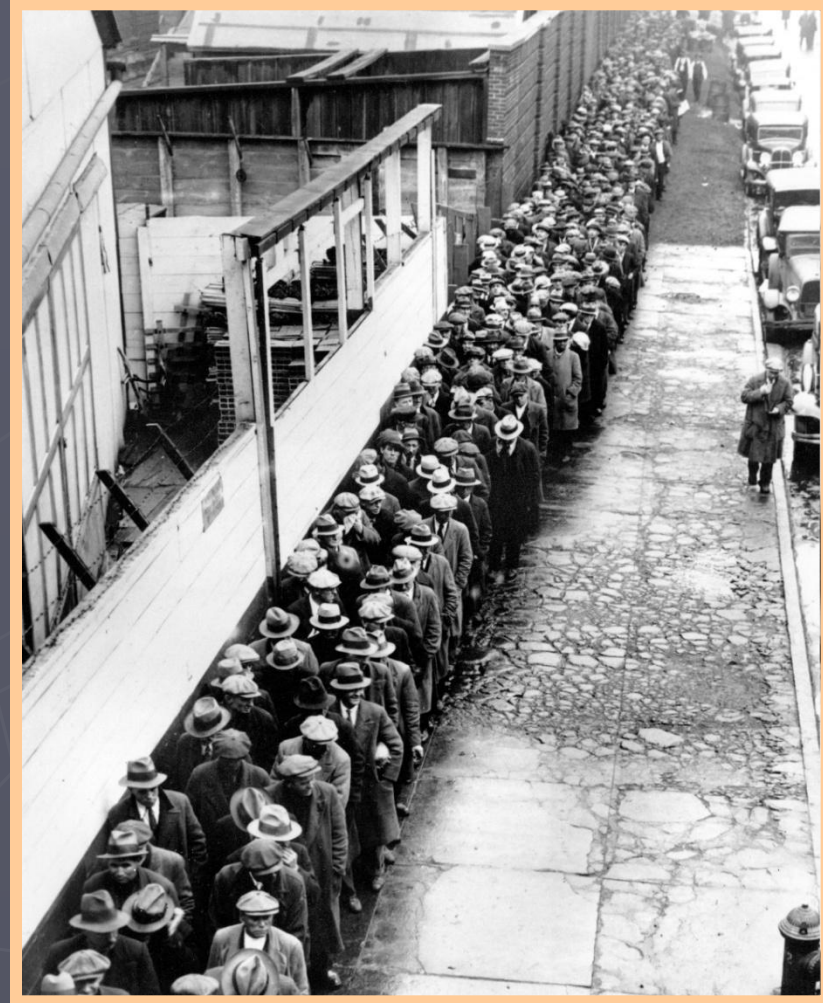
Oligarchic Capital

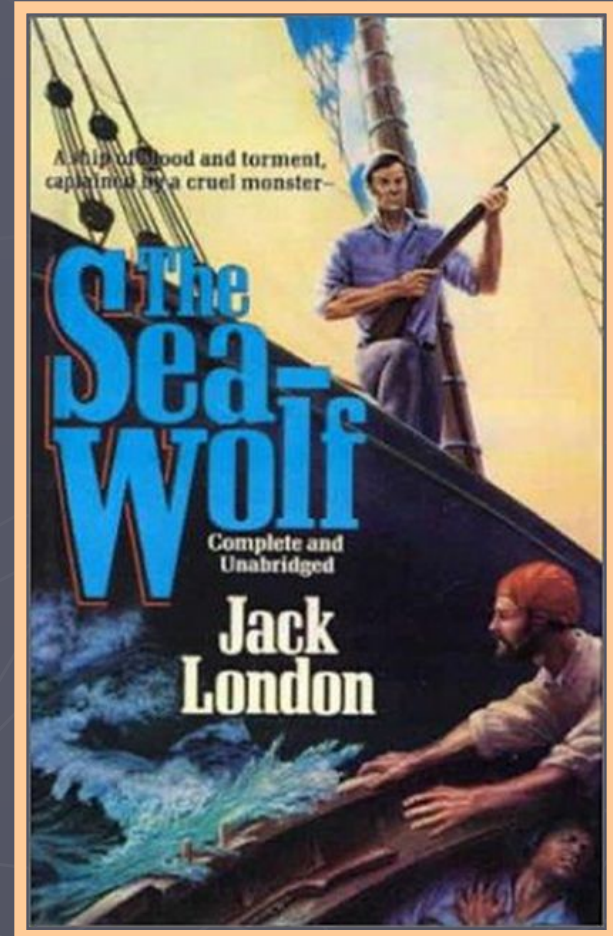


The Gold Rush. The Klondike region.

