
The influence of The Rolling Stones to the music of the 20th




The object of the research

Purpose: to identify how the formation of the group occurred, the nature of the band 's participants, how the society perceived them and their influence on modern youth.


Tasks:

The band has more than 250 million copies of their albums, being the most successful in history. The team was formed in 1962 in London, England. Career of the Rolling Stones

Worldwide circulation of the rolling Stones albums exceeded 250 million, 200 million of them were sold in the United States; according to these indicators, the group is one of the most successful in history. In 1989, the Rolling Stones were inducted into the rock and roll hall of fame, and in 2004 ranked fourth in the list of the 50 greatest performers of all time by Rolling Stone' magazine.

"Ruby Tuesday — - 303 place




A place in history, influence on the music




The relevance of the group in modern times
