The name Canada is believed to come from the Indian word Kanata,

meaning "village" or "community". This fact alone shows that the native population of the country consisted mostly of Indian tribes.



Geographical position



Canada is the second largest country in the world after Russia

with the longest coast line

- It occupies the northern part of North America and a number of islands.
- Its total area is about 10 million km2.
- It stretches from the Great Lakes in the south to the Arctic Circle in the north.

 Canada is washed by three oceans: the Atlantic, the Pacific and the Arctic.

Geographical position



 It consists of ten provinces and three territories.

- About35 million
- people live in Canada.
- About 80% of the population live within 320 km of the southern border.
- Much of the rest of Canada is uninhabited (безлюдный) or thinly populated
 - because of severe natural conditions.



 Native people – American Indians and Eskimos – make up about 2% of the country's population.
 77% of Canada's people live in cites or towns.







Canada's people are varied. About 57% of all Canadians have some English ancestry (происхождение) and about 32% have some French ancestry.

- Canada is a country of immigrants.
- The Global Canada's reputation is a highly developed, peaceful and free of ethnic conflicts country, where the children can grow up in a peaceful environment.



The official languages



There are two official languages in Canada – **English and French.** English spoken in Canada is a bit different from British English: there are some pronunciation and grammatical differences.

Canada is a constitutional monarchy



Elizabeth II, the Queen of England, is also Canadian Queen. The Queen is the head of state, and is represented in Canada by the governor-general.





National symbols of Canada

The National Flag of Canada, also known as the Maple Leaf, is a red flag with a white square in its centre with a red maple leaf. The maple leaf is an important national symbol of Canada.



 The capital of Canada is Ottawa.


- It is located in the eastern part of the province of





 Canada is washed by three oceans, that is why the climate and its nature are much varied.





- The northern parts lie in the subarctic and arctic climatic zones. Most of the northern islands are covered with ice.
- This territory has a climate with very cold winters and short, cool summers.
- The average winter temperature is about 35 degrees below zero. The average summer temperature is about 4 degrees above zero.

- It contrasts with the rest of the territory, where the climate is moderate.
 - This part gets enough amount of rainfall and heat. In the south there are large areas of fertile (плодородная) soils.
- The west of the country has a mild and humid climate thanks to a warm Pacific current.



 The average winter temperature is about 4 degrees above zero there. The average summer temperature is 21 degrees above zero





 The climate of Canada is characterized by cold winters and mild summers with long days.



 Winters in Canada last from 4 to 5 months with heavy snowfalls.



 Summer temperatures can reach from 35°c till 40°c.


This place receives more than 12 million visitors a year. It is not only one waterfall; it's a collective name for three waterfalls at the border of Canada and the USA.



The largest one, called 'Horseshoe Falls' is located on Canadian side. That's why some people call it 'Canadian Falls'




Canada's Great Lakes

 It is very tasty and a lot of delicious products can be eaten with it.









Well-known people
