If a woodchuck could chuck wood?**



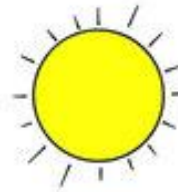
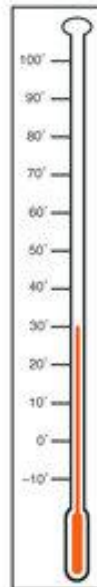

Peter piper picked a peek of pickled pepper.

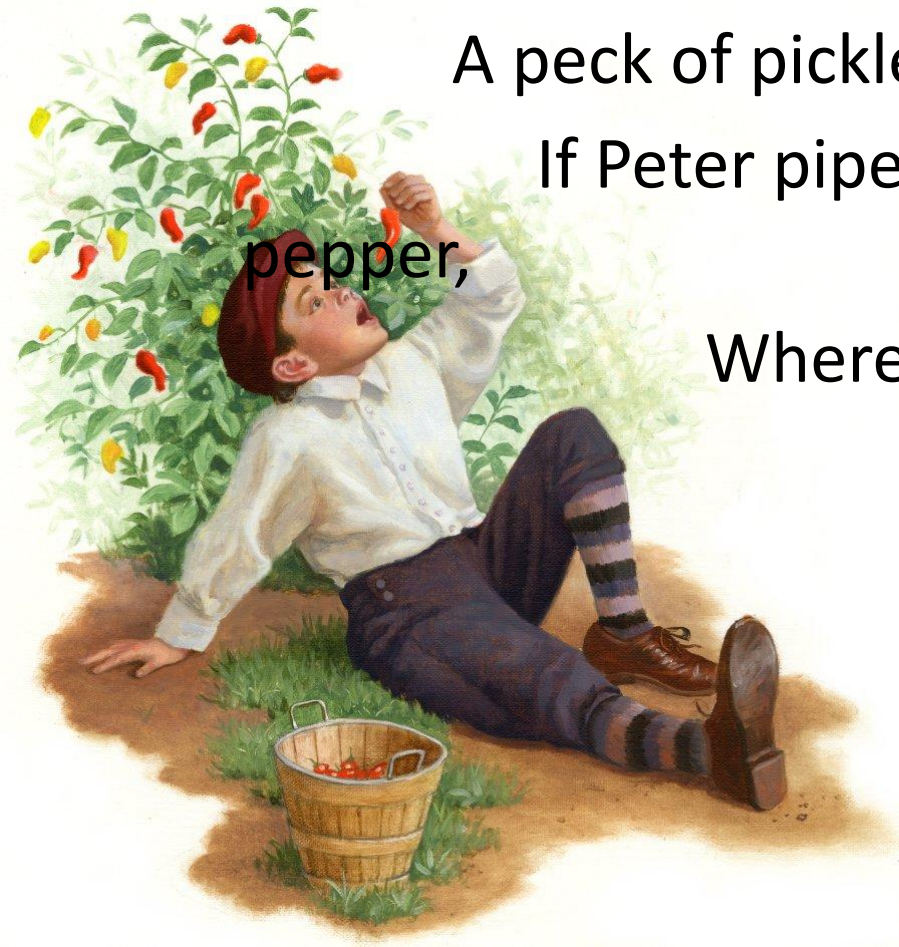

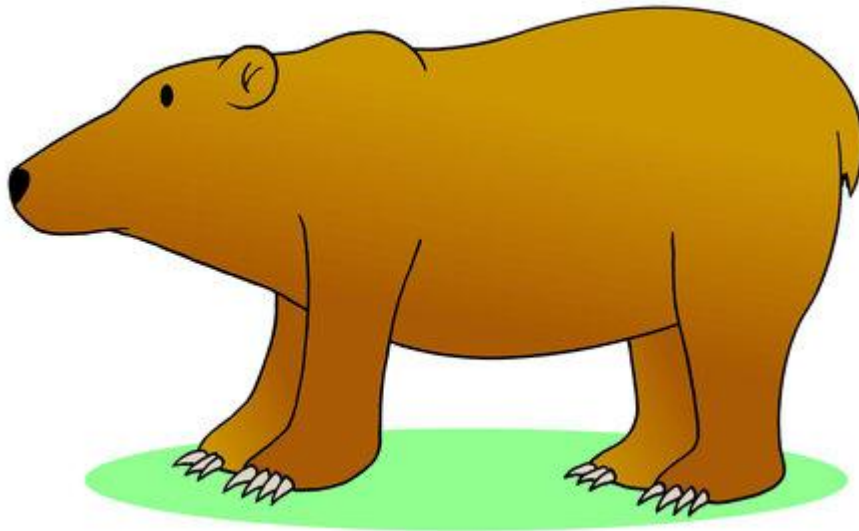