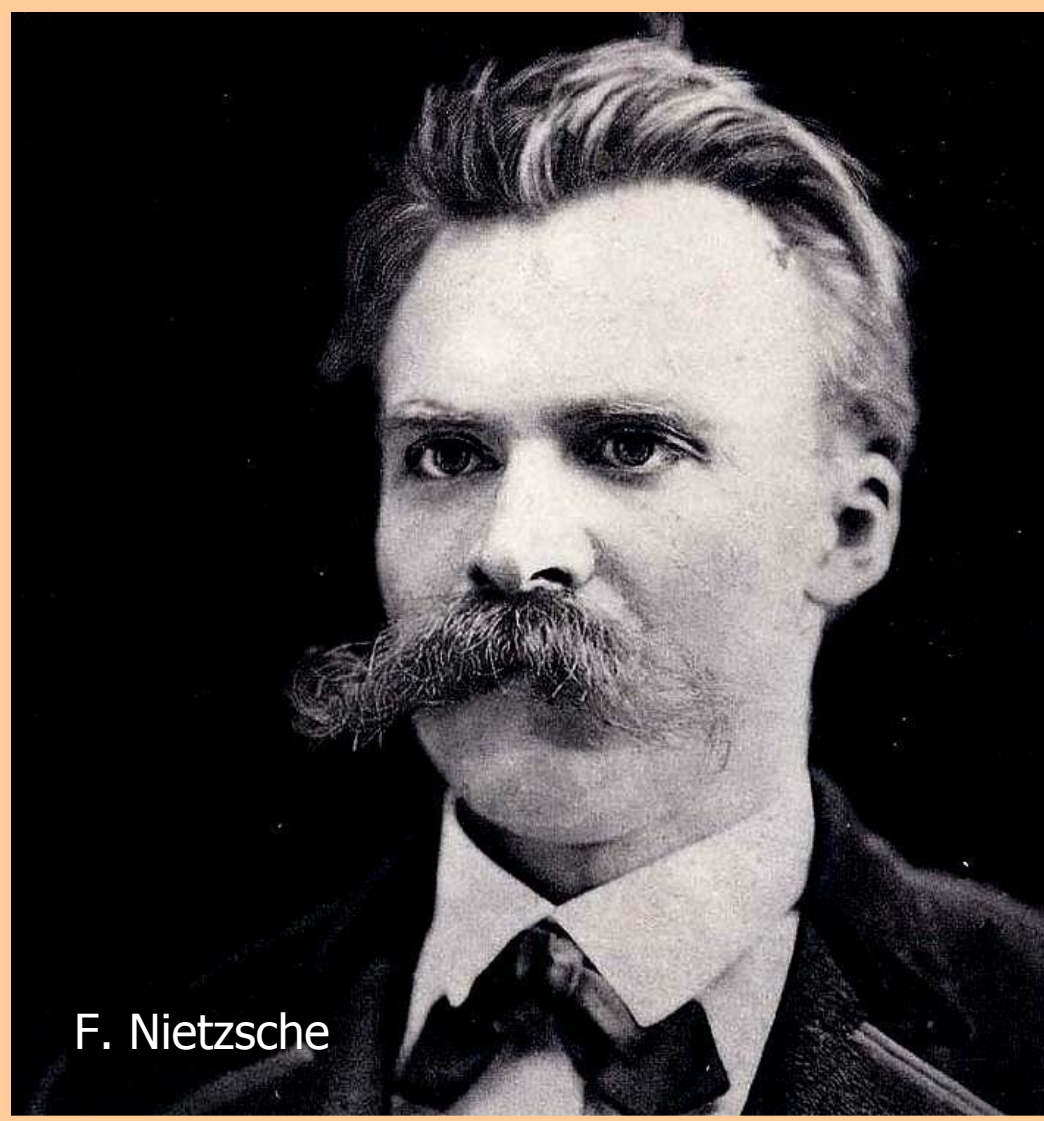


The march of the unemployed, 1894.

