The Hermitage Winter Palace

- * This building was from the first a planned, royal foundation, chartered in 1591 by Queen Elizabeth I of England. The buildings were made of thin red Dutch brick, with probably a good deal of woodwork inserted. They were two stories high, the roofs being punctuated by large dormer windows formed for leaden sashes. On the east and west sides of the square were students' chambers. On the south side, which lay between the present Library and the center of the Examination Hall, the Fellows and probably some students resided. The Provost's lodgings were probably in the south-west corner.

Trinity College Dublin

- * The name of the building of the Ministry of defense – derives from the Greek . This building is shaped like a regular building and is considered the largest office building in the world. It has seven floors, two of which are underground. The length of each edge is equal to 280 m, and the total perimeter of almost 1.4 km of the Total area of all premises is 604 thousand m², the length of all corridors is 28 km away.

Pokrova na Nerli



- * William invited [Gundulf, Bishop of Rochester](#), to design this building on the banks of the Thames, within the south-east angle of an old Roman town wall. Described as “very competent and skillful at building in stone,” Gundulf also supervised the construction of the building, which began in 1078. Finally, [Edward I](#) (1272-1307) carried out extensive work on it, including the moat surrounding the castle, Traitor’s Gate, the new river gate through St. Thomas’s Tower, where prisoners came by boat before being tried at Westminster.

Dunvegan castle



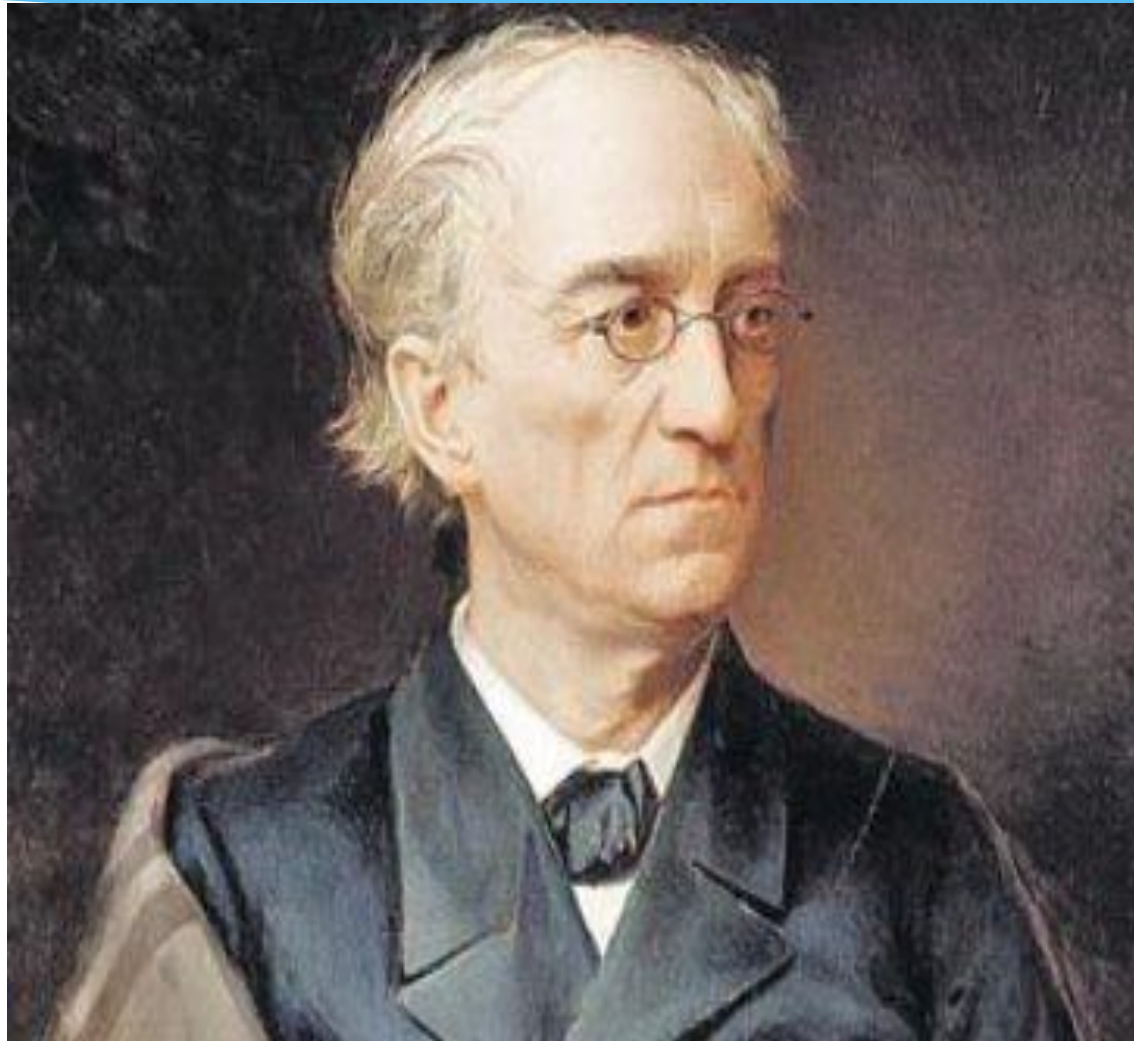
-
