Present Simple

- We use present simple for habits or routines.
 - I always walk to school. (routine)
- I listen to music every night. (habit)
- Time adverbs used with the present simple: every day/week/month/year, once/twice a week/year, usually, often, always.

Present Simple Positive sentences

Singular	Plural
I play tennis.	We play tennis.
You play tennis.	You play football.
He/she/It plays tennis.	They play tennis.

Negative sentences

Full form	Short Answers
I do not play tennis.	I don't play tennis.
You do not play tennis.	You don't play tennis.
He/She/It does not play tennis.	He/She/It doesn't play tennis.
We/You/They do not play tennis.	We/You/They don't play tennis.