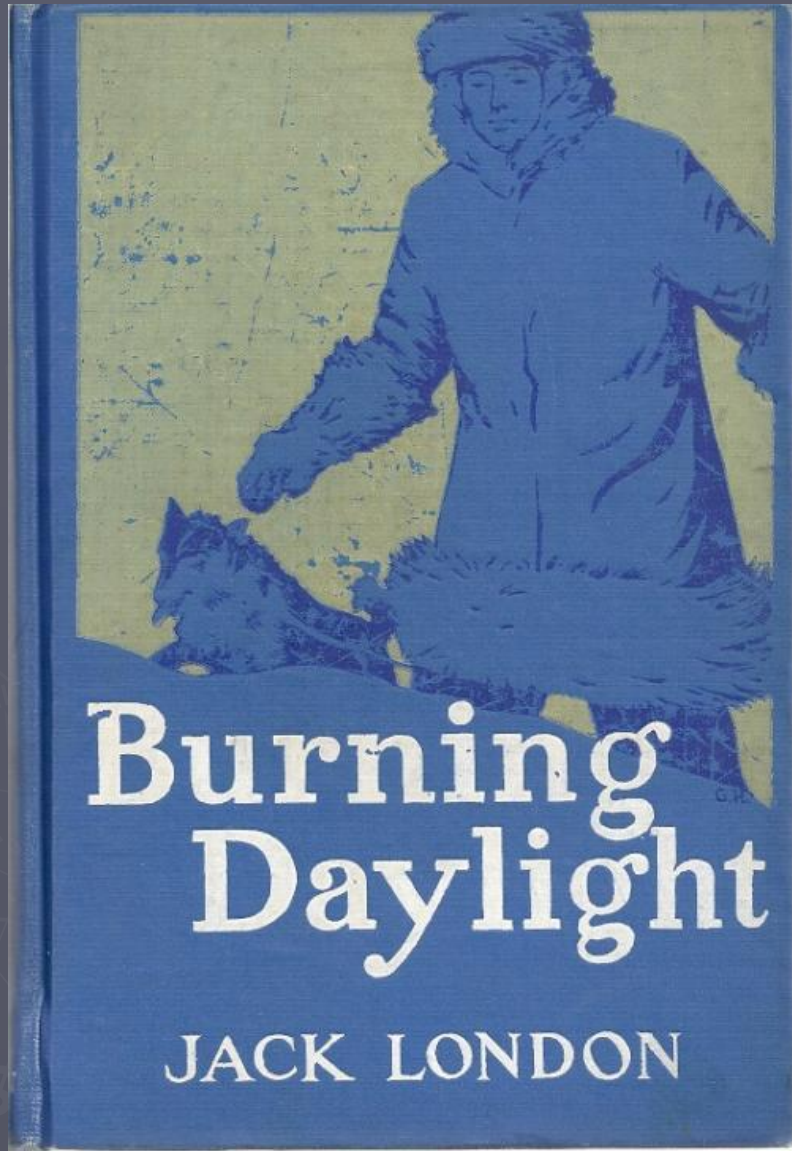

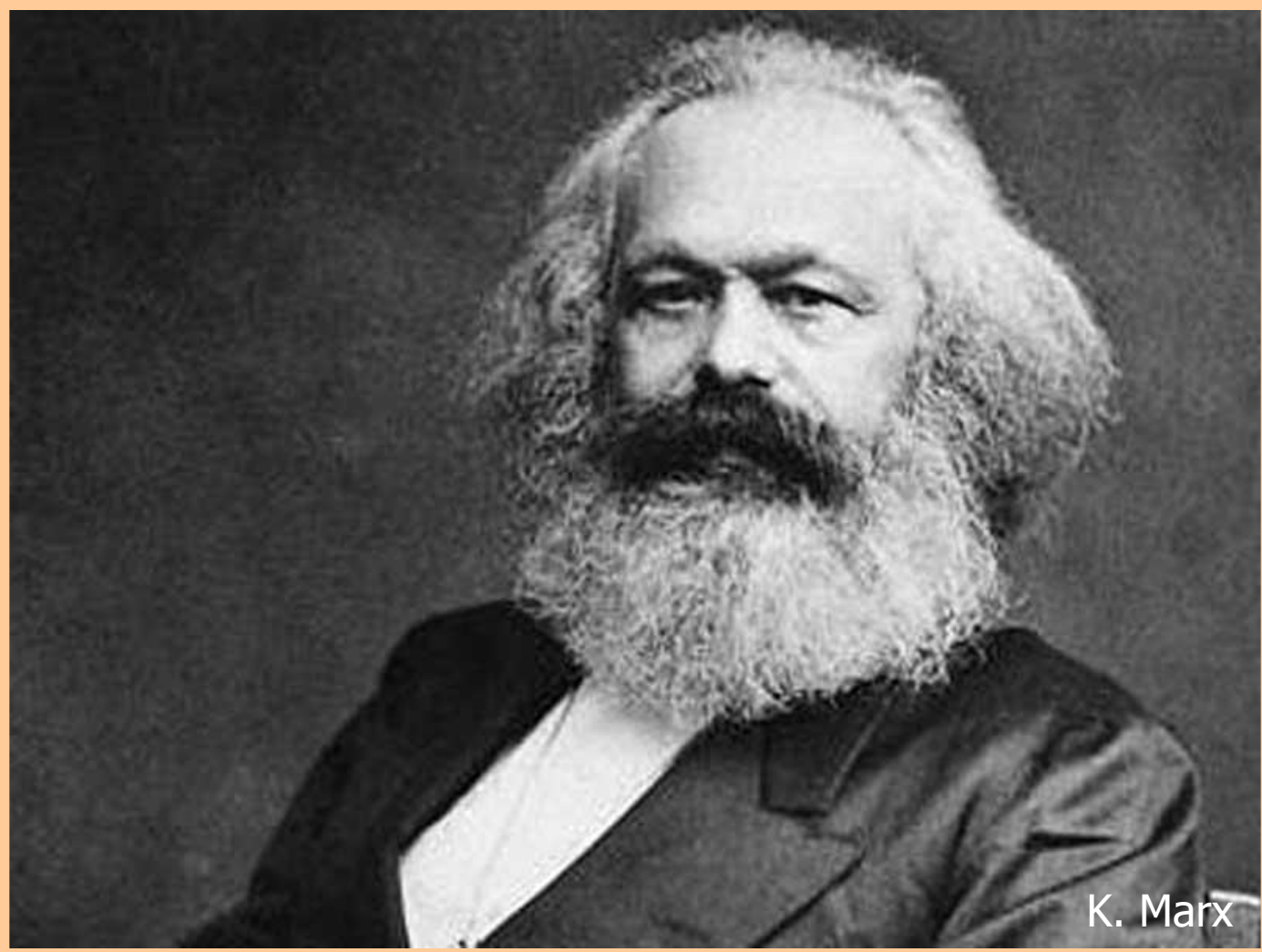

