

fine - finer – the finest short – shorter – the shortest pretty – prettier – the prettiest thin – thinner – the thinnest clever – cleverer – the cleverest long – longer – the longest lazy – lazier – the laziest mad – madder – the maddest high – higher – the highest red – redder – the reddest new – newer – the newest hot – hotter – the hottest bright – brighter – the brightest

We Use Way 1 with:

1. <u>"Short", one-syllable adjectives:</u>

new – newer – the newest

2. <u>Two-syllable adjectives</u>, ending in e, er, y, ow :

narrow – narrower – the narrowest

3. Exceptions:

common – commoner – the commonest quiet – quieter – the quietest



NB!

Adverbs with the ending– ly, form comparatives according to Way 2, <u>exception</u> –the word early.




