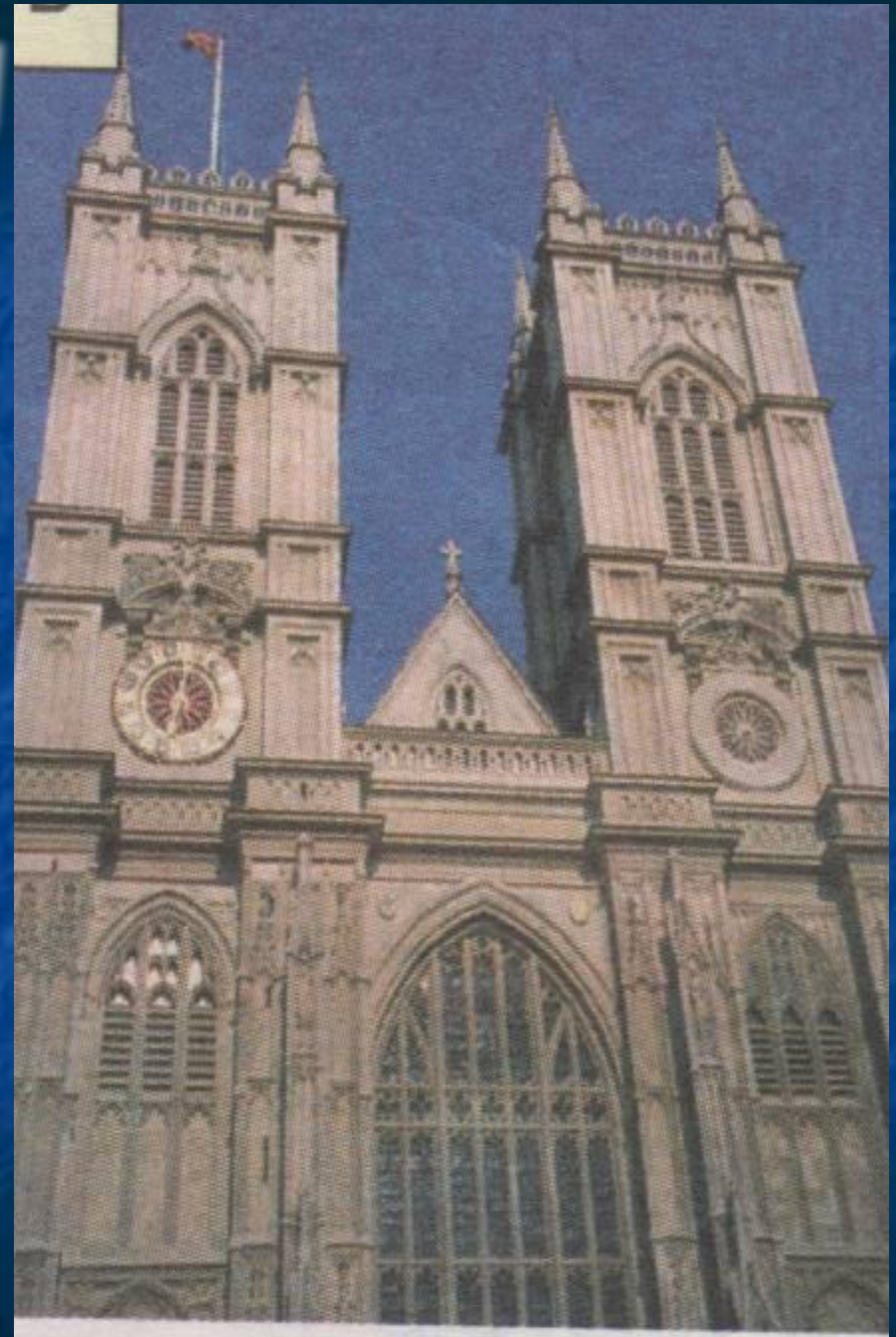
Westminster Abbey
