If you don’t understand, say “don’t understand”.

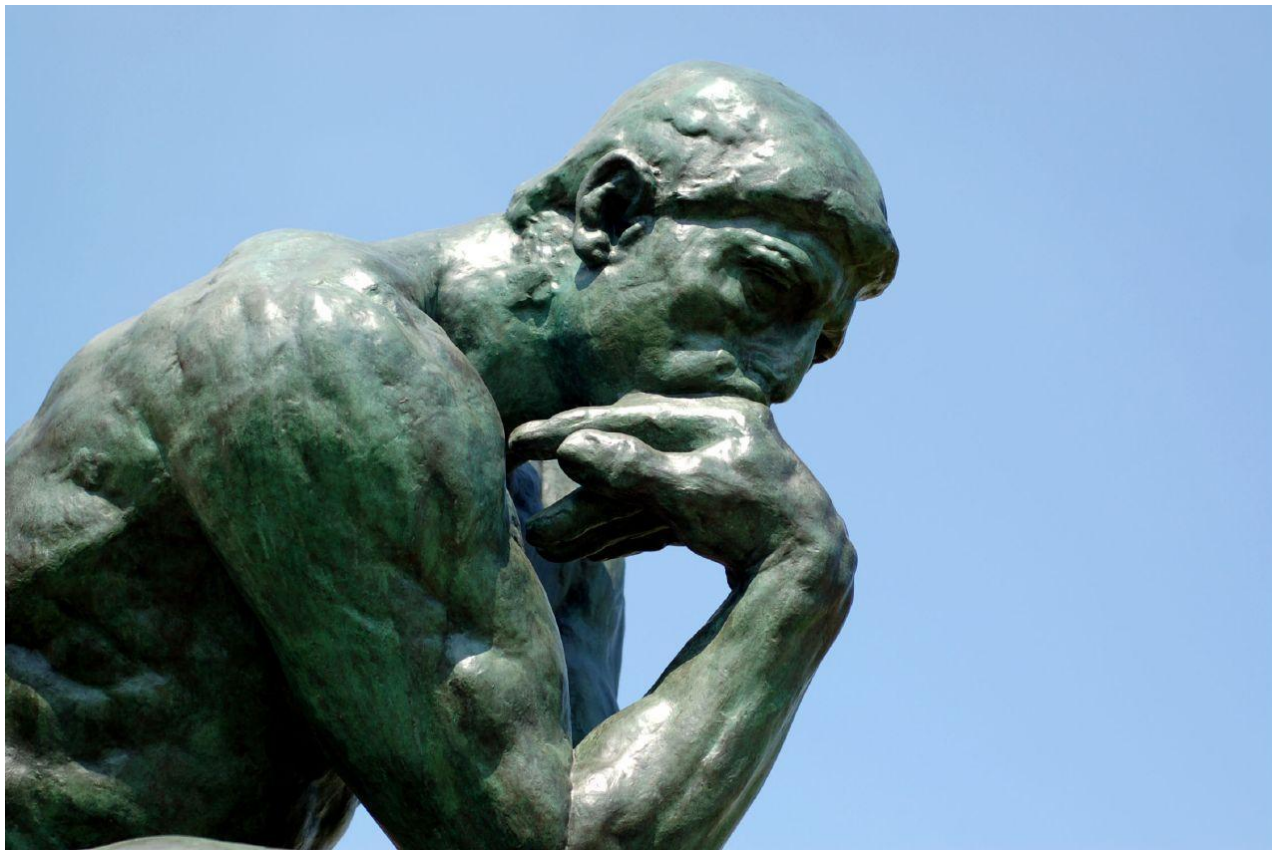

If a woodchuck could chuck wood?**



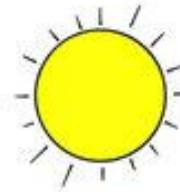

Peter piper picked a peck of pickled pepper.

