Present Simple



- We use present simple for habits or routines.

I always **walk** to school. (routine)

I **listen** to music every night. (habit)

- Time adverbs used with the present simple:
every day/week/month/year, once/twice a week/year, usually, often, always.

Present Simple

Positive sentences

Singular	Plural
I play tennis.	We play tennis.
You play tennis.	You play football.
He/she/It plays tennis.	They play tennis.

Negative sentences



Full form	Short Answers
I do not play tennis.	I don` t play tennis.
You do not play tennis.	You don` t play tennis.
He/She/It does not play tennis.	He/She/It doesn` t play tennis.
We/You/They do not play tennis.	We/You/They don` t play tennis.



Adverbs of frequency usually go **before** the main verb, but **after** the verb to be
