



STAGES OF HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

Ancient Society, in it the three stages of cultural anthropology were further classified into 7 stages, which are as follows:

Lower Savagery

From the earliest forms of humanity subsisting on fruits and nuts

Middle Savagery

Began with the discovery of fishing technology and the use of fire

Upper Savagery

Began with the invention of bow and arrow

Lower Barbarism

Began with the art of pottery making

Middle Barbarism

Began with the domestication of plants and animals in the old world and irrigation/cultivation in the new world

Upper Barbarism

Began with the smelting of iron and the use of iron tools

Civilization

Began with the invention of the phonetic alphabet and writing

CIVILIZATION DIFFERENCES EAST AND WEST

There are significant differences between Eastern and Western cultures:

- the social structures
- attitudes of individuals and groups
- philosophies

Some of the main differences are summarized in the table below:

Sense of interdependence (group)	Strong	Weak
Attitude and focus	Holistic	Analytical and detailed
Life control	The world is complex and we have poor control over events.	The world operates by rules and can be analyzed and controlled

Visual attention	Background	Foreground