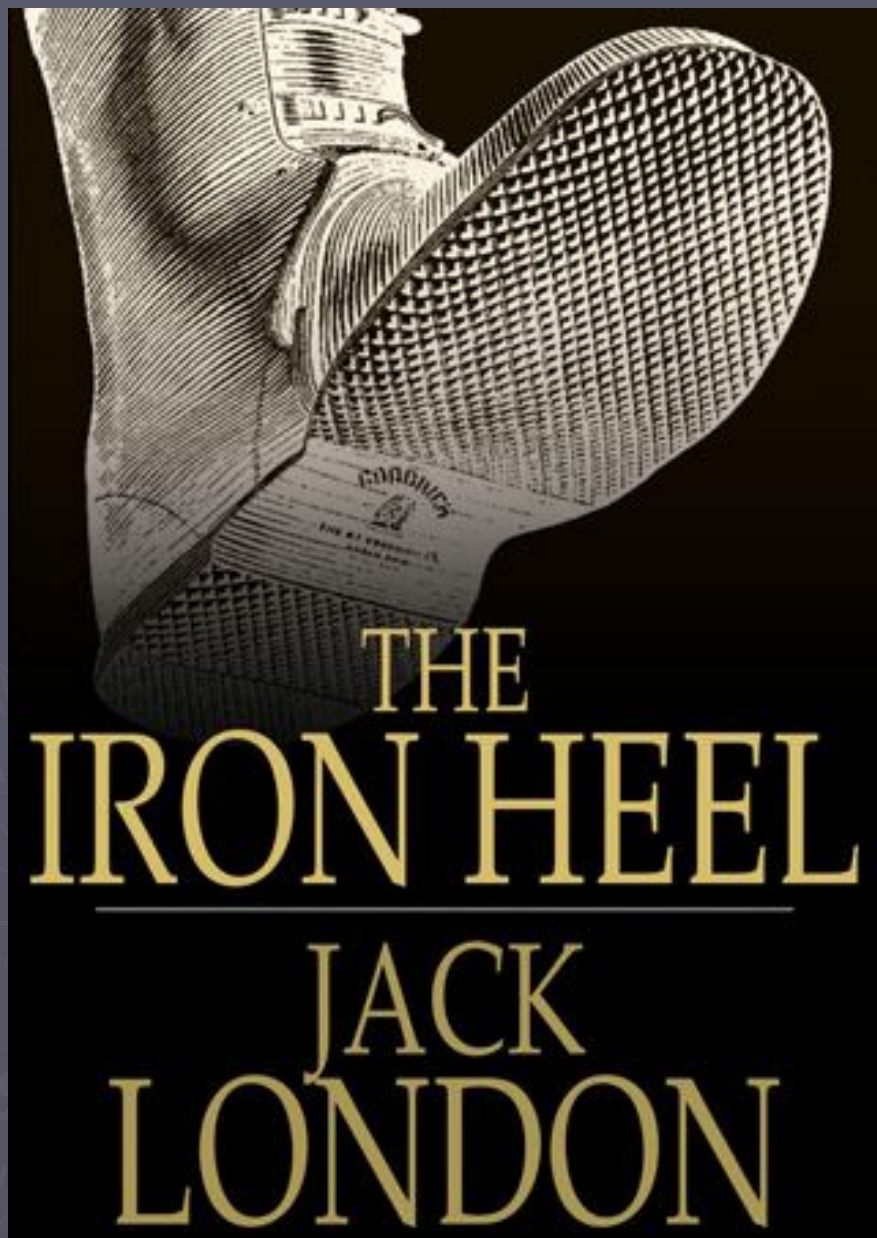

London's desire for a socialist revolution