# Present Simple

- We use present simple for habits or routines.
  - I always walk to school. (routine)
- I listen to music every night. (habit)
- Time adverbs used with the present simple: every day/week/month/year, once/twice a week/year, usually, often, always.

# Present Simple Positive sentences

Singular	Plural
I play tennis.	We play tennis.
You play tennis.	You play football.
He/she/It play <mark>s</mark> tennis.	They play tennis.

I do not play tennis.	I don`t play tennis.