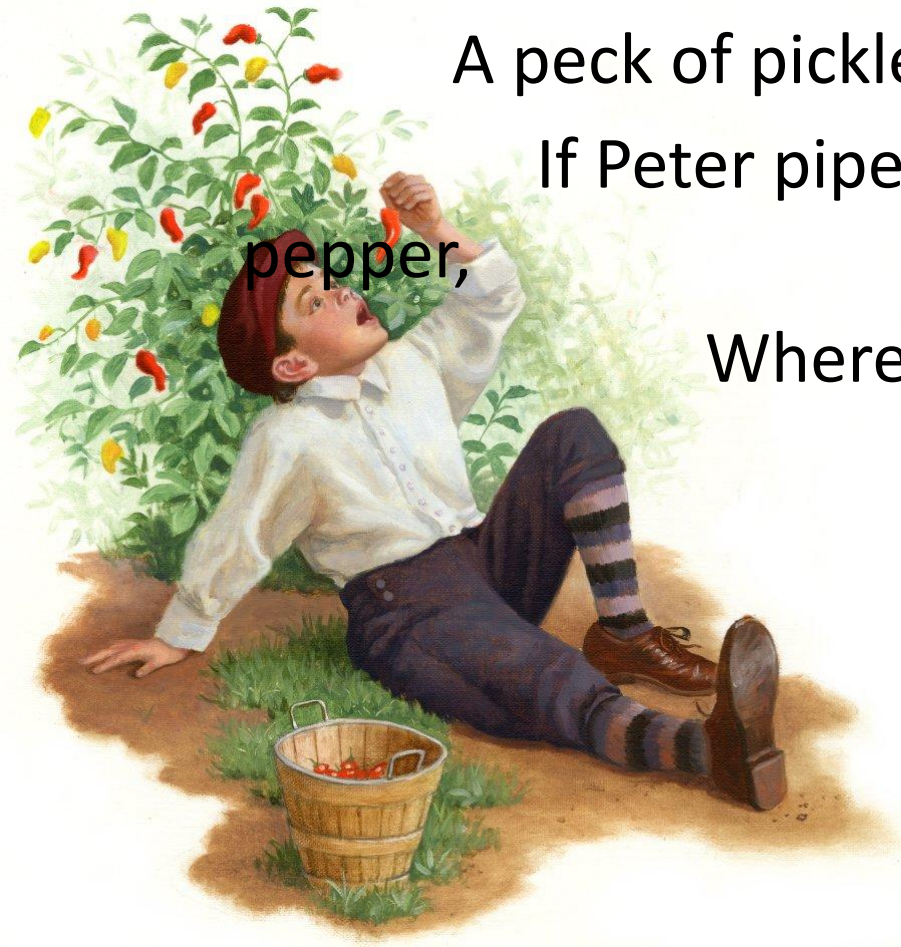
A peck of pickled pepper Peter piper picked.

- *'Give papa a cup of proper coffee in a copper coffee cup.'*

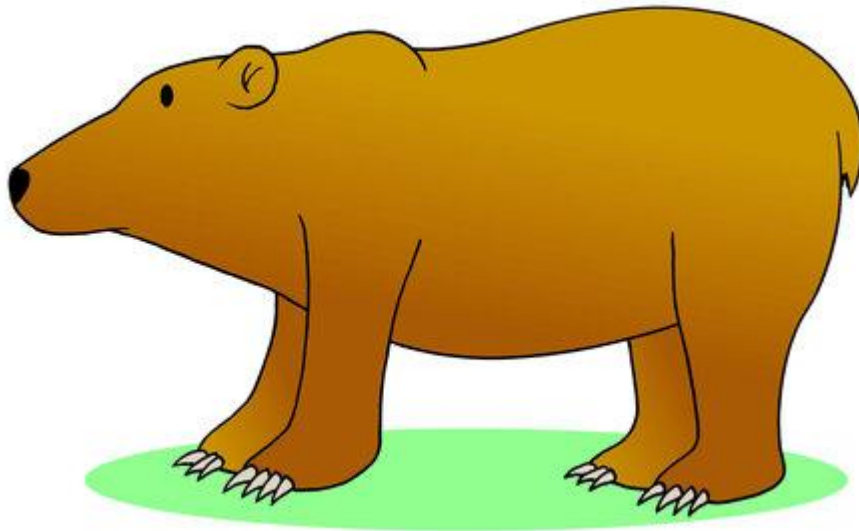