came to frustration in *The Iron Heel* (1908)

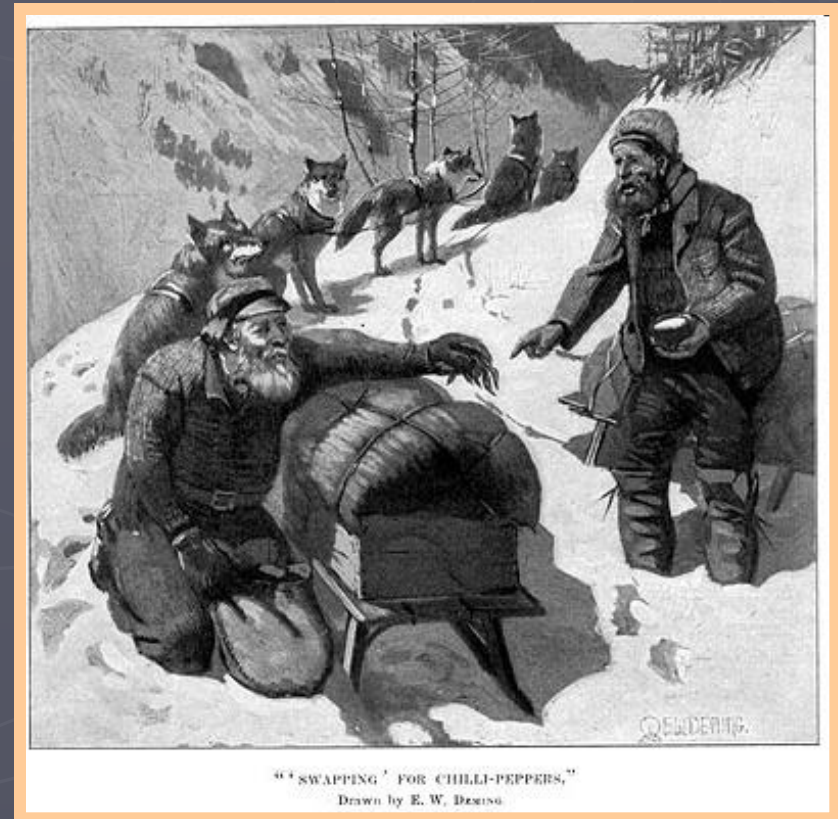
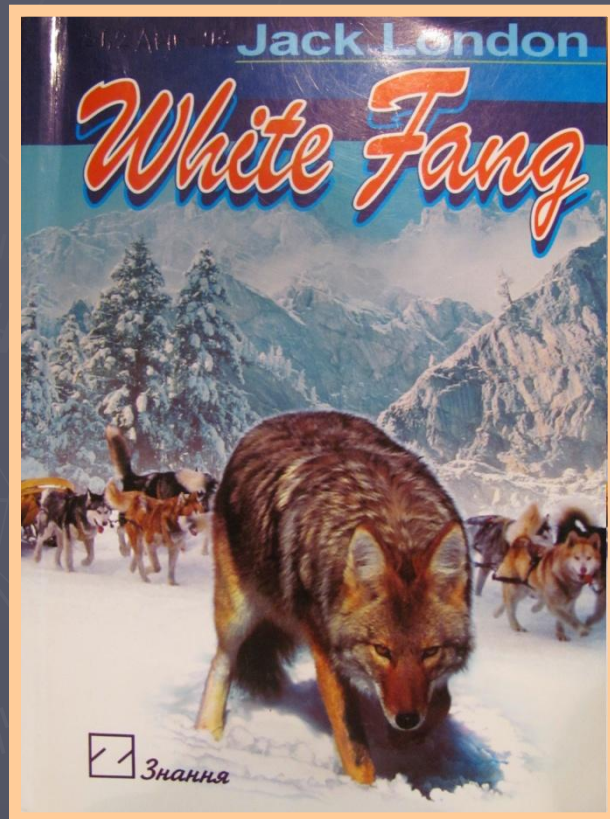

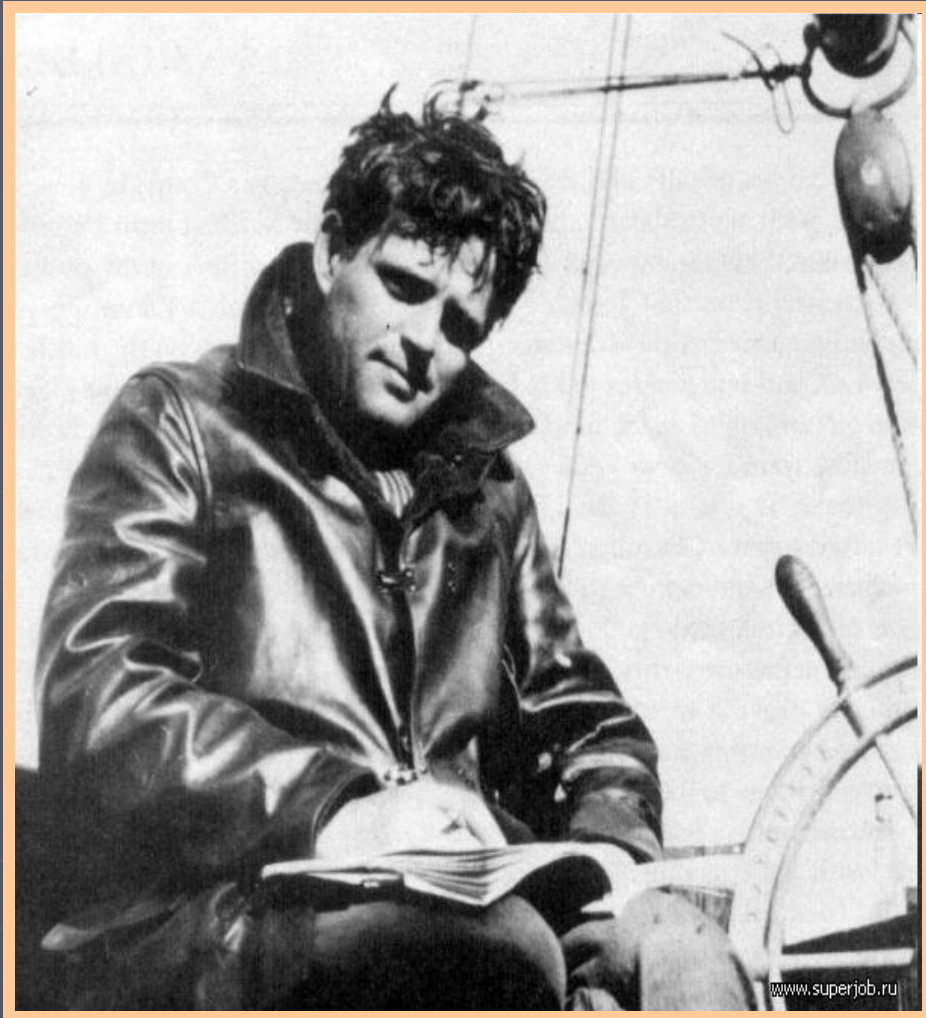
